Dear Compatriots:

One of the most inspiring and encouraging incidents in my entire campaign of four years for the Fort Snelling Memorial Chapel and Community Center was my visit at the meeting of the Duluth Memorial Day Committee, composed of members of your organizations, on Tuesday evening, March 29, 1927.

I have reported to Dr. Coventry concerning your splendid reception of my presentation of the Chapel project as well as your favorable action endorsing it. I also told him that some of the organizations have raised a magnificent quota already, and that these same organizations were looking forward to securing funds for special memorials. Outside of those organizations which have made arrangements for special memorials (The Legion Auxiliary and the Woman's Relief Corps) it is our hope that you may assist us in our Duluth campaign for funds.

You can do this in two ways: First, by securing pledges (or by making one united pledge) from your Post, Camp or Auxiliary; and Second, by volunteering the services of at least two wide-awake members who will attend the meeting of the General Committee to commence the campaign on April 8, 1927, at 12:15 o'clock (noon) at Hotel Duluth. This will be a luncheon meeting for workers on the campaign teams.

My dear Reverend Sir:

A committee of representative citizens has recently been organized to undertake the task of raising a fund in this city to supplement a fund of over Fifty Thousand Dollars which has already been subscribed by individuals, business firms, churches and patriotic organizations in the Twin Cities to construct a Memorial Chapel and Community Center building at Fort Snelling. The project has behind it not only the strong appeal of patriotism but also, and primarily, that of morality and of the religious impulse.

The Duluth Committee would appreciate whatever assistance you may be able to give to this project, both moral and practical, as a minister of religion. Public sentiment must be crystalized in this matter, and the conscience of some persons must be awakened and conviction aroused.

The question is, should the citizens of Minnesota permit these stalwart young American citizens who have volunteered their lives in service as a guarantee of the nation's safety to be left entirely without the ameliorating influence of religion? Are we keeping faith with them when we neglect to give them the values represented in the church and in religion - values for which they are asking?

It is therefore the request of the Duluth Committee that you give suitable publicity to this project either in your weekly bulletin, or from your pulpit on the first or second Sunday of April.

We are aware that the churches have their individual problems; and that they also have their budgets and regular enterprises to support. But this project is so unusual, so unique, and so compelling as a moral challenge and as a missionary opportunity that we feel justified in asking the support of all the churches. And, therefore, we are also requesting, if possible, that a special offering be taken for this cause on the second Sunday of April, or that each church make a pledge to the building fund. Information concerning the project is contained herewith.
