I was somewhat homesick ~~mm~~/California when I gave her the letter to take you, and I hope I may see it before the winter is over. I am, actually, writing from Minneapolis, but I leave in a couple of days for New York, where I shall be for some weeks -- or years -- or decades.

I've been out here for nine months, exploring my native state while I worked on a novel, which is just now finished, and will be published in about April. It's amazing how much more diversified and complex one's own native state is when he returns as an adult and looks it over. I found valleys and hill-ranges, industries and sections of history, in Minnesota that I never knew existed.

But my love for your gaudy and sun-colored California is undiminished -- and my love for Hedda and you.
