



First of all I would like to introduce to you the IAM Board of Directors.

This year there has been an addition to the structure of the India Association's organization. We have now created a Trustee Advisory Council, that will ensure smooth transition of the board from year to year and advise the board when necessary. The council is made up of ex-IAM presidents and committee chairs.

India Association of Minnesota was established in 1973, then known as the India Club. The organization has evolved over time as the needs of the community have changed. Originally, it was a group for Asian Indians to socialize amongst themselves. As the size of the Indian community increased, its goal became one of promoting an understanding of Indian heritage through cultural and educational programs, such as the Festival of Nations and the Festival of India. It further expanded its organization and created the Asian Indian Women's Association and the 55+ club, to meet the changing needs of the community.

The demographics of Minnesota have changed dramatically over the last ten years. There has been a large increase in the number of minority immigrants to Minnesota. The number of People of Indian origin has more than doubled over that period. This has led to the creation of a number of regional organizations within the Indian Community, like the Gujarati Samaaj, the Marathi association, that are increasingly meeting the social needs of the Indian community.

However, the vacuum that needs that needs to be filled by an organization like the India Association of Minnesota is to build a strong and cohesive community of Asian Indian in Minnesota and to represent the Asian Indian community to the society at large. The need of IAM is further reinforced because of the events of September 11th and recent developments in India.

One of our main goals this year is to increase IAM's involvement with other community organizations, both within the Indian community and outside it, to build bridges between different groups through education and dialogue.

We have already joined the Council of Advisors of Tolerance Minnesota, which is a program promoting diversity and combating racism through education. Tonight, we also have representatives here from two other organizations that promote the interests of the immigrant and Asian populations. Robin Philips and Manpreet Dhanjal from the Minnesota Advocates for Human Rights and Ilean Her and David Zandar from the Council of Asian Pacific Minnesotans.

We are planning to meet with the regional groups within the Indian community to develop partnerships, so that we work together to ensure our place as an integral part of the Minnesota community.

Social change can be created in a number of ways: through the political process; through art and through community involvement. Tonight's program will demonstrate each one of these. We put this program together to give our members the opportunity to hear ideas that will help them to understand the importance of the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

I am writing you this letter to invite your participation and partnership in putting together the Annual Asian Pacific American Heritage Month Dinner. Annually, the community convenes together to celebrate and commemorate May as Asian Pacific American Heritage Month and to jointly honor the accomplishments of Asian and Pacific Americans and to recognize their many contributions to our great nation and state. The Council takes the leadership to organize the dinner, but the dinner belongs to the community and it is the highlight of a month-long calendar of events celebrating heritage month.

The Council on Asian-Pacific Minnesotans is a state agency. We were created by the legislature in 1985 to fulfill three broad mandates: serve as an advisor to the governor and policymakers; be an advocate for the community; and a builder of bridges between and among the Asian Pacific and non-Asian Pacific communities. Our Council seeks to represent the interests of a board and diverse Asian Pacific Islander community. There are over 42 different Asian Pacific ethic groups residing in Minnesota. Census 2000 counted the population at 182,000, making them the second largest and fastest growing minority group in Minnesota.

Annual Dinner: May 20, 2005

This year the Annual Dinner will be on Friday, May 20, 2005 from 6:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. at the Minneapolis Airport Marriott, 2020 American Blvd. E., in Bloomington. The dinner is a unique and special event which brings many differing Asian Pacific ethnic groups and organizations together in unity and celebration. The Annual Dinner is always well attended and each year we always add new attendees. The dinner program consists of a keynote address with a notable guest speaker, the awarding of the annual Asian Pacific Leadership Awards, and various cultural performances. This year the keynote address will focus on racism, it's impact on the community and community efforts to address it.

In 2004, the Dragon Festival marks its eighth year, with a diversity of Asian American volunteers, business and community supporters involved in planning and committed to making the mighty dragon a part of Minnesota's cultural landscape.

At the center of the Dragon Festival are the dragon boat races and pageantry... on Lake Phalen in St. Paul. But the Dragon Festival celebrates much more dragon heritage. Wake the dragons, cheer the dragon boat races, get fit with the 5K, applaud the Entertainment Stage, enjoy happenings at the Children's Tent and Amphitheater, learn at the Health Tent, browse the Market Square exhibits and food vendors, support the Silent Auction, marvel at the Calligraphy, engage the Policy Roundtable. The Dragon Festival is free admission.

