Per your request, I have gathered the necessary background information regarding India Club's contributions to SILC for participation at the Festival of Nations. The International Institute, which organizes the Festival, requires each participating ethnic group to take part in each of the four activities at the Festival. These are:

CAFE
BAZAAR
CULTURAL EXHIBIT
CULTURAL PROGRAM

In the past India Club has taken total responsibility for the CAFE and has negotiated with commercial vendors to stage the In return, the commercial vendors donate a mutually agreed upon sum of money to India Club. This year that amount is expected to exceed \$900.00, depending upon the persuasive skills of Neena Gada. Since the resources, talent and desire to stage the last two activities (Cultural Exhibit and Cultural Program) rested with members of the SILC organization, India Club, the approval of SILC, has delegated this responsibility to SILC with outstanding results. In fact, our exhibit shared the First Prize this year with two other ethnic groups. In return for the expenses incurred and the volunteer effort needed to stage these two activities, India Club has donated varying amounts (\$400 to \$700) to SILC depending upon the profits made during the Festival. For the benefit of the future Boards of Directors of both organizations I believe it is time to formalize the current understanding through a resolution of the Board of Directors.

Motion: Be it resolved that India Club shall donate 40% of the net profit, excluding SILC's expenses, from the proceeds at the Festival of Nations, but not less than SILC's actual expenses, to the SILC organization.

Thank you again for the efforts you have made in selecting a representative regional game to be presented at the Festival of Nations 1983 under the direction of Indian Ethnic Group.

The location of the area is referred to as "Games of the World" and is on the main level of the Civic Center Arena, it is identified on the attached map. Every effort has been made to schedule these games so that they may be convenient times to the participants and the Ethnic Group concerned with the arrangements. If some concerns still exist, please let me know immediately, and I shall be happy to try and correct the problem.

Attached you will also find a schedule of other "Games of the World" planned for this first time ever. This schedule is for your information and shows the diversity of the games. I hope it might help generate new ideas for your group and other ethnic organizations participating in future Festival of Nations.

Please allow me to emphasize the demonstration guidelines discussed in my letter to you of March 1983. I would like to express a concern regarding player participation. You will observe that the duration of many of the games is one hour, which is shorter than



originally planned. A delay in the start of a scheduled game would upset the program seriously. So please have the players report to the designated area in plenty of time. The games will be demonstrated, generally, on alternate tables to give time for one group to set up while the other group is preparing to leave. Either I or my wife (Vali), or a person assigned to the area will be there at all times to help you in any way we can.

Please identify yourselves and let us help you.

It may be necessary to contact you during the Festival. While I realize this may be difficult, it would be most desirable if you would let me know where your headquarters will be, such as your ethnic cafe booth, or the exhibit booth.

There will be a poster in the area prepared by the Festival Committee which will display the name of the game, the region where it is played and the ethnic group demonstrating it. Another poster describing the game and its origin will be very helpful if you would prepare and display it. In lieu, or in addition to this poster, a player or a commentator could describe the game and even ask the audience to participate.



Thank you for agreeing to participate in "Games of the World" at this year's Festival of Nations. The following information is for use as you plan the specific details of your demonstration. Demonstration Area:

When planning your demonstration, consider that the allocated space will be approximately 8 ft x 8 ft. The booth provided by the Festival Committee will consist of a back wall and two side walls. These walls will be made of drapery material. Lighweight articles may be fastened to them with pins or suspended from the top with wire or monofilament line (fishline). Tables and chairs will be provided, but other props must be brought in by the demonstrators. The Festival of Nations will provide the poster with the name of the ethnic group and the name of the game being demonstrated. A second descriptive poster giving historical background and/or rules of the game would be most appropriate if provided by your group. Several ethnic groups will demonstrate their respective games in succession. Time slots for each game will be 90 min- (///k) utes, but may be scheduled differently if pre-arranged. Two sessions for each participateing group is recommended, on separate days or on the same day if more convenient. Naturally, players will be provided free participant tickets to the Festival.



