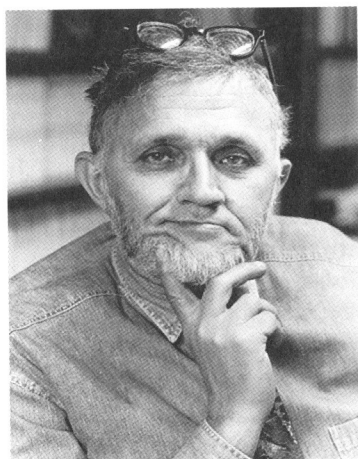

Dr. Samuel J. Danishefsky

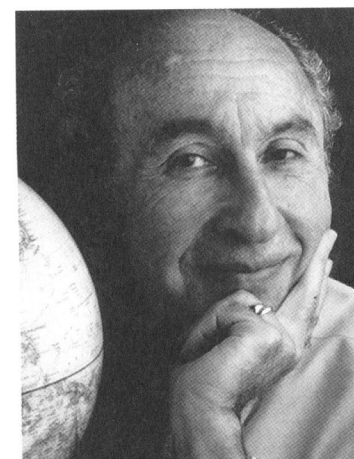
From his days as a Yeshiva University High School and Yeshiva College student, Dr. Samuel Danishefsky has risen to the highest echelons of scientific research and education.

Pursuing an interest in chemistry sparked at YUHS and fueled at YC, Dr. Danishefsky earned his PhD in chemistry at Harvard University and studied as a postdoctoral fellow at Columbia University. He began his academic career in 1963 at the University of Pittsburgh, where he was named professor in 1971 and university professor in 1979.

In 1980, Dr. Danishefsky moved to Yale University, where he served as chairman of the department, and was named Eugene Higgins Professor in 1984 and Sterling Professor in 1990. He returned to New York in 1993 as professor of chemistry at Columbia University and head of the laboratory for bioorganic chemistry at the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.

Dr. Danishefsky has been honored for his work by election to the National Academy of Sciences and other leading academies, and by the conferral of numerous prestigious scientific awards. His eminence as a scientist, distinction as a teacher, and leadership in the Jewish community were recognized in 1987, when Dr. Danishefsky received an honorary doctor of science degree from his alma mater, Yeshiva University.

Ambassador Max M. Kampelman

Lawyer, diplomat, and educator Max Kampelman is one of America's most honored citizens. An alumnus of Yeshiva University High Schools, he served from 1985 to 1989 as counselor of the Department of State and ambassador and head of the US delegation to arms negotiations with the Soviet Union. He subsequently rejoined the law firm of Fried, Frank, Harris, Shriver & Jacobson, where he is of counsel.

Ambassador Kampelman is chairman emeritus of the American Academy of Diplomacy, Georgetown University's Institute for the Study of Diplomacy, the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars, and Freedom House; honorary chairman of the Jerusalem Foundation; and honorary governor of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

In 1999, President Clinton awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian award. A decade earlier, President Reagan awarded him the Presidential Citizens Medal, which recognizes "citizens who have performed exemplary deeds for their country or fellow citizens." He also is the recipient of the Knight Commander's Cross of the Federal Republic of Germany and the Library of Congress "Living Legend" award.

Ambassador Kampelman received his JD from New York University and his PhD from the University of Minnesota, where he taught from 1946 to 1948. He has served on the faculties of Bennington College, Claremont College, the University of Wisconsin, and Howard University; lectures frequently; and has received 13 honorary doctoral degrees.

Alexandra Zizmor achieved notable success in sales and marketing before turning to couture millinery and establishing studios in London and New York to showcase her distinctive hat designs.

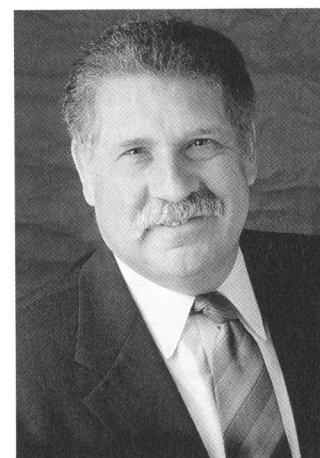

Mrs. Zizmor earned her BA from DePaul University and her MS from the University of Chicago. She studied couture millinery in London with Rose Cory, official milliner to Queen Elizabeth.

