





All paintings must be original watercolors painted to the theme, "Summer Days". Copies of other artist's work will not be accepted. No copies of published photos. No work from photos which were not taken by the artist. No paintings completed in workshops, or under the direct supervision of an instructor. All work must be executed solely by the artist. Maximum image size is 22X30. Work must have been completed within the past two years.

Entry Procedure & Fees

Entry in this exhibition is by 35mm slide only. NO GLASS SLIDES OR STICK-ON LABELS. Print information on slides as illustrated in example. Entry fee is \$8.00 per slide. Maximum of 3 slides per artist (one slide/\$8.00, two slides/\$16.00, three slides/\$24.00). ALL ENTRY FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE AND GO TO SUPPORT FUTURE TCWS EXHIBITIONS AND COMPETITIONS. Checks should be made out to Twin Cities Watercolor Society.

Delivery of Artwork

Accepted paintings may be delivered to the Edina Art Center between Noon and 2 PM on Wednesday, July 6. All work must be framed and ready to hang with wire and hooks 1/3 down from the top. Any image size larger than half the maximum size (half of 22X30) MUST be under plexiglass. Paintings must have an identification label affixed on the back lower right which includes the artist's name, title, price and phone number. ENTRIES IMPROPERLY FRAMED WILL BE REJECTED. Paintings cannot be removed during the show dates.

### Sales & Insurance

Sale of artwork will be handled by the Edina Art Center, which charges a 35% commission. Paintings not for sale should be labeled "NFS". All insurance for the Twin Cities Watercolor Society Summer 1994 Juried Exhibition is the responsibility of the artist. All accepted artists will be asked to sign a release assenting to the above at the time of delivery.

Opening Reception & Awards

The Opening and Awards Reception will be held on Thursday, July 7, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM. The critique and awards presentation will begin at 6 PM. Ribbons will be presented for Best of Show, Excellence, Merit, Honorable Mention, and People's Choice.

Exhibition Close & Pick Up

The exhibition will close on Wednesday, August 24, 1994. Paintings may be picked up between 3 and 6:00 PM. The Exhibition Committee will not be responsible for paintings that are not picked up during the designated time.



# TRICKS OF THE TRADE

Shipping Your Artwork
Submitted by Kay Masini

A well packaged painting can be shipped safely and at a reasonable cost. A good container provides good "insurance" by protecting your artwork from water, dirt, and rough handling.

Three types of containers are suggested. The first one is the plywood crate. It provides excellent protection, but is also the heaviest and most expensive to purchase, and to ship. Another alternative is the plastic sheet reinforced cardboard "Strongbox". It is lightweight and easy to pack and to handle.

The third is a new product called the "Barr Art Box". The box's interior is made of a sturdy foam and protected on the exterior with "armor" made of styrene sheet plastic. The Barr Art Box comes in one size that will handle paintings up to 44"X36"X2". The dimensions of the container are 2" beyond the maximum painting size. These boxes are lighter and easier to manage than the cardboard "Strongbox" and are designed for continued reuse.

It is not recommended that you use homemade crates of cardboard, styrofoam peanuts, or insert wadded paper to fill space. These methods do not provide puncture or impact protection and the filler materials shift during shipment. Bubble wrap does work well but excessive taping can limit it's reuse. Phillips head screws should be used in place of nails in wooden crates. Acrylic plastic should always be used instead of glass. Containers sold as "mirror boxes" are intended for moving mirrors, and not for the rigors of shipment.

Packages weight less than 150 pounds and having a combined girth and length of less than 130 inches can be sent via United Parcel Service. Bar Art Service recommends using UPS Ground Tract on your shipments. UPS charges 75 cents plus 35 cents for every \$100 over \$100 value for this insurance.

For oversize packages, Burlington Air Freight, Emery Air Freight, and Federal Express offer good rates, but none of these freight handles will insure original art for more than \$500. You can save on COD charges by setting up a credit

card account ahead of time. Another saver, when obtainable, is to plan ahead and request deferred delivery which takes a few days longer at a lower cost.

While inadequate crating can lead to damage, overcrating is costly and difficult to handle. Using good judgement in packaging can lead to successful shipments and the rewards it brings. For more information about the Barr Art Box call 1-714-525-3551.


two slides to be critiqued (Gail will be gentle). It will be a great opportunity to see what makes a slide catch the judges' eyes, and learn how to improve your own slides.




### TRICKS OF THE TRADE



Use stencils cut from the plastic sheet from bacon packages (or any paper with a waxy surface) to lift out small areas of color or fix ragged edges. Cut a small shape with an exacto knife and use a soft damp toothbrush to lift out the paint. Stencil plastic can also be purchaseed from craft stores. Cut leaf or petal shapes to lift out exciting negatives. Use them again and again!

