

144 sq. in. make 1 sq. ft.

Solid or Cubic Measure.

1728 cu. in. make 1 cu. ft.

24 1/4 cu. ft. " 1 perch stone.

NOTE A cord of wood is a pile 8 ft. long, 4 ft. wide, and 4 ft. high; therefore, $8 \times 4 \times 4 = 128$.

A perch of stone or brick is 16 1/2 ft. long, 1 1/2 ft. wide, and 1 ft. high.
