Dear Professor Buck:

I am enclosing for your notice as a member of the Board of Editors of the Mississippi Valley Historical Review a copy of the Table of Contents of the forthcoming September number and a list of the articles and books on hand.

In the case of the assignment of books to reviewers I am making suggestions some of which have already been acted upon in order to expedite the prompt publication of reviews. In any event, I should like to have you indicate alternate reviewers where you think the choice might be improved upon and especially when you feel that the opportunity to do such reviewing might be more extensively passed around. If such a suggestion could not be acted upon in the specific instance in hand the prospective reviewers might be given an opportunity in connection with similar items later. It would be a considerable expense in time and postage to send out such lists frequently enough not to hamper editorial plans. Besides some of you have already indicated you may not care to make prompt return giving alternate choices as to review assignments. In any event, I wish that you would consider this an invitation to make suggestions freely on this and other departments of the Review.

I might mention that I hope the new cover design seems satisfactory to you.

There is one matter of editorial policy that grows out of a suggestion by Professor Pelzer of the State University of Iowa that a list of references on the history of the West which he and certain of his graduate students have compiled from the first seventeen volumes of the Mississippi

Valley Historical Review be published for the use of teachers of courses on the history of the West. He wishes to know about possible plans for publishing such a list. I told him that I could not see how the Association could attempt it as an independent venture but that such an item might be published as a lengthy note in the Notes and Documents section of the Review and then be reprinted in an edition of say two hundred copies to be sold at a nominal cost from the office of the Secretary-Treasurer.

I should like to have your opinion upon the question of publishing in the document section of the Review the "Letters of Josiah Gregg to Dr. George Engelmann" which have been submitted by Mr. John T. Lee of Chicago.

Lee has had other letters published in the American Antiquarian Society Proceedings and regards these letters as even more noteworthy. The item, however, runs to some seventy or eighty pages and would take up probably at least sixty pages in the Review. That, of course, is considerably longer than documentary items have ever run.

What is your opinion in general on this matter? Would you care to have me send you the letters for your consideration?

Dear Cole:-

I have received your letters of June 23 and 25, and am returning to you herewith the list of "Manuscripts on hand" etc., with some annotations. Other things being equal, the preference should be given, I believe, to manuscripts relating to the Mississippi Valley, though I see no objection to such articles as the one on "Jeremiah Black and Andrew Johnson" and the one on "The Election of 1864." I am opposed, however, to the publication of articles relating wholly to sections outside the Mississippi Valley, such as the one by Woody scheduled for the next number. I am opposed also to the publication of reviews or notes of books in European history.

I am familiar with the letters published by Lee in the American Antiquarian Society Proceedings, and I am inclined to think that the collection of Gregg letters to which you refer would be well worth publishing. I am too busy at present, however, to undertake to examine them. In general I am not in favor of continued material, but my objection to it is much stronger in the case of articles than that of documents. I am inclined, therefore, to recommend that you run the material in two successive numbers of the Review.

I am very strongly of the opinion that bibliographies, such as the List of References by Pelzer, would be very desirable features of the Review. I do not know, of course, how carefully this list is compiled and classified, but if it is a good job I should certainly be in favor of its publication in the Notes and Documents Section of the Review, as you suggest. Perhaps a more logical place for it would have been in the consolidated index volume, but I presume that is too far along to permit of any additions. You may be interested to know that in the Consolidated Index to the first ten volumes of Minnesota History, which is just out, we have included a classified list of the articles in the volumes, and of this we are having some reprints made.

I have looked over your report on the Mississippi Valley Historical Review sent to me under date of April 12. I quite approve of the use of part rag paper although I am not sure that the percentage of rags is so important as the process used in the manufacture of the paper. I suppose that you have talked with Binkley about this. As for the institutional identification of reviewers, I think I prefer the present practice to including them in a directory of contributors. In fact, I should be inclined to abolish the directory entirely and return to the original practice of the Review of putting the names of authors of articles at the end of the article, together with institutional identification. When further information is needed, it can be put in an editorial note attached to the title of the article.

I am returning to you herewith the list of books that were unassigned for review with such suggestions as occur to me noted on it. You will observe that I am still of the opinion that it is unwise for us to review books in the whole field of literature, or of the social sciences, or even of history. ✓

In response to your form letter of May 15 asking for information about activities, I am sending you herewith some proof of the May number of our magazine containing two items about which you may care to write notes. You will receive a copy of the magazine in a few days but these proof sheets may be useful to you. ✓

In addition, I can now give you the Survey appointments for next year, beginning September 1, 1932: Dr. Randolph C. Lowmes, formerly instructor in history at the Erie Branch of the University of Pittsburgh, who has recently been holding a research fellowship from the Social Science Research Council, has been appointed research associate; Dr. Russell J. Ferguson, associate professor of history in the University of Pittsburgh, will devote part of his time to the Survey as research associate; Mr. Leland D. Baldwin, who will doubtless have the Ph.D. degree from Michigan before your note is published, has been appointed research assistant and librarian; James returns to the University and Holbrook and Field continue on the staff of the Survey. I take it that you are not interested in reappointments, however.


