the suffragists felth that no such affair would be complete without the presence of the man who has fought so long and so strenuously for suffrage in the Minnesota Legsialture, made the propehcy that not only would any egislature of Minnesota men willingly ratify the suffrage amendment but that Governor Burnquist would doubtless give the present legislature an opportunity by calling a special session . Senator Sageng ended his address with the telling words:-

To-night seems to me the last act in a great performance. The last a and the first in a newer and greater. New life will be injected into every American institution. The motherhood and womanhood of America will turn the balance of right and justice, instilling a higher revelation of all that is civilized into national life.

The same high note was continually touched and held by the other speaker of the evening including Mresident Marion Button of the University of Minnsot, Mrs. Peter Olesen of Cloquet and Maria Sanford. Governor J.A.A.Burnquist address opened the celebration and from start to finish it was a fine tribute to the national Efferings already made by the women of America and faith in the great political contribution to come.

The National Suffrage Policy

The attention of the National American Woman Suffrage Association under the direction of its speldndid leader Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt is already focussed and in action on special sessions in whatever States it is neccessary for the purpose of ratifying the Federal Su ffrage Amendiament recently passed by the United States House and Senate. Therty six favorable State votes are necessary to carry the amendment, and many of the State Legislatures do not meet again until 1921. It is the feeling of the women everywhere that the inexcusable delay of the 65th Congress in holding up ther amendment has givien them the right to petition for these special sessions -- and believe that the temper of the various states will makeziz compel even a few inwilling governors to comply. The present feelig of the National Association is strong;y that women will vote in every State of the Union farthe next presidential elections. Governor Burnquist has alteady assured Mrs. Andreas Veland of his willingness to call the special m Mamesta. session in the early months of 1920 if anough Tegernors of other States will take the same step . There are in the case of Minnesota several other matters which might be dsposed of to advantage at such a session.
