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

As Chairman of the Art Committee for the IEFT BANK ARTS FESTIVAL, it is my pleasure to invite you to participate in the "PATKT DOWNTOWN SAINT PAUL"* Invitational Fine Arts Competition. The Festival will be held in Kellogg Park from September 21 to September 24. You may work in any medium or style and may begin at any time; however, we require that sometime during the period from September 16 through September 23, you spend a minimum of four hours painting on location so that the artists become involved in the Festival.

The enclosed pre-registration card must be returned to us no later than September 10, and paintings are to be delivered to and picked up at the Exhibition Pavilion located on Kellogg Boulevard across from the Y.W.C.A. according to the following schedule:

Entry Dates

Friday, September 22 - 10 A.M. to 9 P.M. Saturday, September 23 - 10 A.M. to Noon

Pick-up Date

Monday, September 26 - 9 A.M. to 6 P.M.

The sponsors of this event have donated \$2,500.00 to be used as cash awards. Winners will be announced and awards given Sunday afternoon, September 24, on the Park grounds.

In addition to entering the painting competition, you are invited to submit three previously completed works which will be made available for sale as part of this event. These works must be registered at the Exhibition Pavilion on Thursday, September 21, from 9 A.M. to 3 P.M., and those not sold must be picked up according to the schedule above. A minimum of two of these works will be on display at all times, and the third will be held in reserve as items are sold. An attendant will be on duty to handle all inquiries for you, and the paintings will be properly guarded and insured, and will also be stored indoors overnight.

*For the purposes of this Festival, the subject matter must lie within the area bounded by the Capitol, the Cathedral, Marriet Island, the Third Street Bridge and St. Paul-Ramsey Hospital.

It is hoped that this will become an annual event, and I believe this will be of great benefit to you and to the City of Saint Paul. I would encourage you to participate because the subject matter has many wonderful possibilities. This is an opportunity for our profession to take the lead in lending color and excitement to a Festival of this kind.

Please return the enclosed pro-registration card as soon as possible. We will then send you entry blanks for the competition work and the works submitted for sale.
