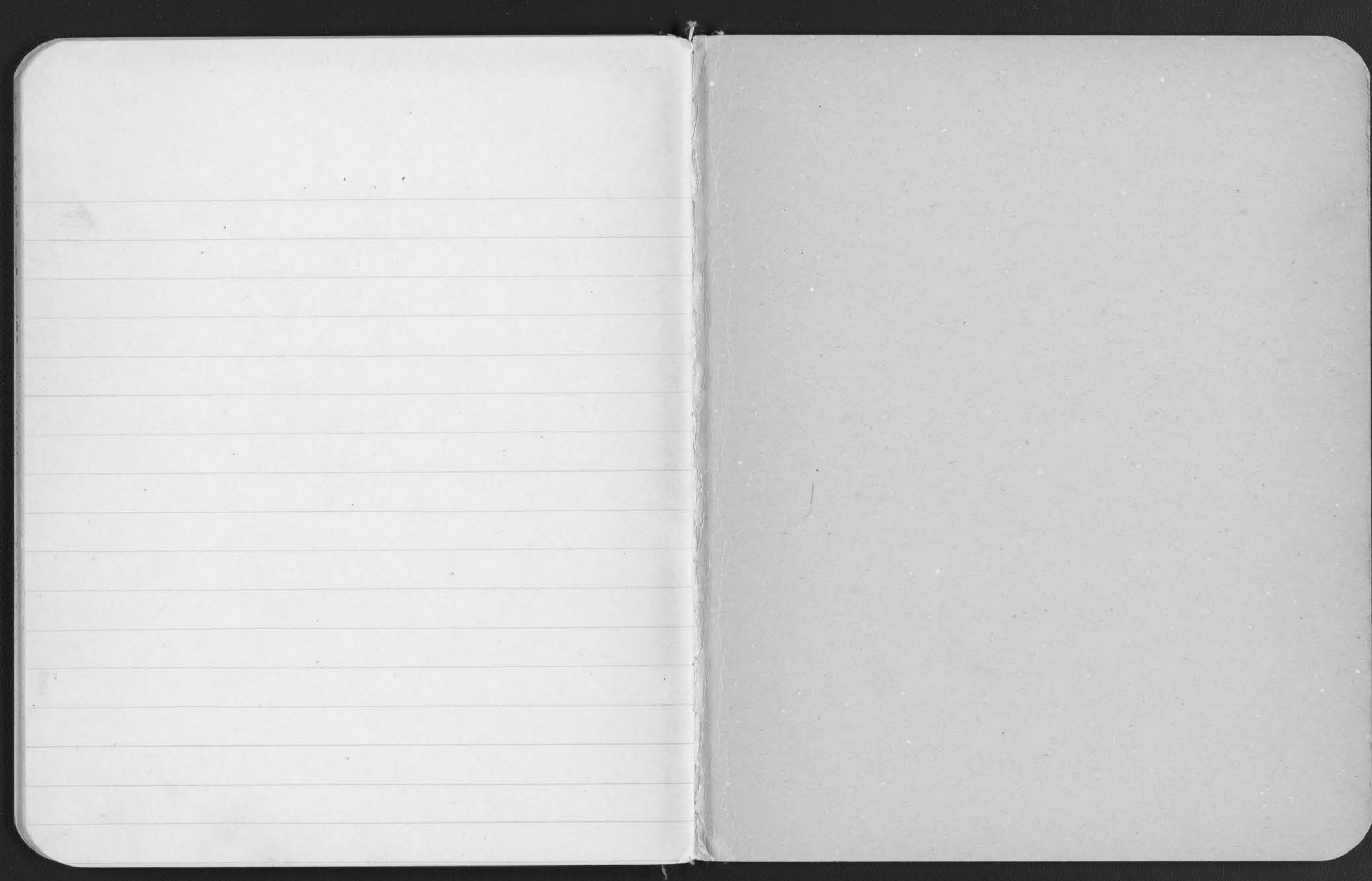

The Franc of France, Belgium and Switzerland, 19.3cts.

The Reichsmark (Royal Mark) of the German Empire, 23.8cts.

The Crown of Denmark, Sweden, and Norway, 26.8cts.

The Lira of Italy, and the Peseta of Spain, 19.3cts.

The Florin of Austria, .41 3.

The Florin of Holland, .40 2.

The Piaster of Turkey, .04 4.

The Dollar of Mexico, .90 9.

The Rouble of Russia, .66 9.

The Milreis of Brazil, .54 5.

The Peso of Cuba, .92 5.

144 sq. in. make 1 sq. ft.

Solid or Cubic Measure.

1728 cu. in. make 1 cu. ft.
27 cu. ft. " 1 cu. yd.
128 cu. ft. " 1 cd. wood.
24½ cu. ft. " 1 perch stone.

NOTE A cord of wood is a pile 8 ft. long, 4 ft. wide, and 4 ft. high; therefore, 8x4x4=128.

A perch of stone or brick is 16½ ft. long, 1½ ft. wide, and 1 ft. high.
