Open to all artists living in the upper midwest served by the Minneapolis Builders Exchange. One entry per artist.

Judging will be accomplished by a panel of three, including an art museum staff member, a well-known local painter and a member of the Minneapolis Builders Exchange. (Names supplied on request.) The jury will pre-select work to be exhibited and will grant the purchase awards.

Entries are not to exceed 12 square feet of painted area.

All entries must be framed and wired for exhibition. Glass is optional. Entries must be suitable for wall hanging.

Paintings will be accepted March 7 and must be received on or before March 11, 1966. You may deliver your entry in person from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at 1123 Glenwood Avenue, Minneapolis. If entries are shipped, they must be prepaid.

Exhibitors must pick up their entries from March 21 to March 26, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If entries are shipped back, freight costs must be borne by the artist.

We will cover 80% of your sale price or insurance evaluation while your work is in our possession.

Sales other than the purchase awards must be handled between the artist and the prospective buyer. However, the Exchange will endeavor to encourage sales and will notify you of any prospective purchasers.

Open to the public from 7 to 10 p.m., Thursday and Friday evenings, March 17 and 18. Also open to the public from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, March 19 and 20.

YOU MUST RETURN THE ENCLOSED ENTRY CARD BY MARCH 1, 1966. Please print the information requested on this card, sign it, and mail it as soon as possible.

The enclosed identification label is also to be completed. Please bring this label along with the enclosed receipt form when you deliver your entry. The identification label will be attached to the top of the back of your entry.

There will be no entry fee.

We wish to thank you for exhibiting in the Minneapolis Builders Exchange Construction Industry Art Exhibition March 17-20. Your participation contributed highly to the quality of our first attempt at sponsoring such an exhibit. The show was regarded to be of high quality and very interesting.

We are pleased that your painting "Glass Plant" was selected to receive honorable mention by the jury.

Several paintings were sold as a result of the show, however, because all sales were between the artist and purchaser, we do not know how many were sold. We would appreciate hearing from you if your painting was sold as a result of the exhibit.

We feel that sales are a significant indication of the success of an exhibit such as the one sponsored by our organization. In addition to the two Minneapolis Builders Exchange purchase awards of \$400 and \$200, we know of four other sales that took place.