Dr. Jonathan Zizmor, a graduate of the Yeshiva University High School for Boys and YU's Albert Einstein College of Medicine, is a leading dermatologist practicing in New York City. Board certified in dermatology, he has published 10 books for the general public on skin care and was chief of dermatology at St. Vincent's Hospital.

Dr. Zizmor has maintained a lifelong association with YU. He was elected to the Board of Directors of Yeshiva College in 1992, and is a University Benefactor who has consistently provided significant support for YC, AECOM, RIETS and YUHS.

Ya'acov Sklar

Principal, Marsha Stern Talmudical Academy-Yeshiva University High School for Boys

Ya'acov Sklar was appointed principal of the Marsha Stern Talmudical Academy-Yeshiva University High School for Boys in July 1999, and teamed with Dr. Michael Hecht, dean of the school, to enhance academic excellence and strengthen faculty and programs.

A graduate of YUHS and Yeshiva College, Mr. Sklar earned MS degrees in science education and in educational administration and supervision from City College of New York. Prior to becoming principal at the boys' high school, he taught science and was an assistant principal in the Bronx, and served as principal for 13 years of a New York City middle school.

Mr. Sklar is a member of the Center for Educational Innovation at the Manhattan Institute and the Principal's Leadership Committee at Teacher's College, Columbia University.

Assistant Principal, Samuel H. Wang Yeshiva University High School for Girls

As assistant principal for the past four years, Harriet Sklar has worked closely with Principal Rochelle Brand to foster and maintain a school of excellence with high academics and a nurturing atmosphere. In addition to her administrative duties, Mrs. Sklar teaches English.

Mrs. Sklar worked for 15 years in the New York City public school system, the last four as assistant to the principal and staff developer at PS 27 in the South Bronx. She has also been a professor of English and writing at Tuoro College.

Mrs. Sklar received her BA from the College of New Rochelle and MA in education from Lehman College, where she received the Alumni Reward in Research. Mrs. Sklar has also received numerous New York State grants, is a member of several professional organizations, and a former president of the Parents Council at the girls' high school.

Rabbi Macy Gordon is the recipient this evening of a special award presented by his grateful student, Dr. Jonathan Zizmor, and Dr. Zizmor's wife, Alexandra, for being "the teacher who made the difference." In Rabbi Gordon's honor, Dr. and Mrs. Zizmor announce the establishment of the Rabbi Macy Gordon Scholarship at the Marsha Stern Talmudical Academy-Yeshiva University High School for Boys.

Rabbi Gordon, a resident of Jerusalem, was director of the Council of Young Israel Rabbis in Israel and is recognized as a founder of "Just One Life," an organization dedicated to encouraging the birth of Jewish children in Israel. He had a long and distinguished career in the US as a community rabbi and as a Jewish educator. Rabbi Gordon received his BA in sociology and doctorate in Jewish education at YU, was ordained at RIETS, and taught Talmud, Jewish law, and Jewish history at the University and at the boys' high school for over a quarter century. Rabbi Gordon also earned an MA in guidance at Columbia University.

For 23 years, he served as spiritual leader of Congregation Bnai Yeshurun in Teaneck, NJ, where he helped build one of the foremost Orthodox communities in the US. Rabbi Gordon also served as president of the Rabbinic Alumni of RIETS.

Yeshiva University High Schools proudly presents a Lifetime Achievement Award to Mrs. Eleanor Levinson for excellence in the teaching of art and in recognition of over 42 years of devoted service to Samuel H. Wang Yeshiva University High School for Girls.

Mrs. Levinson has taught at yeshivot throughout the Metropolitan Area and served as program director for the Brooklyn Museum Art School's Adult Education Division. She was assistant to the art director of the Board of Jewish Education, where she taught art in teacher education programs. During her long association with the BJE, Mrs. Levinson, whose own artwork has won numerous awards, also participated in art shows and her work has been published in *Brush and Color*, the BJE art journal. She is a member of the Artist Craftsmen Society, earned her BA from the University of Rhode Island, and studied at the Brooklyn Museum Art School and Art Students' League.

Mrs. Levinson will be sorely missed by her colleagues and remembered with love and appreciation by her former students.
