

New York May 19th 1807

my dear Cousin,

in my two long Letters which Judge Graham will deliver to you, I forgot to ask about your Brother, who lived with Dr. Nathaniel Mann at Hebron & then at Georgia. I want to know by you or your Brother, whether Dr. Mann left any Property at Georgia & who his Executor is, or Administrator if any he had. & whether I can ~~be~~ paid by him, for a Debt of above £200 Sterling, owing to me by Dr. Mann. & in what way or manner I must apply. I suppose your Brother would be a proper Person to act for me, but I know not his Address. pray help me in this concern, if you can — by the first opportunity — it will be good Policy in you to pay due attention to Judge Burr Graham, & if Judge Israel Smith becomes your Gov. you may become a Justice & then a Judge — in the meantime become a Representative to your Assembly —
