MINUTES

Date: Sep 03, 1990 From: K.P.S.Menon

for the Secretary, Rajani S. Patankar, INDIA CLUB.

To: The Board of Directors and the officers of INDIA CLUB. Reference: Minutes of the meeting held on Wed., Aug 15, 1990.

Attendance: Ajitaprasad (Ramesh)', Balakrishnan (Vijay)', Menon (Shunkaran), Nambudiripad (Godan)', Ramaswamy (Raj)'.

Guests: Ganguli (Mukul + Aparna), Misra (Sudhansu).

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at the International Institute of Minnesota. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The President, Godan Nambudiripad reported on items as below:

- The play "Tasher Desh" went off very well. We received many good comments about it. The play was taped for VCR by a professional group. It might be possible to obtain copies from Rita Mustaphi at \$25/- each. The price is expected to go up. Ticket sales of 400# were made, though attendence was less than that.

- Godan met with India's ambassador to the U.S., Abid Hussein, in Chicago on Aug/11/Sa. The report from that meeting follows.
 - People came from IL/Chicago, MI/Detroit, MN, MO/St.Louis and WI/Milwaukee.
 - There were religious issues, with attendance from the Vishwa Hindu Parishad and Muslims amongst others.
 - There were political issues, for example NRI's saying they would lobby for India, but they would like to have dual citizenship.
 - There were economic statements from the ambassador about: "Help India with technology transfer".

"Help India be strong and it will reflect on you".

"Enter the culture in the U.S., don't be a minority. Avoid the situations such as have occured in the Fiji Islands, in East Africa.

"Be like the Jews".

"if he comes to a meeting that you request, at least 50% of the attendence must be American".

"India has been developed 96% with Indian monetary resources, and only 4% has required external monetary input".

"the middle class, as affluent as the well off in the more affluent nations, is 120 million strong".

"a critically important sector, of the small entrepreneur, is 1.3 million strong".

- India U.S. relations might see big changes with the opening between the U.S. and the U.S.S.R., because Pakistan is much less important to U.S. policy now.
- there was not a dull moment in this 4-hour meeting.

A resolution was moved and passed that Godan's trip expenses of about \$50/- be paid by INDIA CLUB.

Aparna was quite emphatic that the mailing list maintenance is sufficiently inadequate that many members in the Bengali community does not receive India Club communications. It was agreed that a list from her would be used to rectify this for the Bengali community.

Aparna also put forward the good idea that each Indian samaj, with authorization from its members, could collect member dues for the INDIA CLUB, and simply forward the same to us. This might work because the INDIA CLUB has good standing with the community. This process would eliminate the trouble of membership drives.

Ramesh said the next newsletter would be out about Sep/06. A reminder to all, that articles for the newsletter are due on the 15th. of any month.

Discussions on the Festival of India (FOI) event slated for Sep/30 was held in focus by Mukul, and covered the points below:

- a full list of profit and non-profit organisations has been obtained from Vipin Prasad. All these organisations will receive notices of the event, as also the participation agreement that they must sign to join the event.
- a press release will be sent to all of the local newspapers. This was done by Raj Ramaswamy last year.
- it was mentioned that KSTP-TV will allow you to make a 30-sec. announcement of your event IF more than 15 members of a group are at the filming of any episode of the show "Good Company". Gada (Nina) and Patankar (Rajani) are to be contacted for spreading the word on this, for the Sep/25 show.
- Aparna touted the idea of showing relevant and informational film about India obtained from the Bell Museum of the University of Minnesota. Such rentals cost about \$26 \$30. Having a projectionist as required by city codes costs more at about \$150/-. Two movies named by Aparna were:
 - "Taj Mahal"
 - "India Unveiled".

- It was moved and approved for the FOI to spend upto \$200/- on movies, projectionist and equipment. Raj should find out if the LANDMARK CENTER basement is available for use.
- Mukul indicated a need for volunteers. Mechanisms were identified in terms of the Board Members of this club, and the heads of Indian samaj's.
- the INDIA CLUB booth is to be at the center. Membership sign-ups can also occur there. Shrin Murthy is in charge of this. Ramesh's idea that a computer could be at hand, and that memberships be added and updated on-line, was accepted. He will handle this matter.
- Raj read the flyer for the event.
- Since this is an election year, Sudhansu wondered if some politician might come to the event. The new mayor of St. Paul, Scheibel was mentioned. It was felt that Rahim is our best person to contact the mayor.
- Admission charges are not being levied. No method has been identified to recoup the \$1,300/- the budget shortfall.

The color schemes for the new logo of the INDIA CLUB was discussed. It was agreed that:

- the inside annular ring becomes white,
- the present simple colors of blue and white look good.

