I BELIEVE THAT MINNESOTA CAN PROVIDE A QUALITY EDUCATION FOR ALL OF ITS CHILDREN. PROFESSIONAL TEACHERS SHOULD NOT BE THE WHIPPING POSTS FOR POLITICIANS AND BUREAUCRATS.

THAT DOESN'T MAKE SENSE. NO AMOUNT OF GIMMICKS WILL ASSIST THE TEACHER. VERY SIMPLY, TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF OUR EDUCATION, WE MUST REDUCE CLASSROOM SIZE.

## DOUG KELLEY... on Abortion

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Abortion is a difficult and divisive issue. While the next governor must offer leadership in the public debate on abortion, he must approach the issue responsibly, with a moderate voice, tolerant of the views of those who disagree with his position. During the debate, and once the issue has been decided, the governor must act to bring people together and to build a consensus of support for our public policy.

Abortion became an issue in this gubernatorial election when the U.S. Supreme Court stated in its Webster decision that the U.S. Constitution permitted state legislatures to impose some restrictions on abortions. No longer can politicians posture on the issue without regard to the consequences of their actions. It is an issue of immediacy to voters, both men and women.

True leaders confront the tough issues head-on. This statement describes how I would act on the issue as governor of the state of Minnesota.

I would work to reduce abortions in Minnesota with policies to avoid unwanted pregnancies. I strongly favor a comprehensive family planning program, including counseling and health care. Family planning must be realistic and understandable to be effective. I would also work with communities hardest hit by teenage pregnancies to mobilize grassroots solutions to the problem.

We must also make available to vulnerable women information necessary to make the decision on whether to carry their pregnancies to term. The information must be provided objectively, and we must impress upon young women that this is an important decision that will have an impact on the rest of their lives. We must also ensure that adoption is a real alternative for expectant mothers.

Our obligation to an expectant mother does not end with providing information and alternatives. It must also include a commitment to help disadvantaged mothers during their pregnancies and in the early years of raising their children.

While these policies will help ensure a considered decision, we are still left with the question of when abortions should be allowed. My private belief is that I am opposed to abortions except to save the life of the mother and in cases of rape and incest.



People arrive at their decisions about abortion on the basis of deeply held, strongly felt convictions. I recognize that many Minnesotans disagree with my private beliefs. I respect their views. I hope they respect mine.

The governor has a duty to represent all state citizens and to help formulate the best possible public policy. In doing so, I believe that I must separate my private views from those that I would employ as governor. Unduly restrictive abortion laws would tear at our social fabric. Public policy is not served well by enacting laws that will be met with widespread violations by those with strong and sincerely held beliefs. I have spent many years of my life enforcing the law as a federal prosecutor and I know how untenable such a situation would be.

I agree with the observation of Charles Kelbley in the December 16, 1985 Newsweek that "If Lincoln were alive today I can imagine him saying simply and directly that when there are grave doubts about the morality of a position; when philosophers, theologians and scientists cannot agree, then it should be resolved in favor of freedom, not in favor of prohibition."

Thus, I believe the laws of the state of Minnesota should allow a period of decision up to the time of viability in which a woman would have the right to choose an abortion without government intervention. However, by the time a fetus has reached viability, abortions should be allowed only when the life of the mother is threatened or in the case of a life-threatening fetal defect.

I would favor government funding for abortions for poor women to save the life of the mother and in cases of rape and incest.

Finally, in my administration, competence and integrity would be the only criteria for the selection of judges and other state officials.

St. Paul, Minn.--The three Twin Cities panels of the 1990 Minnesota Gubernatorial Citizens Jury, meeting in St. Paul, today announced their ratings of five candidates for governor on the issues covered in public hearings this week.

Here are the 12-member panels' ratings of the candidates on the issues. Scores are ranked 1 to 10, with 10 as the highest.

## Citizens Jury -2

Jon Grunseth and Doug Kelley; and Democrats Mike Hatch and Gov. Rudy Perpich. The Citizens Jury does not endorse candidates for public office.

The Citizens Jury is co-sponsored by the Minneapolis-based Jefferson Center and the League of Women Voters of Minnesota. The panel's members were selected from a randomly drawn pool of eligible voters to be representative of Minnesotans in terms of party identification, age, gender, race and locale.

Panels have already met in Rochester and Duluth. The three Twin Cities panels consist of core metro centered on Minneapolis and St. Paul proper; east metro, centered on St. Paul suburbs; and west metro, centered on Minneapolis suburbs. The sixth and final primary election panel will convene in St. Cloud on Tuesday, Sept. 4.

The Twin Cities panels adopted final policy statements in eight topic areas, including capability to govern, economic development, health care, human services, leadership, revenue management, youth health and development, and two statements on education.

Here are the panels' issue statements and commentary on candidate ratings.

