

Ambassador Meir Rosenne

Ambassador Rosenne has been in government service since 1953. Born in Iasi, Romania, he immigrated to Israel at the age of 13. He studied at the Sorbonne, where he received his MA in Political Science and his Ph.D. in International Law. He was Consul of Israel in New York, 1961–1967, Coordinator of Israeli Atomic Energy Commission 1969–1971, Representative of Israel on the Human Rights Commission, and the Third Committee of the U.N. General Assembly. Between 1971 and 1979 he was legal advisor to the Israel-Egypt Peace Treaty in 1979. Dr. Rosenne became his country's Ambassador to France in 1979 and served in that capacity until May 1983, when he was nominated Israel's Ambassador to the United States, where he served until June 1987. Ambassador Rosenne is currently the President and CEO of the world-wide State of Israel Bonds Organization. He is married and the father of two daughters.

Ambassador Itamar Rabinovich

Ambassador Itamar Rabinovich was born in Jerusalem. He studied at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem where he received his Bachelor's degree in History and Middle Eastern History. He continued his studies at Tel Aviv University and then received his Ph.D. in Middle Eastern History from UCLA. He has held numerous positions at Tel Aviv University including Chairman of the Department of Middle Eastern and African History, Head of the Dayan Center and Dean of the Faculty of Humanities. In addition, Ambassador Rabinovich has held several visiting appointments abroad; Visiting Professor at University of Pennsylvania and Cornell University, as well as at the University of Toronto and Carelton University in Canada, and a Visiting Fellow at the Wilson Center in Washington. He is a member of the Press Council of Israel and was Chairman of the Military censorship Tribunal from 1988-1993. Between 1981 and 1985, he served as Advisor on Lebanon to the Foreign and Defense Affairs Committee of the Knesset and in 1992, he was appointed Head of the Israeli Delegation to Peace Talks with Syria. In 1993, he was named Israel's Ambassador to the United States. Ambassador Rabinovich is married to Efrat and they have two children.

Ben-Gurion University of the Negev

Founded in 1969 by Israel's Knesset to further David Ben-Gurion's dream of developing the Negev, Ben-Gurion University was charged with a vital mandate—to spearhead the social, agricultural and industrial development of Israel's vast desert region. Almost half of the University's 8,100 students are of North African and Middle Eastern origin, the highest percentage of Sephardic students at any Israeli university. In this academic year, Ben-Gurion University of the Negev enrolled almost 2,000 Russian and Ethiopian students. An overall enrollment of 15,000 students is projected by September 1995. At least one-third of the enrollees receive scholarship assistance. To meet the needs of its dramatic growth, the university is expanding the teaching staff, strengthening the academic and scientific infrastructure and improving the physical facilities, thus "fulfilling the prophecy" that David Ben-Gurion had for the State of Israel and the promise of the Negev.

President Braverman, Ambassador and Mrs. Rabinovitch,
Ambassador and Mrs. Rosenne, Mr. and Mrs. London, Mr. and Mrs.
Foer, Mr. and Mrs. Oshry, friends.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman, for that most gracious introduction. I enjoyed each and every one of your lovely exaggerations.

In the words of that immortal master of English rhetoric, Mr. Samuel Goldwyn, I have a few words to say before I begin to talk.

Our evening is called "Salute to the Ambassadors." In considering my role here this evening, I want to share with you a scenario that crossed my mind when I was first designated an Ambassador by President Carter in 1980. At that time, I

imagined going home to visit my folks and meeting my aunt Rose, may her soul rest in peace. Some of you may have had your own Aunt Rose -- skeptical and all-knowing. At my news that I had been appointed an ambassador, there would be a look of utter amazement and incredulity. Within a few moments, however, the news sunk in, the incredulity shifted to a knowing smile and I could hear her saying: "Good, Maxie! But let me ask you. By me, you're an ambassador; by momma, you're an ambassador; by you, you're an ambassador. But, tell me, Maxie. By an ambassador, are you an ambassador?"

After all these years, and after a series of ambassadorial appointments by three American presidents, the question still comes to mind.

Anthropologists tell us that there is such a thing as "folk memory." An integral part of Jewish folk memory is a commitment to those values encompassed by the term "People of the Book," a commitment to learning, to culture, to human spiritual growth. Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, under whose auspices we meet here tonight, is a direct reflection of that folk memory, one that must be preserved for the sake of our evolving civilization. If the ancient Hebrew tribes were chosen by the Lord to fulfill any specific historic role, it was, I am convinced, to maintain the spiritual message of human dignity as children of God, made in his image, as we evolve through the

ages from the species <u>Homo sapiens</u> to the species human being. That is why we are here tonight -- to keep that set of values and that aspiration.

Ben-Gurion University is one of Israel's finest institutions of higher learning. It was a stimulating experience for me, last June, to be on the University's beautiful campus and to have lunch with a cross-section of the young men and women who comprise its student body. I interviewed a number of the scholarly faculty about their exciting research projects, and talked with extraordinarily gifted Avishay Braverman, Ben-Gurion's noted economist and impressive President about his imaginative vision for the future of the University and the Negev.

The Middle East is the cradle of our civilization. Israel is the oasis of human dignity and democracy within the Middle East. Ben-Gurion University is being turned into a living demonstration that a desert can be more than a hardship. It can serve as a challenge to open up new opportunities through learning and knowledge. The University and the Negev can serve as an engine for development in agriculture, commerce, industry, the health sciences -- a catalyst for turning the whole area of the Middle East into a productive integrated community designed to lift the standards of its people into great heights of accomplishment.

That is the University's message. That is Israel's goal as it seeks to hold high the values of human dignity it has been chosen to champion, no matter how hostile the environment. That is what we celebrate tonight.

Israel's ambassadors represent and personify that message. Those of us who are part of this Washington community know that Israel has sent its finest representatives and dignitaries to serve as its ambassadors and to send its message here. They have represented the essence of what we have identified as the "People of the Book" -- scholars, diplomats, and leaders of distinction and effectiveness.

Two of those highly respected and accomplished ambassadors from Israel are with us this evening.

Ambassador, doctor, Rector, professor Itamar Rabinovitch and his lovely wife, Efrat, a scientist in her own right, are relatively new to our community. A university teacher, and world class scholar, he has, I know from personal observation, overwhelmed and impressed Washington officialdom, as well as his Arab negotiating colleagues, with his intense familiarity with Arab culture, history, and language. I have found his knowledge of politics, diplomacy and human affairs to be equally

masterful. It is easy for us to be excessive in our tribute to his qualities because we know that they are not exaggerated. I am honored to be a part of this tribute to him.

It is equally easy and pleasant for me to be a part of this tribute to Ambassador Meir Rosenne and his charming partner,

Vera. We have been friends and collaborators for many years.

We have worked together in Europe, Israel and in Washington. I have never met a finer, well-trained lawyer and I can personally attest that his mastery of the law during the Camp David negotiations uniquely contributed to Israel's security at a time of great danger as well as opportunity. Ambassador Rosenne's success as Israel's representative here in the United States led to a decision to bring him back to the United States to head the Israel Bond organization. Suffice it for me to say that under his leadership the sales of Israel bonds in the United States are at the highest levels ever, helping to establish a financial foundation the effect of which will strengthen the human and ethical values which are so important to all of us.

I am honored to be a part of this tribute to these two superb symbols of Jewish values and tradition.