Dragon Festival Area at Lake Phalen

Lake Phalen is a beautiful suburban St. Paul park and lake just minutes north of the city. It is easily reached via Interstate 94, Interstate 35E and via the cross-town highways Larpenteur Ave. E. or Highway 61. Dragon Festival activities will take place throughout the parkwatch lakeside for dragon boat racing on Lake Phalen and race team registration at the Dragon boat race tent, kids activities in the Children's Tent and Amphitheater, opening and closing ceremonies, entertainment and cultural performances on the Dragon Stage; various food vendors, artisans and exhibitors tents in the Dragon Market Square; the Dragon Festival Info Tent including the Silent Auction and calligraphy table. Presenting the Dragon Boat Races

Dragon boat races have roots in a multitude of Asian countries. Its origins date to China, with historical accounts of dragon boats visiting New Zealand and the Americas, even before the explorer Ferdinand Magellan reached South Africa. In southeast Asia-the Lao *Souang Heua* boat racing festival where cities participated with residents in full ethnic garb, the Cambodian *Om Tooh* mega boat races boasting 125 people per vessel, the Thai *Khang Roaae* boat races held when the river was high to celebrate the King and Queen's birthdays, the Vietnamese *In the Dai Viet Su KY* commemorating King Ly Thai To in the Autumn of Year 1012 watching the *dua thuyen* from the Ham Quang Palace. Among the Asian Pacific Islands, people from Polynesia, Burma, Lao and Hawaii were reputed as adventurous dragon boat navigators before the first Viking boats.

Dragon Boat Race Teams

Twenty-one teams will compete in 300-meter races, with crews of up to 22 per boat, all paddling to the beat of the drum, with flags mounted high. Watch dragon race teams practice on Saturday; official races authorized by the American Dragon Boat Association at 9 am on Sunday. Awards Ceremony estimated to start Sun. at 5 pm.





Dragon Boat Festival 2004

I was a relatively new member of the IAM board in fall 2003 when Rabinder Bains, who was the president-elect then, called to ask if I would be willing to volunteer for the planning of the 2004 Dragon Festival. I had never heard of the Dragon Festival and had no idea what I was committing to but agreed anyway to give it a try. I was immediately thrown into a flurry of activity. I remember being puzzled by the urgency with which planning was taking place in September for an event that was to happen 10 months away. All that talk of boats and site decoration when there was inches of snow outside! It just did not make sense.

I volunteered to be part of the Dragon Boat subcommittee and was also elected to be the Secretary of the Festival Planning Committee. Initially it appeared to be an easy job – attend meetings; take minutes (do you know how much people can talk in a 2-3 hour meeting? Wow!), type them up and email them out. Then came the part where there was no one to maintain the website. I volunteered to clean it up a little until a volunteer was found to take care of it. Little did I know that it was to become my main contribution to the festival.

As time passed, more was revealed to me in terms of how new the festival itself was. There was much to be done and not enough people to do it. Arrange for the boats, arrangements for the site, get the forms ready for booths, the performance, write press releases every month, and a million other things. There was no manual and everything appeared to be happening by trial and error. We got our first sponsor, then the first boat team, the first performer and a booth reservation. Entries began to trickle in and the volume soon increased as the festival drew near.

This year India Association of Minnesota decided to submit an entry, from the Twin Cities Indian-American community, at the Dragon Festival boat races. I got the honor of being the team captain and we named our team "Vikrant". The Network of Indian Professionals—Twin Cities & 3M shared sponsorship with IAM towards the \$750 registration fee, the cost of the team t-shirts as well as refreshments for the team. This



gave our team the needed support from established entities in the community.

Though this was a relatively unique event for the Indian-American community, a single advertisement brought many responses that quickly filled up the requirement of 25 members on our team. There were many questions asked - "Do I need to be able to swim well?". "How much time would I have to give this?", "How can we practice?" etc. As the event drew near, the excitement built and at last, there we were at Lake Phalen on a beautiful Saturday afternoon - ready for our training. Many of us had never met each other before, but soon had slogans going of "Go VIKRANT! Team VIKRANT" and "Jeetega Bhai Jeetega. Team Vikrant Jeetega". To add to the excite-

The races were held on Sunday beginning with the time trials. The course was 300 meters long. It was our first time at the Dragon Boat Races and we soon realized how difficult it was to paddle in synchrony, which it turns out is a critical aspect of dragon boat racing. Based on our timing (total of 3:26 minutes for 2 heats) we were placed in the purple division. We were among the first teams to race. We did a whole lot better this time around with a timing

of 3:10 minutes, but unfortunately lost by a mere 2 seconds.

Though the actual time that we spent on the boat was much less than what we spent with each other, our team had a lot of fun being at the festival and just being able to participate in the races. We are eager to be back next



year, determined to practice hard and walk off with an award.

Besides the boat in the races, there was an Indian performance by Aishwarya Menon, who danced gracefully to two songs - one from Rajasthan and another from Kerala.



It is now a week since the festival and when I sit back and think back about the effort that went into it and the manner in which everything was done, I'm amazed that it happened at all. It appears that we pulled off a small miracle. The disappointment on the lack of organization has given way to hope in the midst of discussions by members of this year's planning committee regarding developing a manual and committing our experiences to paper to help future planning committees. I frequently ask myself if I would do this again and feel that I might...many years from now.