Many suggestions were offered about colors. They included:

- the Indian flag tricolors as a bar on top,
- the outside annular ring with 1/4 orange on top, 1/4 green below, and 2 whites on each side being 1/4 each,
- crossed flags of India and the U.S. at the bottom right of the logo,
- to convert the blue of the MN to the tricolors of the Indian flag.

It was moved and approved to spend \$500/- to obtain 3 things:

- a 16' banner with a bar on top in the tricolors of the Indian flag,
- a vertical flag of the INDIA CLUB logo,
- to make the color and design changes mentioned earlier to 2 flags.

On the Youth committee, it was mentioned that there were problems with the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) administered this year in India, due to cheating etc., and only about 1/2 the usual number of students will be coming to the University of Minnesota. The offers from the UoM this year are 70.

Sudhansu said of the Asia - Pacific Council that not many meetings were held because of budget cuts.

Raj mentioned that the Burnsville School District obtained a grant to show "India thru Dance" in each of its 4-5 elementary schools, in each of 2-3 grades/school. Rani Ramaswamy will do the dancing and the teaching.

Shunkaran will be gone to India for 2 months, beginning early September.

The meeting ended duly.

Presidents Report: For Godan Nambudiripad, Rajani distributed the results of tabulation of response for the Tasher desh program. The program was attended by 473 people and 72 returned questionnaires after the show. The overall response on the quality of the program was excellent.

Treasures Report: No report

India Festival: Mukhul Gangulli reported that the arrangements were moving smoothly for the Festival of India. Bill Wilson, President of St. Paul City council has agreed to attend the festival of India. Gov. Perpich might attend. Shrin Murthy requested board to approve \$230 from the fund balance for printing brochures describing the activities of India Club to be distributed at the Festival of India. Board approved the motion. Rajani informed the board that she will be leading a group at the channel 5 s good company program to talk about the festival of india

Community Affairs: Rajani informed that, as part of the little brothers elderly program on August 11th and 25th about 5 volunteers visited and distributed cookies to senior citizens.

Festival of sharing will be held on November 3, 1990.

Long Range Planning: Raj Dhir has reported that a consultant from Management Assistance Project will give a half-day seminar for board members at \$150. Raj will follow-up and will have more facts at the next meeting.

Miscellaneous: India Club helped to speed up the process of sending the body of Modi Bindu, a student at the University Of Minnesota, who passed away recently. Board instructed that India Club send a letter to the families of Modi Bindu.

- Mukul Ganguli is busy with the Tasher Desh event till Jul/21, and will take up this matter then.
- Since no admission charges are being levied, the budget shortfall of \$1,300/- MUST be made up.
- Dollar generating ideas mentioned included the notion of community members volunteering their time to organisations that turn around and pay the promoting club. Examples given were: DAYTON'S hiring to do inventory counts; the U.S. OPEN tennis championship games at Hazeltine in 1991; trying to get a booth at the State Fair to sell samosas, pakodas, etc.
- Shunkaran asked if the literacy movement, LAMP, might have a booth for continous display of VCR segments on the movement. The idea was approved subject to Mukul fitting it in.

To: The Board of Directors and the officers of INDIA CLUB. Reference: Minutes of the meeting held on Wed., Jun 20, 1990.

Attendance: Balakrishnan (Vijay), Cherucheril (Jacob), Menon (K.P.S.), Nambudiripad (Godan), Rahiman (Rahim), Ramaswamy (Raj).

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at the International Institute of Minnesota. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The President, Godan Nambudiripad's reported on items as below:

- follow up with the Grand Met and with the Minnesota Historical Society society elicited the desire that both want to be on our mailing list so that the Asian Indian community is not forgotten in the future.

- in what follows IDS = India Development Service,

NFIA = National Federation of Indian Associations.

The NFIA news had requested mailing lists of all Asian Indian communities in the U.S. Before we pass on ours, we should find out the goals and aims of the NFIA, how they handle mailing lists, and whether we might have privileges in return on their lists. A Porus Dadaboy of NFIA was mentioned. It was also mentioned that IDS of Chicago wants to make presentations to the community in the Minnesota area.

Jacob Cherucheril, the Treasurer, handed out the Festival of Nations (FON) report.

- Total revenues of \$8,368.90 less expenses of \$5,470.15 generated a net income of \$2,898.75.
- the Board moved to pay \$1,160/- to SILC as about 40% of net from the above event. Aside from the rational of philanthropy and helping our community, it was noted that SILC helps the event by making the Cultural portion successful, and that its staff helps in the event.

Rahim Rahiman explained the meaning of part of the Tasher Desh flyer in that the 'Prince' equates to the British. Thus the drama is a socio-political play on the fact of the British uniting a fractured nation in a common language, and waking up a dead and ineffective society with stark 'shock therapy'.