Youth Health and Development

The most important part of drug fighting is prevention, including early family childhood education, Head Start, and comprehensive drug education programs, kindergarten-12. The governor should understand the complexity of education issues and be able to deal with that complexity in a comprehensive way. The governor should be brave enough to take on innovative approaches to education. Schools and teachers are limited in what they can do so there is a need for a health community for young people, including such things as after-school community education stressing self-esteem, family education and also better ways of making people aware of what is already available. Day care should be available to all who cannot afford it, as public education is. Basic health care should be available to all Minnesotans with an emphasis on preventive care (without increasing health care costs; for instance, by capping the cost of malpractice and by investigating ways to make delivery of health care services more cost effective). The governor should be more creative in funding needed programs without increasing taxes. The governor should be held accountable for budgeting and be held responsible for spending.

All the candidates put a priority on education. All the candidates recognized the need for affordable primary health care for all Minnesotans. Kelley ranked first because of -his high priorities on early childhood development, women and infants -innovative approach to education -willingness to dedicate a substantial portion of his time to these issues -informing the public on the educational system. Carlson finished high because of his emphasis on preventative measures. His concerns spanned all issues from education through youth issues through health care. We recognize Perpich's past achievements and his dedication to education.

Leadership

Core Metro

The gubernatorial candidate should make clear his past track record including: - specific accomplishments  
- what kinds of risks he has been willing to take

Appointments to office should be based on merit. The candidate should make clear what process he will use to make appointments.

The candidate should make clear how his priorities will be reflected in the budget and how he would mobilize public support for this.

The candidate should make clear, if he were faced with a budget deficit whether he would raise taxes or cut spending to balance the budget.

The candidate should make clear how he would translate his visions into concrete action.

The candidate should make clear how he will provide leadership in changing campaign funding and should name some specific changes he will make.

We want someone who is a leader not only with the public but also within his administration and with the legislature.

All candidates showed leadership ability, but their styles differed. What we liked about Carlson in the area of leadership was: -his experience and background in politics. -his approach to appointments. -good management style. -ability to motivate others to carry out initiatives. -his honesty and straightforwardness with the public and -he gave us a clear statement of his position on ethical issues. What we liked about Kelley was -his charismatic and engaging style - his background and experience in various leadership roles - his presentation to us was well organized, precise and yet delivered in a personal way. -his expression of innovative ideas.

Economic Development

Core Metro

The Governor needs to understand the world economy and Minnesota's role in it.

The Governor needs to help create an environment where the private sector can take the lead in state economic development.

Quality education is cornerstone in Minnesota economy and the Governor should take a leadership role to strongly improve education in Minnesota, including leadership in performance criteria and teacher empowerment and choice for consumers, retraining programs, and defining the research mission of the U of M?

The Governor needs to improve the tax structure for both business and individuals.

Transportation systems are at the center of state infrastructure and support economic activity. The Governor should lead effort to reallocate transportation funds to more efficiently and effectively support economic activity.

The Governor needs to protect the environment in developing new businesses.

The Governor needs to be an advocate for effective use of human resources - training, etc. of refugees, dislocated workers, and single mothers, etc.

The Governor, in times of crisis, should take a firm stand on an economy that would benefit all - business sector and public at large.

What we liked about Carlson in the economic development area was: -he is fiscally competent; he will do a good job of managing the state's finances. -he is willing to set financial priorities. What we liked about Perpich was: he recognizes Minnesota's role in a global economy. - he has a good record in this area since 1983.



Education

East Metro

The Governor should provide personal leadership in directing the role of education.

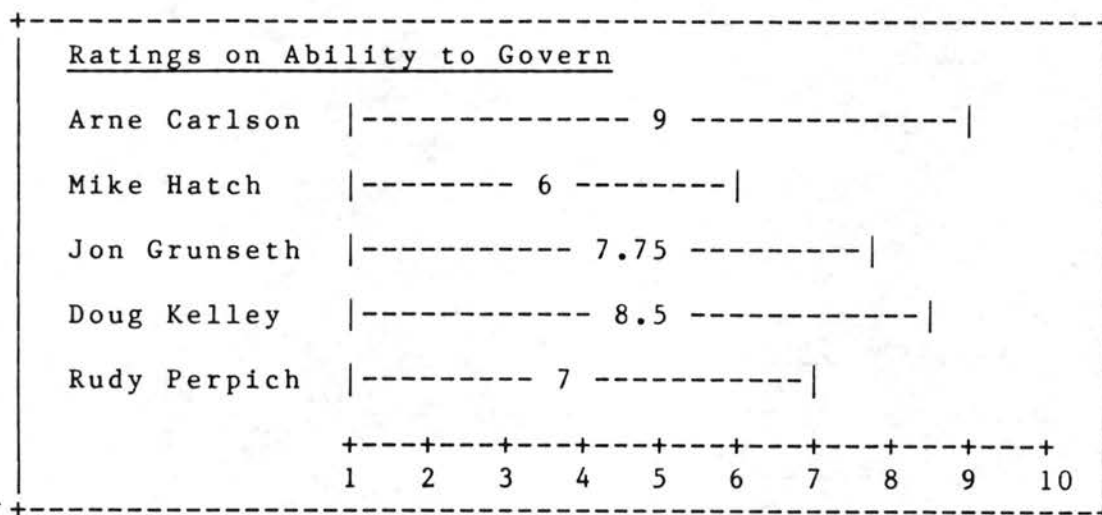

We rated Mr. Carlson high on revenue management because he was more direct on issues such as workers compensation reform and he favors long-term financial planning. He was strongly realistic and conservative with regard to future revenues and cost of programs. We support his conviction in rejecting all spending bills until the legislature approves the budget.