Dear Dean Rosenstone:

The Indian-American community has been very pleased to engage in a dialog with the CLA administration, including yourself, Associate Deans Reid and Waltner, and University Vice Provost Swan. I take this opportunity to thank you abundantly for this opportunity. I should also say at the outset that much remains to be done in terms of the goals we had set for ourselves as set forth in our petition of 30 January 1998 to President Mark Udof.

We met with you on February 13 and March 18, 1998, and I visited briefly with you on May 13. As I informed you on May 13, at that time 75 students had indicated to us their intent to register this coming Fall for the three language courses, Hindi, Urdu, and Sanskrit. Since then, I am happy to report, that number has swelled to 95 students and is still growing. I have been in contact about this with Dean Barbara Reid who is implementing plans to teach these students.

To briefly recapitulate, at our first meeting on February 13 the Indian community representatives presented the issues that are of paramount concern: the CLA moratorium on new enrollments in the South Asia program; replacement of two faculty members lost due to retirement; and our view about the importance of the Sanskrit language to the South Asia program thereby requiring that Sanskrit instruction belong to that department. We also discussed the possibility of federal grants and community-support towards an endowed chair in South Asian studies. We were delighted with the response with which these concerns were received.

At our next meeting on March 18, you provided us with an exhaustive questionnaire that had been developed in an effort to get every faculty member involved and interested in South Asia matters and curriculum aboard in the effort to strengthen the South Asia program. You also indicated the possibility of one faculty hire by Fall 1999. The expertise of this new hire and the department where the hire would occur were left unspecified. We also discussed the teaching of South Asian languages starting Fall 1998. It was indicated to us that it would be more prudent at this time to hire Teaching Specialists for this language instruction rather than commit resources for a long-term permanent faculty hire. We agreed with this approach while still emphasizing our view that we should target two faculty hires in order to build up the South Asia program along with the interdisciplinary resources already available.

What has subsequently followed those discussions is not, at least in our view, encouraging. We have learned that in the meeting called to discuss your questionnaire and obtain consensus on how to proceed, the faculty from other departments have continued to voice strong opposition to revitalizing the program or even lifting the current moratorium on the program. We are distressed at this state of affairs. Apparently, the great divide between the language and culture arm of the South Asia program and the humanities/social sciences arm of the program has not narrowed. Since in our view the re-birth of the program must first come at the undergraduate level and must be based on language acquisition, it is up to you to ensure that faculty at the University are not working at cross purposes and thereby undermining whatever strengths remain. Our sense of unease has grown with news that came to us about an incident in a Sanskrit course and that we discussed on May 13. This incident arose from the experience of a student of Sanskrit who was offended by what he saw as the disrespectful attitude of an instructor towards the Hindu holy book Bhagawad Gita. It is news about such incidents that distresses members of the Indian-American community.

I urge you once again to immediately lift the moratorium on undergraduate enrollments in the South Asia program regardless of what happens on the graduate level. Our concern remains the teaching of language and culture courses at the undergraduate level. That will serve as the foundation of a strong South Asia program. As you had indicated at one of our meetings, "the buck stops with you." We eagerly anticipate your bold leadership in this endeavor. There are close to one hundred students eager to take language courses beginning in the Fall. The language and culture part of the program must be strengthened.







A Chinese Water Sport Races to New Places

Colorful 40' long dragon boats, with dragon head on the bow and dragon tail at the stern, with a crew of 20, create quite a splash on Lake Phalen in July. Dragon Festival 2004 in the Twin Cities will spotlight community dragon boat races, as part of a two-day Asian heritage celebration.

Calling dragon boat racers, from youth to senior, diverse backgrounds and skill levels. Race teams may be employee teams; family members, friends, neighbors; or individuals matched up by the Dragon Festival.

Dragon boat racing began in ancient China and now include major cities in the U.S. Minnesota hosts the races at Lake Phalen and two others. - (a) All participants, under 18 years of age, <u>MUST</u> be accompanied by a parent or guardian, in order to compete. Parents <u>MUST</u> sign the waivers for any participant younger than 18 years of age.
- (b) For <u>ALL</u> participants, previous experience with canoes is <u>NOT NECESARY</u> (you will receive training), but you <u>MUST</u> be able to swim at least 100 meters, confirmed by the Team Captain.
- (c) The CAPTAIN (named in the application) will be responsible for all aspects of your team's participation in the Dragon Boat Race, including:
 - · completion of correct registration procedures,
 - Submission of a team roster (it is suggested that you register more than 20 individuals, with a maximum of 60, so
 that you will have alternates only those listed on the roster can complete, since they will be the only individuals
 covered by the Festival insurance),
 - submission of signed Release Forms for all team members, signed by them, or in the case of those younger than 18 years of age, by their parents or guardians;