- Raj Ramaswamy created discussions on the Festival of India (FOI) event slated for Sep/30 as below:
 - a preliminary budget sheet was handed out, with two or three alternatives.
 - Alternative #1 that provides free admission requires us to outlay \$1,330/-. Current sources included HONEYWELL, Inc. and the Grand Met via THE PILLSBURY CO.. It was moved to go with this alternative IF a task force found a way to raise the money.

- it was important that Americans be attracted to the event. Publicity for this included: via Posters; reaching the PARENTS OF INDIAN CHILDREN (PIC) group; reaching the CHILDREN'S HOME SOCIETY (CHS) group.

- a general concept seemed agreeable to all, that the FON exhibit move to

the FOI event each year, saving time and effort.

- another accepted general concept was that this event was an important occasion to pull in new members. Ideas included:

- poster everywhere that showed what a \$10/- membership buys;

- HINDU MANDIR has previously had signs larger than ours. This was to be changed by having standards on signs, and making ours clearly the most prominent.

- have our current membership list there, and asking people to sign

- at the next Board meeting, Ganguli should have more information on key people identified; good plan; contacts completed with the different booths and vendors.

- Board Members should be there.

Godan closed the meeting by reviewing the past six months, and looking ahead to the next six months.

Shunkaran Menon reported for LAMP, the literacy project for India, about good community activity in sending \$2,500/- to India. This is 100% of whatever is collected. It was noted that LAMP meets monthly on the third Saturday, including a lunch.

Board members - Sep/30 - please be at Festival of India event.

Nambudiripad - identify NFIA goals and aims. Find out how they handle mailing lists, and if we have privileges in return.

Attendance: Ajitaprasad (Ramesh), Balakrishnan (Vijay), Menon (K.P.S.), Ramaswamy (Raj).

Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at International Institute. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

The President, Godan Nambudiripad's report was read by the Vice-President, Raj Ramaswamy as follows:

- The Apr/21 meeting of the Vietnamese group was attended by Ram Gada. Our community can help in the areas of Tenant's Union Learning ESL (English as a second language).
- In the Asian Heritage Month Celebration, by the MN Historical Society, Godan Nambudiripad noticed that while the Chinese, Hmong, Korean, Vietnamese were included, there was no mention of Indians. He wrote them a letter pointing this out, and offering our help.
- At the University of MN, Prof. Suhas Patankar received the MORSE AWARD for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education.

Vijay mentioned the newsletter is being is being put together, and is expected out in Mid-June.

Festival of India: Raj reported that the LANDMARK CENTER has stated it will waive the 20% fee on gross sales our food because "we exhibit our culture so well and involve the whole community".

- the charge is \$75/- if no sales to attendees,
- and \$125/- per hour if sales are being made.

They advised us about making a sign once, perfectly, and about keeping areas clean. Mukul Ganguli is managing it this year. Budget will be submitted at next meeting.

Community Affairs: Raj showed the nice award received by INDIA CLUB from the EASTSIDE NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES, Inc. for the help with food in "Sharing of the Festivals". Pranab Lahiri will manage the effort this year. Rajani Patankar will sponsor a Christmas party for needy children and single parents through an appropriate organisation

Tasher Desh event has been postponed to July/21 because Rita Mustaphi is too busy.

Festival of Nations: Cafe report was submitted by Shunkaran Menon. We made a profit of about \$2,100/-. The complete Festival report is expected at the next meeting. Newsletter will publish the names of all the people who helped, and thank them.

Shunkaran Menon reported on developments with LAMP and of Dr. Rao's visits in Dayton, OH and Chicago, IL on the week ends of May/12 and May/19. At

Dayton, Dr. Rao had come from good work done in Ghana, and from the World Bank. 10% of a World Bank effort on roads was redirected according to Dr. Rao's methods. He said the pilot project for literacy had inducted 10,000 illiterates to date, expecting 40,000 by summer's end. The target of 1,000,000 should be achieved by next summer. To date the U.S. efforts have collected \$52,000/-. He sang, and very beautifully, songs that had been written extempore in Andhra by young children. At Chicago, Dr. Rao was returning from a week in Columbia. 14 people attended from MN.

The Dayton LAMP group had done good work. TV footage taken in Andhra is likely to air on PBS in a few months. They have generated a good brochure and business card. The release of a new postal card by the U.S. on world literacy was shown. They have produced a DAD (dime-a-day) can. A classy sit-down dinner attended by 200 ethnic Indians was a part of the day's programs.

Items for the newsletter are summarized again: award to Suhas Patankar, copy of Award from ENS, Rajani's Christmas party, list of Festival participants with thanks.
