Thanks for the Air Lingus flight numbers. I will now try to pin down the airfare quotes I received over the phone today, in order to determine whether it makes more sense to fly Northwest from Minneapolis to Shannon and return or take TWA from Minneapolis to Kennedy and Air Lingus from Kennedy.

usually do it at JFK or Shannon —
they have 24 hr. service.

Be sure to get your allotment of
liquor & wine. // \$4. liquor 2 1/2 quarts per person
Government taxes boost prices sky high
in Ireland. You'll be addicted to
Irish coffee & possibly stout before
you leave.

The O'Neills have wine & it available
in their dining room.

Dear Bob:

In accordance with your revised invoice of April 1, 1985 in the amount of \$ 1,300.00, I am enclosing my check in the amount of \$ 1,300.00.

We have been having yo-yo weather here. Tuesday it was so damn cold outside - in the low forties with the wind blowing - that I was chilled to the bone when I went outside to tie the climbing rose to the trellis. Then yesterday the temperature went to 85 degrees to set a new record for April 17th. Today it is at 88 degrees and is probably setting another record.

When I received your revised departure time for Aer Lingus on the return trip to 2:45 PM with arrival at Kennedy at 4:30, I knew that there was about a zero chance of our connecting with the TWA flight leaving Kennedy at 5:50 PM. Requested my travel agent to get us on a later flight to give us more time at Kennedy, but she could not do it without a big jump in airfare. The lowest fare she could come up with required a transfer from Kennedy to La Guardia to come back on NWA. There were a lot of fare changes coming up so we waited until April 15th for the smoke to clear. The net result was that on June 13th we could not get to Shannon from Minneapolis as they were booked solid on NWA - But if we left on June 12th we could get to Shannon from Minneapolis via Boston and return on the 27th of June for a round trip fare of \$ 669 per person. That fare is only \$ 8.50 per person more than the TWA-Aer Lingus deal we were trying to set up when we thought that we had adequate time to clear customs at Kennedy.

As it now stands we intend to take NWA Flight 42 from Minneapolis on June 12 at 1:45 PM, arrive Boston 5:17 PM, Leave Boston on NWA Flight 34 at 8:20 PM, arrive Shannon 6:50 AM on June 13, 1985. We intend to stay either at the airport hotel one night or go into Limerick and recover from jet lag and expect to meet you at the Shannon Airport when you arrive on Aer Lingus at 8:00 AM on June 14. Our return flight is on NWA Flight 34 Leaving Shannon at 3:05 PM on June 27th, so we can go with the group back to the airport on the 27th.

If You Go . . . to Cape Ann, the most direct route by car from Boston is Interstate 95 or U.S. 1 north to State Route 128, then north to Gloucester. Turning off at 128's Exit 14 leads to the Fisherman's Memorial while Exit 11 goes directly downtown. From the heart of town, the visitor can head south on East Main Street to Rocky Neck, or double back to the southwest toward Magnolia and Hammond Castle.

A quicker route to the Bass Rocks and Rocky Neck areas is to continue on Route 128 to the last exit.

The most direct route from Gloucester to Rockport is State Route 127 north; the most scenic is State Route 127A along the coast, which doubles back around the peninsula to connect with Route 128.

Trains run from Boston's North Station to Gloucester and Rockport. For schedules, call 800-392-6099. One-way fares are \$2.25 (adults), \$1.10 (children). Bus service is available only between Gloucester and Rockport. During weekends in the off-season and daily in the summer, parking on the outskirts of Rockport is available for \$2.50 with a shuttle bus running into town. The lots are marked on entrance highways.

Accommodations in Cape Ann are limited through April, and those lodgings nearest the waterfront fill up quickly, especially before Memorial Day, when off-season rates apply. A call to the Cape Ann Chamber of Commerce in Gloucester (617-283-1601) is advised for details on what places are open and what attractions may be seen in early spring. The Rockport Board of Trade (517-546-6575) is also informative on which galleries and shops are open.

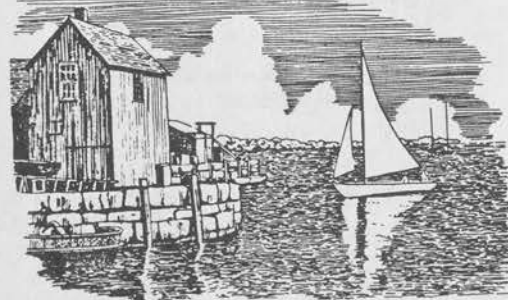
