ELIGIBILITY

The Sioux City Art Center Biennial is open to all artists in the following states: Iowa, Illinois, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Artists may enter up to three works in this all media competition. Works must have been completed in the last two years and not previously exhibited at the Sioux City Art Center.

JUDGING BY SLIDES

Judging will be done solely by slides and the Juror may exercise the right to reject any accepted work that does not fulfill accurately the image shown on the slide. Artists should submit one slide for each 2-D work; artists may submit up to 3 slides for each 3-D work.

All slides are due July 3, 1987.
Slides arriving after this date
will not be considered.

LABELING OF SLIDES

All slides must include: artist's name, title, medium, size (height x width x depth in inches) on the top of a 2" x 2" mounted 35 mm slide. Label "top" on the correct viewing side of the slide. No glass slides will be accepted.

ENTRY

A \$15.00, non-refundable entry fee for up to three works is required, per artist. Please make checks payable to the Sioux City Art Center. Artist must enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with adequate postage for return of slides and notification card.

SHIPPING AND RECEIVING OF ACCEPTED WORKS

All accepted work must be suitably framed and/or ready to install. Accepted artists are responsible for delivering their work(s) to the Sioux City Art Center by September 4, 1987. The Art Center will pay for return shipment on all accepted works. Works will be returned via the same carrier. Works should be sent in reuseable cartons or crates. Complete shipping instructions and labels will be sent to all accepted artists; as well as a date for the acceptance of hand-delivered work. Work remaining at the Art Center after January 15, 1988 will become the property of the Sioux City Art Center.

INSURANCE

The Sioux City Art Center will provide insurance on all works while they are at the Sioux City Art Center. Artists are encouraged to secure their own insurance during shipment to and from the Art Center. Indicate value of all entered works including those which are not for sale.

PUBLICITY

The Sioux City Art Center reserves the right to photograph and reproduce all exhibited works and to use these photographs for catalogue, educational and/or publicity purposes.

SALES

Sales to the public will be encouraged. The Sioux City Art Center will retain a 30% commission. Prices must reflect this commission.

AWARDS

Over \$2,500 in cash and purchase awards will be given.



Any hand-delivered item not picked up by January 15 will be subject to a storage charge of \$.25 per day for 60 days and then will be disposed of at the discretion of the Sioux City Art Center.

FILLING OUT ENTRY CARDS: Fill out cards and labels completely except for areas indicated. Send file and notification with cards, slides and entry fee to the Art Center between September 25 and October 10. If notified of acceptance, attach appropriate label firmly to the upper right hand corner of back of the accepted work.

SALES: The Art Center will handle all sales from the exhibition and will retain a 25% commission. Your price should be adjusted accordingly.

REPRODUCTION RIGHTS: It is assumed that all entrants agree to allow their work to be photographed for the catalog and for publicity purposes unless otherwise stated in writing.

SALES/RENTAL GALLERY: If you would be interested in having your accepted work remain at the Sioux City Art Center in our Sales/Rental Gallery after the close of the exhibition, please put a check in the space provided on the file card.

RULES


- 1. Entries will be judged by means of 35 mm color slides.

Thank you for your recent communication and the reminder that I still have two ink wash drawings at the shop : RAINY DAY and CHULLPA AT SIL-LUSTANI. I would appreciate it, if they would be returned at once. I think that they are small enough in size to go by parcel post; however that would have to be checked with the postal authorities. If you send them via the U.S. Postal Service (Insured), I will reimburse you for the cost. I am a watercolor artist that generally works in full sheet size that results in a 364" by 284" when framed in the price range of \$ 1,500 per painting or in a half sheet size that results in a 284" by 224" size when framed with a price range of \$ 300 to \$ 750. Since you may not be familiar with my watercolors, and I am not likely to be in Sioux City, I am enclosing slides of a dozen of my watercolors painted in the last three years. I am enclosing my check in the amount of \$ 3.31 for the United Parcel Service charge for the return of the two wash drawings from the Shop. Please tell whoever does your shipping and crating never to put Scothch tape on items that are framed under plexiglas. The tape sticks very tightly to acrific plastic. It cannot be removed with a razor blade at that scratches the plastic and many of the solvents that will loosen the tape will also soften the plastic. It took me three hours with the use of a lot of naptha to remove the tape from the two pictures that were returned. In your letter you stated that you might take three or four smaller watercolors for the Shop. I had slides made of a number of the small watercolors but only those in vertical format were developed. All of those in horizontal format are still in the camera waiting for the roll to be completely taken before developing. I had hoped to allow you to make a selection from slides but it does not look as if I will have much time in the near future for painting and more photography. I am enclosing four slides of the vertical watercolors. Please advise if there are any of these that you would like for the Shop. I am contemplating on driving down to Springfield, Missouri to see the Watercolor USA 1983 exhibition probably the last half of July or the early part of August. Please advise if you are still keeping your Wednesday and Thursday 10:00 Ammitto4:00 PM office hours. If so, I could bring four watercolors with me and drop them off at your office anroute to Springfield. If you want horizontal paintings, I would have to make the selection as to what I should bring. BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH Francis R. Meisch Edina, Minnesota

Born in 1915 in Saint Paul, Minnesota, and educated there in Parochial and public schools. He received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from the University of Minnesota where he also studied art subjects under Elmer Young, Ivan Doseff and S. Chatwood Burton.

He received a Master in Architecture degree from Nassachusetts Institute of Technology where he studied art subjects under John L. Reid and Samuel Chamberlain. He taught architectural subjects, freehand drawing and watercolor in the Department of Architecture at North Dakota State College. He has practiced architecture since 1942. From 1942 to 1950, he was airport enginerr and architect for Northwest Airlines and was involved in airport and terminal building planning for many major cities in the United States.

