The Sept. 21st, meeting of the India Club was called to order by the president, Stefan Peterson. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Rita Mustaphi said that Pandit Vijai Shanker Maharaj is here and will be performing on Sat. 24th. Rita then explained the Tagore celebration she has planned for next year. In 1989 it will be only a dance drama, no film will be shown as before. There was a discussion about how to keep people from bringing their young children. Perhaps a slight fee could be charged which will discourage people from bringing their children. Rita also needs help in writing grant proposals and doing publicity. Rahim Rahiman suggests that someone else do the grant writing this year, as he does not have the time again. Rita Mustaphi asked for a \$500.00 commitment from the India Club.

Ram Gada suggests that requests such as these, should go first of all to the program committee, instead of directly to the India Club board of directors. The only problem with this is that the program committee is not currently active. Both Ram Gada and Vinu Patel suggested that direct involvement of the India Club should be reduced. Vijay Balakrishnan commented that supporting the arts per se is not the fundamental mission of the India Club. Their mission is broader than that. Rita Mustaphi however needs the India Club's name as a non-profit organization to apply for grants. It was decided that the India Club would act in this capacity as the physical agent, and commit no more than \$200.00 at this time. The India Club would also empower Rita Mustaphi to represent the India Club in applying for grants for the program being planned.

Stefan Peterson asked if the India Club would sponsor a project suggested by Rani Ramaswamy. It was suggested that before deciding on this, that Rani come and present her proposal herself.

Rajeevan Kattil distributed a copy of a flyer which will given out at the picnics of Indian linguistic groups this summer.

Stefan Peterson gave a report on membership -- we now have 160 paid members. Khurshad Ansari - gave \$100.00 donation in addition to his membership at the July 16th program.

Rita Mustaphi's teacher - Pandit Vijai Shanker Maharaj-

will be in the Twin Cities for a one month residency - giving classes and workshops. He will also give a performance on Sept. 24th 7:30 pm at the O'Shaughnessy auditorium, at the College of St. Catherine in St. Paul. The classes will begin Sept. 18th, and will be \$10.00 per class.

Smarajit Mitra - asked if the India Club wanted to be associated with a Tagore celebration in the future - because preparation for this must begin one year in advance. A motion was made and carried that the India Club would sponsor such a program - lending its name to allow Rita Mustaphi to begin applying for grants.

The July 20th meeting of the India Club was called to order by the president Stefan Peterson. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The India Club gave a vote of thanks to Rita Mustaphi, Rahim Rahiman and Smarajit Mitra, along with many others for the wonderful program at Northrup auditorium on the evening of July 16th. The budget for the event was submitted to the Metropolitan Arts Council by Rahim Rahiman, where it was approved. The final report will be presented next month. Using the evaluation slips distributed with the programs it was determined that 57% rated the performance as excellent. The wonderful publicity was arranged by Kashmira Irani.

Rita Mustaphi's teacher will be coming from India in September. Compas, the Metropolitan Arts Council and the Minnesota Dance Alliance will act as the physical agents for this event which will include teaching and workshops at the Nancy Hauser dance company and a performance at the Ordway theater.

Joan Knight discussed a fund raising event that the Cricket Theater and Cafe Kababi will co-sponsor. This fund raiser will take place on Friday, August 12, from 7 - 10 pm. They have asked the India Club to help with this by arranging several events such as sari wrapping, and/or a bridal show. It was suggested that it could be billed as a celebration of Indian Independence. This year is the 41st year of independence. The Cricket Theater usually plays Western contemporary theater. We decided we would do a separate mailing rather than give the Cricket theater our mailing list. The India Club will ask them to help promote India Day in exchange. The board of directors of the India club decided that we would not get involved in this project on a voluntary basis. If people are willing to set up a sari wrapping booth or a bridal show they should be paid an hourly wage to do so.

India Day -- General Chairmen -- Godan Nambudiripad and Stefan Peterson.

Godan suggested a general theme such as Indian Art or Nehru's 100th birthday.

Chairmen for various activities:

Rani Ramaswamy - entertainment

Anoop Mathur - setup

Rakesh Atreya & Rahim Rahiman - publicity and corporate funding.

Liaison - Food vendors - open

Liaison - Commercial vendors - open, Stefan will ask Daljit Sikka.

Each linguistic community will be contacted and asked to participate. The idea of India Day is to project the Indian heritage and culture and the Indian Community should be brought together to do that.

A request has been made to J.C. Penney to help in funding for India Day. It was suggested that \$2000.00 of a possible \$3000.00 budget be requested.

Ram Gada will assist Daljit Sikka as an additional liaison to the business community, if Daljit consents to help.

The next newsletter will come out prior to the Festival of India/88. A Salute to Indian Arts.

Five new memberships were obtained during the intermission of July 16th.

Sudhansu Misra reported on the various activities of the Asian Pacific Council.

There was an Indian Food booth associated with the Aquatennial. It was set up and run by Taran Kapoor from the Kababi.

Mrs. Gundu Rao would like to begin a cancer support group within the Indian community.

Mrs Arya from the leper colony - milk feeding program would like to set up a pen pal sort of communication between Indian children here and those in the leper colony.

Indo-American Club is planning a picnic for August 15th.

The problem of providing temporary support for new incoming students from India was discussed by no decisions were made. Vijay Balakrishnan volunteered to contact the International Student Advisors office for information.


The next newsletter is being prepared and will be ready for

The May 18th meeting of the India Club was called to order by the president Stefan Peterson.

