I want to thank you and Mr. Powers for your most gracious letter of November 30. Even though I did not "offer" to be guest speaker on February 20, I was pleased to accept the invitation from Dr. Braverman. He and I are friends, and I always hesitate to say "no" to him.

Yes, Dr. Braverman did suggest as part of his invitation that my wife accompany me, and we both agreed to surround the event with a few days in the sunshine as guests of the University. We have not yet addressed the issue of whether we will take advantage of that suggestion prior or following the February 20 date. We will keep you informed.

Harold L. Oshry, President of the American Associates, Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, is a long-time champion of the University's mission and a veteran leader on the National Jewish Communal scene.

A resident of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, Mr. Oshry is deeply involved in the organizational life of this community. As well as supporting Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, the Oshry's are also active in numerous Jewish and Israeli causes. Harold served two terms as President of the Ft. Lauderdale Jewish Federation, and Claire is campaign co-chair in the Federation's Women's Division.

With the establishment of the Claire and Harold Oshry Chair in Aquatic Microbiology, new horizons will be opened in the ongoing struggle to ensure that future generations will inherit an ecologically purer world.

#### Max H. Kampelman

Max Kampelman — lawyer, diplomat and educator — has served both Democrat and Republican Presidents at the highest diplomatic level, serving as Ambassador and Head of the U.S. Delegation to the Nuclear and Space Arms Negotiations in Geneva, as well as Counselor of the State Department, before returning to private law practice in Washington, DC in 1989. Currently, he serves as Presidential appointee to the Eurasia Foundation, as Vice Chairman of the U.S. Institute of Peace, and is Chairman of the Board of Governors of the United Nations Association and Chairman of the Jerusalem Foundation.

Ambassador Kampelman was awarded the Presidential Citizens Medal by President Reagan in 1989, and is holder of the Knight Commander's Cross of the Federal Republic of Germany. He served both Presidents Carter and Reagan as Ambassador and Head of the U.S. Delegation to the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Madrid from 1980 to 1983, as well as several other international bodies.

Mr. Kampelman was founder-moderator of PBS's "Washington Week in Review", chairman of the Washington, DC public broadcast stations from 1963 to 1970, and recently authored his autobiography, Entering New Worlds: The Memoirs of a Private Man in Public Life.

# Roberta Peters

A singer of incandescent vocal radiance, Roberta Peters illuminates the opera and concert stages as one of America's favorite artists of this century. She immediately became one of the Metropolitan's most prized sopranos after her sensational debut at the Metropolitan Opera when she made a surprise debut as Zerlina in Mozart's Don Giovanni. Miss Peters achieved a record of longevity with the Met unrivalled by any other leading soprano, and in 1985, the company honored her in a special ceremony on her 35th anniversary. She has performed with the world's major orchestras, on its major recital stages and at celebrated summer festivals.

Miss Peters was first invited to appear at the White House by President John F. Kennedy, and she has appeared to sing for every president at the Executive Mansion since then. She has been invited by many American colleges and universities to give master classes, and has also devoted herself to social causes. Miss Peters is currently the Chairperson of Cultural Events for the American Associates, Ben-Gurion University.