He began exhibiting etchings and drypoints in 1937 and watercolors in 1942. His first watercolor sale was to the late Juliana Force, Director of the Whitney Museum of American Art. Since that time his work has appeared in more than one hundred and eighty local, regional and national exhibitions and in sixteen one man shows. His work has received many awards and is represented in numerous public, private and corporate collections throughout the United States. His watercolors have appeared in the Ford Times, Northwestern Bell Telephone Company publications, and in other publications.

He is a past president of the Minnesota Artists Association, a member of the Northstar Watercolor Society, the Twin Cities Watercolor Society and a member of the Old Watercolour Society"s Club of London. He has made several trips to Europe to study watercolors in the overseas museums and galleries and to gather material for his art work. He has also traveled extensively in the United States, Canada, Alaska, Columbia, Ecuador, Peru and Guatamala in search of subject matter for his watercolors. In 1972, he was the invited artist at the Minnesota State Fair.

In 1983 his watercolors have been exhibited in WATERCOLOR U.S.A. at the Springfield Art Museum, Sky "83 Art Exhibition (Award of Excellence), Northstar Watercolor Society Seventh Annual Membership Exhibition (Merit Award), Art Center of Minnesota 1983 Realist Exhibition (invitational), and at the Twin Cities Watercolor Society Members Show. The new AMFAC Hotel in the Minneapolis City Center (opening in November 1983) will have color reproductions of Minnesota watercolor landscapes by Meisch in each of the 600 guestrooms and the six original watercolors in the public areas.



It will be agreeable to me for you to return the watercolors as soon as "New Corn" is turned back to the Art Center at the end of the four month rental period. After they are returned, I will check my inventory and see if any lower priced watercolors are available. At present my lowest priced watercolors are those that were painted and priced a few years ago - and at that time were framed under glass and consequently cannot be shipped via REA Air Express. Almost all paintings from 1970 on are in the \$ 300 to \$ 600 range, with the average running at \$ 400. In the spring of 1972, I surveyed several of the national watercolor exhibitions and discovered that the average price of a watercolor in these shows was slightly over \$ 700. I find that my pricing of my paintings has been running about one half of what is the national average. The artist like everyone in business has been faced with rapidly rising costs. Express and shipping charges are six times what I used to pay. Crating costs and picture framing costs have trippled, etc. As long as inflation continues to be unchecked, the price of artwork will have to be adjusted to this trend. So far I have avoided doubling my prices in order to keep the paintings available to more purchasers - but the economic pressures to increse prices become stronger each month. Let me know whether you wish me to select pictures based on price or whether you would like to see slides of available work for future consignment. Sincerely Francis R. Meisch

To the artist:

The Sales/Rental Gallery of the Sioux City Art Center charges a 30% commission of all sales and rentals. Payments to the artist are made once a month from the fees received. Works are consigned to the gallery for at least six months and may be kept as long as a demand exists. A work may be withdrawn only if it is not out on loan, or after it has been returned when the rental period has expired.

Only works suitably and sturdily framed and wired for hanging will be acceptable. Prints, drawings and watercolors should be under glass or plexiglas. Due to lack of demand and storage limitations, paintings larger than 3 x 4 feet are not considered. Small sculpture is also eligible for showing in the Sales/Rental Gallery, however, weight and size must be a consideration. The Sales/Rental Gallery charges no fees nor does it pay shipping, thus, such costs should be considered in pricing a work. Label all work clearly on the back with name, address, title, medium and sale price.

New works and new artists are constantly being considered. Artists living at a distance may submit any number of slides or photographs (being careful to include dimensions, medium and price) for the Gallery's consideration at any time. First problem is that I have been attempting to build up an inventory of watercolors for a one man show. These watercolors are full size sheets which when matted and framed are in the 37" by 29" size and the \$ 600 to \$ 1,500 price range. I thought that the half sheet size would probably be more appropriate in size and price for the one-of-a-kind gift shop; however, I have not had the time to get any half size sheet watercolors matted or framed. The second item was the possibility that if I went west on a sketching trip this summer, I could go through Sioux City and bring in some new work. 
To the artist:

The Sales/Rental Gallery of the Sioux City Art Center charges a 30% commission of all sales and rentals. Payments to the artist are made once a month from the fees received. Works are consigned to the gallery for at least six months and may be kept as long as a demand exists. A work may be withdrawn only if it is not out on loan, or after it has been returned when the rental period has expired.

Only works suitably and sturdily framed and wired for hanging will be acceptable. Prints, drawings and watercolors should be under glass or plexiglas. Due to lack of demand and storage limitations, paintings larger than 3 x 4 feet are not considered. Small sculpture is also eligible for showing in the Sales/Rental Gallery, however, weight and size must be a consideration. The Sales/Rental Gallery charges no fees nor does it pay shipping, thus, such costs should be considered in pricing a work. Label all work clearly on the back with name, address, title, medium and sale price.

New works and new artists are constantly being considered. Artists living at a distance may submit any number of slides or photographs (being careful to include dimensions, medium and price) for the Gallery's consideration at any time. An artist wishing to bring his work to the Gallery for consideration should call or write the Sioux City Art Center, 513 Nebraska Street, Sioux City, Iowa 51101, phone 712-252-4551.

Please let us know if you want another copy of the entry form, artist instructions or the Courage Cards brochure which we sent you in November.

We look forward to seeing your art. If your work is chosen, you will have the satisfaction of knowing your talent is helping children and adults with disabilities through Courage Center's rehabilitation and independent living programs. Thank you very much for participating.
