This Indenture made the Fifth day of August
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and sixteen Between Samuel Peters
of the City and State of New York L. L. D. of the
first part and John Polhemus McClarr of
Easton, Wilkes County, Georgia, of the
second part - Whereas Hawn Nagatie
and Ochtingoomlishkaw, two of the Chiefs
of the Nantowisic Indians, did by their
certain deed, under their respective hands
and signatures and seals, give, grant, and
convey to one Jonathan Carver a certain
territory or tract of land, which said deed
to the said Jonathan Carver is in the
word and figures following to wit:

may the first one thousand seven hundred
and sixty seven

Hawn Nagatie

Ochtingoomlishkaw 

mark

And whereas the said Jonathan Carver
departed this life, on or about the 30th
day of July 1780 at the city of London England
leaving two sons & five daughters
joint heirs of the aforesaid tract -
and whereas the aforesaid heirs of
Jonathan Carver did, in and from
of law, give - bargain sell &c the
said tract of land to said Samuel Peters
his heirs &c - by date 1808 - and
now in the hands of Samuel Harrison by
of Chittenden or reference being
thereunto had, will more fully and
at large appear - Now therefore this

Indenture represents that the said party
of the ~~second~~ ^{first} part (~~free~~), for and
in consideration of 22040.00, hath granted
sold &c &c unto the said McClarr

23000 acres in the territory granted
to Carver & by his heirs to Peters —
(He has the right to choose any land not
occupied or improved — and in ^{as} many
sections as he chooses —
