Dear Francois;

Your wedding announcement has just caught up with me. Naturally it is hard to believe that you have finally turned honest. However, I am not angry with you and I am going to forgive you. Will reciprocate the blow by telling all. Got married myself last October 27th in Washington, D. C. Married a California girl and am pleased as punch with myself.

Left Albert Kahn last August to join the Navy. Am stationed with a Construction Battallion in Scotland at the present time. The work is hard, fast, interesting, and enjoyable. I consider it the best field experience an Architect could have- the type of work being varied and under unusual conditions. It is also proving to be quite a "travelling fellowship", am able to do considerable travelling.

At he present time am laid up in the hospital with some cracked up ribs and various other honorable ailments. Will be out very shortly. Have amused myself by growing a fine busy mustache. It is a fearful thing and quite distinguished. Have also in my simple way been dibbling with a few sketches and water colors. Am stocking up with supplies as they are quite reasonable and of excellant quality.

Don't expect to be here much longer- probably Africa next, but you know how I feel about such things, Africa for the Africans. This bumming around is fine and educational, but God, how a fellow misses his own hat rack and wifey on Christmas. By the way if you are ever in Washington I want you to look up Mrs. K.I. ### INSTRUCTIONS.

- (1) V-Mail Service is available for the personnel of our Armed Forces stationed at certain points outside the continental United States.
- (2) Write the entire message on the other side below the double line. Very small writing is not suitable.
- (3) Address exactly as you would an ordinary letter, PRINTING the address in the panel provided, AS LARGE AS POSSIBLE.
- (4) If it is desired to send more than one sheet a separate form must be completed.
- (5) A miniature photographic negative of the message will be made and sent by the most expeditious form of transportation available. It is important that the message be written very plainly. A photographic reproduction, measuring about 5 inches by 4 inches, will be made and delivered to the addressee.
- (6) The original will be destroyed after the corresponding film has been delivered at the destination.
- (7) V-Mail is subject to the same censorship prescribed for other mail. Censorship instructions embodied in Section IV, Circular No. 17, this Headquarters, 9 April, 1942, subject "Security Instructions," will be strictly observed in the preparation of V-Mail letters.
- (8) Unit censors, after censoring V-Mail letters, will indorse their name and rank just above the words "Censors Stamp", and forward them to the officer designated to affix the Censor's stamp. This must be accomplished within 24 hours. After stamping, the letters will be placed flat in a large envelope, or carefully packaged if quantity warrants, and mailed to the V-Mail Station, APO 887, U.S. Army.
- (9) Blue envelopes may be used for V-Mail in the same manner prescribed for other letters. Blue envelopes containing V-Mail letters will be addressed to the Chief Military Censor, V-Mail Section, APO 887, U.S. Army.

Dear Frank,

Received your last letter and xmas. card- not literally the last, I hope. Mail and I have been following one another for some time now. Am delighted to finally catch up with all of the good news. Congratulations on becoming "professional" on both scores (licensed Architect and Pappy). I suppose that you give Mrs. Meisch a small amount of the credit due for your status of Pappy. Keep up the good work, old boy. Liked the hell out of your card.

Know that you will understand that my negligence in keeping up my share of correspondence has been due to necessity. Have been banging around from hamlet to Bondon to parish sans benefit of postal and censoring facilities. Hade had really a marvelous time and an excellent view of the British Isles from top to bottom. Am still exposed to Architecture and construction in the capacity of officer in charge of Design and Engineering. Have a few "tall-ones" to tell you one of these days. Unfortunatly my capacity - rather talent- for doing "business over the bar" is latent. The yanks have long ago consumed every drop of grog in the Isles. We struggle along on our insipid "'arf of bitters". British women? - tch,tch?? But, of course you are beyond that now.

If you find it possible, Frank, would appreciate your sending along a set of questions on Architectural license examinations. Don't know if it is kosher, but in the event it is permitted would like to have them. We are usually working day and night, but lulls between jobs occasionally occur, lulls in which a worthy moral effort might? be persued. (I think it best for your trusting wife not to read these lecherous lines. It may interfere with any future slaving over the board at night that might come our way later on.)

Write often, Frank; appreciate and enjoy your letters. Good luck to you and best regards to yourself, and family.