Demonstration Guidelines:

The following quidelines are to be followed:

- 1. Games used should be of a quality that is worthy of the culture they represent.
- 2. Players and persons in the demonstration booths are to be in costume.
- 3. Games should be demonstrated continuously during the time you have been scheduled. Explanation of the game by the player or another member is most desirable. Playing with a visitor, if at all practical, will add interest and excitement. Go for it!
 - 4. The hours of the Festival are as follows:

Friday 12:00 noon - 11:00 pm

Saturday 11:00 am - 12:00 midnight

Sunday 12:00 noon - 8:00 pm

- 5. You will be notified of the schedule of the games soon. Players should be in their booths 15 minutes before their scheduled appearance for set-up.
- 6. $\underline{\text{DO NOT}}$ plan to use any of the following in your demonstration booth:
- a. NOISEMAKING DEVICES NO noisemaking devices such as musical instruments or radios will be permitted in the demonstration booths.
- b. <u>ADVERTISEMENTS</u> demonstrators <u>CANNOT</u> use advertisements such as travel posters or <u>ANYTHING</u> which might be considered advertising. <u>NO</u> handouts of any kind may be distributed to the public.
- c. FLAGS NO flags are to be used in the demonstration booths. A sign printed in English will be furnished for each booth.
 - d. MAPS NO maps are to be used in the demonstration booths.

Thank you again for presenting "Games of the World". Hoping that this will be a greater feature in coming years, I wish you the best.

SUBJECT: Insurance Coverage

At our general meeting at the International Institute in January, we promised information regarding the optional liability coverage available to participating Festival groups. The Overmann Insurance Agency, our insurance carrier, has given us the following information:

1. The \$42 fee will put the following optional liability coverage into effect for your group:

Bodily injury of \$500,00 per occurence and aggregate Property damage of \$100,000 per occurrence and aggregate

Please note that payment of the fee covers any participating member of your group except bazaar participants. (Dancers, exhibitors, demonstrators, and cafe workers are all covered with payment of the optional liability coverage fee.) This coverage provides protection against a law suit by guest(s) at the Festival or by member(s) of another ethnic group. It does not cover a member of your group against another member of your own group.

 The Festival of Nations will provide, at its own expense, accident insurance coverage on all participating members of ethnic groups:

Accidental death - \$1,000 Accidental medical expense \$1,000 (Subject to \$25 deductible)

3. All risk coverage excluding breakage will be provided on all exhibits with a \$100 deductible per occurrence.

Please note that liability, exhibits, property and accident insurance are in force April 28 through May 2. Money belonging to individual groups is not covered under our insurance coverage.

If you wish to obtain the optional liability coverage mentioned in point #1 above, please remit the \$42 fee (make check payable to Festival of Nations) prior to April 22.

- We have not had a response from you (or your response was incomplete) about participation in the showing of traditional ethnic clothing. Even though you are not in the Folk Spectacle program, we would still like to have you appear in this "costume show" which is becoming a small tradition of the Festival. The American audience can learn much about the cultural background of your people from these showings -- we want to emphasize that the clothing worn was a part of family daily life, and not just fancy dress.
- This year, as a theme, we suggested that those who wished bring "one of my favorite things" -- an old and treasured item from the family brought here with the first who came to America to remind them of that other home. Or something hand-made here to replace what had to be left behind some item which may not fit into your big exhibit but treasured for personal reasons. Just so it is large enough for an audience to see, and small enough to be carried: carved or decorated household items, tools, hand-made children's toys, old items of clothing lovingly saved and not often shown.
- Your appearance would be on the same day as your program is presented. If this is not convenient, we can shift people around. Possibly someone from your exhibit could be released to be a part of our showing?
- If you think there may be garments in the International Institute "museum quality" collection, these can be borrowed to show.

Mrs. Lillian Kurkowski is the contact person you should call to discuss this. She will make an appointment to meet you at the Institute and show you what may be available.

I will be at the BIG MEETING AT THE CIVIC CENTER on March 21. Please come and talk with me and perhaps we can develop a usable idea for you. Or you may call me and discuss it at any time.

We need to plan for and schedule no more than 8 groups on any day. Your participants must be able to be in both showings on Saturday and Sunday. Friday there is only one showing. You must show the same thing both times OR AT LEAST MAKE DIFFERENT ARRANGEMENTS WELL IN ADVANCE! It is very disconcerting if I don't know you have changed because I won't have the new script.

I must know by the end of March if you can join us and at that time I MUST HAVE YOUR DESCRIPTION, about 2 or 3 minutes long, about the clothing and/Or items you may want to bring along. We won't have a place to keep these between shows, so you should make arrangements in the exhibit or other place.