Jurying

A jurying process will take place on Thursday, April 6, 1995 at the Edina Community Center, Room 350. Check-in artwork between 6:00 - 6:45PM. PAINTINGS THAT DO NOT APPEAR ON THE JURY LIST WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. LATE ARRIVALS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. Paintings must be matted and protectively wrapped (i.e., shrink-wrapped), but do not need to be framed. Paintings must be labeled ON THE BACK with a JURY ID LABEL containing the title of artwork and the name and phone number of the artist. Jurying will take place during the regular meeting time. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PICKED UP AFTER THE MEETING. You will be notified by mail of your acceptance/decline status.

Image and Frame Size

Maximum image size: 22x30. Maximum frame size: 30x38. Works whose image size is larger than 15x22 and/or whose frame size is larger than 23x30 MUST BE UNDER PLEXIGLASS. Framed works should have wire

and hooks mounted about 1/3 down from the top with the wire span rising to about 2" down from the top.

Delivery of Accepted Artwork

Accepted paintings may be delivered to the Colonial Church of Edina, 6200 Colonial Way, Edina, MN, on Sunday, April 30, 1995 from 1:00 - 3:00PM. All work must be framed and ready to hang. Paintings must have an EXHIBITION ID LABEL affixed on the back lower right. ENTRIES IMPROPERLY FRAMED WILL BE REJECT-ED. Paintings cannot be removed during the show dates.

Sales

Sale of artwork from the Colonial Church will be handled by the artist. Sale of artwork from the J. Michael Gallery (see "Exhibition of Award Winning Paintings") will be handled by the gallery, which will take a 50% commission; prices should include commission. Paintings nor for sale should be labeled "NFS".

Insurance

All insurance for the TCWS Spring 1995 Juried Exhibition is the responsibility of the artist.

The Opening Reception and Awards Ceremony will be held on Friday, May 05, 1995 from 6:00 - 8:30PM. The critique and awards presentation will begin at 7:00 PM.

The Exhibition Committee will not be responsible for the safety of paintings that are not picked up during the designated time. 

## Library Do's and Don'ts

### from Lois Heim

TCWS has an inventory of 85 books and is growing as donations come in each month. The club has 6 videos. The procedure for taking books out of the library is as follows:

- 1. After selecting a book, take the card from the inside cover. Write your name, telephone number and date on it. Give it to the librarian.
- 2. When selecting a video, take the card from inside, write your name, telephone number and date. You must leave a check for \$50.00 as a deposit on the video. Your check will be held until the video is returned. If the video is not returned, TCWS will cash the check and use the money to replace the video.
- 3. You may keep a book or video for one month. If you are unable to return it at the next meeting or TCWS event, please ask a friend to do it for you. If that is impossible, please call the librarian so an arrangement can be made to return the item to the
- 4. When you return a book or video, be sure that the librarian puts the card back in the book. The check-in procedure is not complete until this has been done. DO NOT LEAVE BOOKS OR VIDEOS ON ANY TABLE OR CHAIRS! Leave them on the library table only.
- 5. Never take a book or video without leaving a card with the librarian.

When TCWS has an art opening or other event in lieu of a meeting, the librarian will accept all book and video returns at that event, but will not have items to check out.

TCWS has a very active library system and many books and videos are in constant demand. As the librarian. I have the complete library in my studio on Main Street, Hopkins, but I bring only what I can carry to the meetings. I will be happy to meet anyone anywhere in the Twin Cities area to help keep the books coming back and keep the rotation moving. A call to me, Lois Heim, 544-1322 (answering machine) will help you reserve a book or video, return one, or even ask for a library purchase to be made by the club. We need your help to keep books and videos flowing smoothly, and prevent costly losses to our inventory.

At the present time, the Board is debating a replacement policy to cover lost or damaged items. This will be included in the complete listing of books and videos, by category, which we will make available to our membership very soon.

Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any suggestions to improve our library system, please let me know.

### Gail's New Book

TCWS' Gail Speckmann will have her book, Wet-Into-Wet Watercolor, available for purchase at the May meeting. Published by Watson-Guptill, it costs \$28.50 including tax.

Here's a tip from the book:

"When painting thick or barely diluted paint onto saturated paper, I find it best to stroke these areas in once with intensity. These areas with the most concentrated paint can be unattractively disturbed by working over. Thick paint will hold its shape quite well, often forming a gentle, velvety edge," says Gail.
