Remarks by Max M. Kampelman

Embassy of Israel Washington, D.C.

December 18, 1989

It is good to be home again. The Hebrew University of

Jerusalem means a great deal to me, having served on its Board

and as national president and board chairman of the American

Friends. It is particularly gratifying for me to have been

invited to install my dear friend Rabbi Stanley Rabinowitz into

office as president of our local chapter.

I first met Stanley and Anita Rabinowitz when they were in Minnesota where, for 7 years, he served as a community leader and as Rabbi of one of the most distinguished temples in the Midwest. We have been friends ever since. Maggie and I cherish that friendship and the opportunity we have had over the last 30 years to deepen and broaden that friendship.

I know of no person whose life, intellect, instincts, and values come closer to the ideal notion of "Rabbi" than Stanley Rabinowitz. The Rabbi in our Jewish tradition is the teacher of the community in the best sense of that term. It is altogether appropriate that he now devote his energies in the service of a great educational institution, the University of the Jewish People.

The pursuit of education within Jewish tradition is not only a duty, but among the highest of human values. It is, therefore, no wonder that in Palestine in the midst of the first World War with the sound of guns in the air, a number of world Jewish leaders led by Chaim Weizman, with the establishment of a state only a dream, laid the cornerstone on Mt. Scopus for the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. It is significant that we in America, also motivated by the same values, established some of our great universities before we established our government.

It is said that a university is a building that has four walls with tomorrow inside. The high academic and moral standards of the University on Mt. Scopus assures a bright tomorrow for Israel and its aspirations. All of you who are here this evening contribute to that future. It is our privilege that we will be doing so as a we look ahead under the leadership of a man who is immensely qualified to follow the traditions of those early Mt. Scopus pioneers. I now ask Rabbi Stanley Rabinowitz to proceed to this dais so that we might proceed with the installation of officers to serve our chapter.

By the powers vested in me, I hereby install you, Stanley Rabinowitz, as President of the Washington, D.C. Chapter of the American Friends of the Hebrew University.

I would now like to install the new members of the Board of Directors of the Chapter. I will call the names of those present and ask them to rise.