FESTIVAL OF NATIONS - Ram Gada

The India Club with the help of SILC school and many other volunteers participated in all the events. All were very successful. The Indian Bazaar donated \$1000.00 to the India Club. Revenue from the advance ticket sales was \$265.00. Vinu Patel prepared a complete financial report on the cafe booth. The net income from the cafe booth was \$1,092.48. It was suggested that the exterior of the cafe booth could be repainted next year. Godan Nambudiripad reported on the exhibit booth. It was primarily put together by Preeti Mathur. The bindi painting that took place at the booth was a great attention drawing idea, and very successful. The mannequin from Sears which was dressed in a sari was a main feature of the booth.

A motion was made and carried that the India Club donate \$950.00 (40% of the proceeds from the Festival) to the SILC school.

There was suggestion that this money could be used for supplies, but it was the general consensus not to put any restrictions on its use. The possibility of working with SILC to create resource materials for use at such events was discussed. Currently many display materials need to be borrowed from people's homes.

Kavita Mehta lost money on the leftover samosas, as they had thawed and needed to be refrozen. She will be compensated by using the newsletter for advertising.

Ram Gada reported on the J.C. Penney Store exhibits and demonstrations on India. All of the J.C. Penney Stores in the

Dales are participating.

Smarajit Mitra and Rahim Rahiman described the dance drama by Tagore which will be presented at Northrup Auditorium on July 16th. The remainder of the program was also explained in detail. There will also be a display of Tagore books and pictures in the lobby of Northrup Auditorium. Rehearsals for this event began 3 weeks ago under the direction of Rita Mustaphi.

It may be necessary to have a special meeting after the May 24th meeting on the expenditure of some of the grant money.

Possible avenues of publicity were explored, along with the necessity and cost of insurance for India Club events. It was decided that the India Club would purchase insurance for each event.

Stefan Peterson suggested another telephone campaign to increase membership. Currently the membership of the India Club is 120.

Sudhansu Misra reported on the activities of the Asia Pacific Council. He spoke about the possibility of establishing an Asia Pacific Center in the Twin Cities. He has already approached the Honeywell Foundation asking for financial support.

Ramakrishnan suggested that it would be wise to attempt to get social studies teachers to change their attitudes about India, as a primary means of educating the American public.

Jon Miller from the Meditation Center spoke about a milk feeding program begun by Dr. Arya and his wife in a leper colony in India. Most of the children fed every day are the children of lepers. Currently they are distributing milk to about 50 children a day. Means of publicity to generate more revenue for this program were suggested. An article can be written and run in the newsletter. A booth could be set up at India Day to show a video of the project and its amazing results.

Ram Gada said a date must be set for India Day -- October 16th was decided on.

Padu Arimilli resigned as program committee chairman and Punjabhai Patel will take his place.

Arun Kumar has received calls about the use of the membership list. It could be a source of revenue, however, the India Club will not do this, as it must protect the privacy of its members.

The meeting was adjourned.

TAGORE JAYANIT

Rahim Rahiman & Smarjit Mitra gave detailed accounts of our success at two (2) Grant applications for Tagore Jayanti Cultural Program directed by Rita Mustaphi.

Compass has awarded \$1000 grant vs. \$3500 our request.

Metropolitan Art Council has awarded \$7500 Grant.

Many thanks to Rahim, Smarjit & Rita for their persistent hard work. Rita Mustaphi impressed the M.A.C. so much that her presentation and application received 17/0 votes for artistic quality, 17/0 votes for ability and 16/1 votes for grant need.

Rahim presented the tentative budget for the event as follows:

\$3000 Artistic Director & Participants Fees
\$3500 Auditorium
\$1000 Publicity
\$1000 Props Miscellaneous

Detailed budget will be submitted by Rita Mustaphi to Rahim Rahiman, Chairman of the committee overseeing the logistics of this event. Other members of the Committee are: Sudhansu Misra, Stefan Peterson, Daljit Sikka, Smarjit Mitra.

Rita M. is in a complete charge of Artistic production as well as participants. Proper contract will be signed from each participant, to prevent any misunderstanding or future liability.

All approved budget item expenses shall be submitted to Vinu Patel for payment after authorization from Rita & Rahim.

Vinu Patel shall keep clear detailed accounts on this event and keep running tally on expenses vs. budget.

Daljit Sikka will work on program book which will be self sufficient and possibly money making with support from the business community.

Srinath will report on liability insurance for this event as well as for year-around. Members felt that such insurance is essential.

Rita reported that we may try for a \$3000 grant program from Metropolitan Regional Art Foundation, to bring an artist from India during 1989.

NEWSLETTER:

Our Newsletter is getting good and positive comments about news contents and format. Additional help is needed for article writing, and other chores. Next newsletter in June with Tagore Jayanti announcements and write-up.

Membership: Stephan reported that so far 100 renewals have been received. Need telethon: Daljit will help to assist to have it on May 15, 1988 at 3:00 P.M. if convenient.

J.C. PENNEY: Daljit Sikka will coordinate Cultural programs at various J.C. Penney stores in connection with its merchandise promotion starting from May 15, 1988. Obtain help from other community organizations and volunteers. This may be a good opportunity for India Club to receive donations from J.C. Penney along with spreading cultural awareness to J.C. Penney customers.


Rita Mustaphi is keeping touch with a new ORGANIZATION-Minnesota Ethnic Alliance-being formed.

Food Share Drive -- Sudhansu Misra would like the India Club members to donate either food or money to this cause. Ramakrishnan reported that a \$900.00 contribution would be made from the Hindu Mandir. He is also looking for a match from a cooperation.

Dr. Sani suggested that India Club members have fund raising dinners for both candidates for the U.S. senate this year.