## Health Care

We rated Grunseth highest on health care because he was strong on cost containment and had a strong conviction to provide affordable health care for all Minnesotans. We rated Kelley a close second in health care because he addressed cutting excess mandates. He proposed providing cost and quality information to individuals to enable them to knowledgeably select health care providers.

After having reviewed the candidates' television commercials during the week, the panels offered these observations:

East Metro: "Campaign dollars could be better spent distributing position papers to the voting public. Candidates should organize more of their own town meetings to bring voters together on issues. The media could be much more responsive to covering issues."

West Metro: "We pity the public who would vote solely on the basis of commercials. The only purpose they serve is name recognition. We feel this group of commercials had a positive tone."

Core Metro: "In general, political commercials lacked substance. They are a total waste of the public's time. Negative ads are counterproductive."

Virginia Sweeny, director of the Citizens Jury project, commended the work of the panels. "We hope voters will find the Citizens Jury reports helpful in cutting through the clutter of 30-second commercials," said Sweeny. "Minnesotans have long had the best record of voter participation in the nation. Our aim is to help voters also become the best informed."

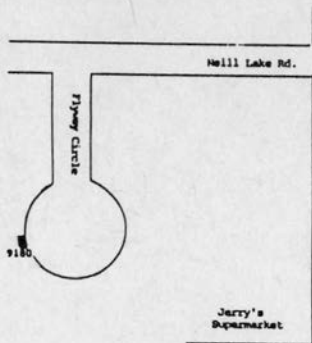

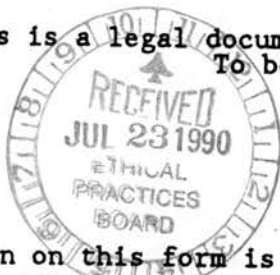

### ANSWERS TO MEA SCREENING QUESTIONS

1) Although state spending on education has steadily increased over the years, the budget for education as a percentage of the overall state budget has declined. This is wrong. In addition, the state share of funding for schools has gone down while the local share has increased.

A strong investment in education will pay greater dividends than any other investment we can make. Our goal should be to not only substantially increase the overall percentage of the state budget allocated to education but also to increase the state's share to local districts.

2) As a professional, the teacher should be given a fair opportunity to respond to criticism from parents, students, and administrators. Disciplinary proceedings brought against a teacher ought to be conducted by a fair and impartial hearing officer. The current system, which permits the school board to appoint its own hearing officer, has been criticized in several cases as having the appearance of impropriety. Such proceedings should be provided by hearing officers appointed by an impartial agency, such as the Office of State Administrative Law Judges. Unless the school board can demonstrate a clear error in the hearing officer's findings, it should follow his or her recommendations.

3) The teacher is a professional and should be recognized by society as such. And that means empowering the teacher to have more input in decisions regarding the learning environment, in such areas as class size and curriculum. PELRA ought to be amended to permit such input by the professional.



4) The Hatch Administration supports, within budget constraints, changing the base of retirement benefits from the high five years to the high three years.

5) A top priority in the Hatch Administration is to provide an adequate, reliable and fair system of funding schools to provide a high quality education. Minnesotans will make such a commitment if we can demonstrate that the system is efficiently structured. We support financial incentives which will encourage districts to restructure where such restructuring will result in a higher quality system. The financial incentives should address concerns of students, staff and the community concerning job protection, transportation, salaries, early retirement incentives and severance payments.

6) The current disparity in preparation time between secondary teachers and primary teachers is inappropriate. The Hatch plan will require that there be parity of preparation time. Mike's wife, Patti Hatch, an elementary teacher of almost twenty years, will personally lobby on this proposal!

7) The Hatch administration supports public education. Attempts to increase assistance to private schools run counter to the state's constitutional charge to provide a quality public system.

8) The Hatch plan also recognizes that local control is one of the great strengths of our educational system and that school boards offer duly elected public officials who are able to make their own decisions as to how much revenue can be raised within the school district. Restriction by the state on such local funding is presumptuous and ought to be curtailed. The fact that other districts have low property values ought not restrict their ability to raise additional revenue.

The percentage of the state budget allocated to education has decreased. We should give education a higher budget priority, and fund the general education formula in a way that compensates the poorer but efficiently structured districts.



9) There must be a more coordinated approach to governance of the post-secondary system in Minnesota. Such coordination should be achieved in a voluntary manner. If necessary, however, the state should move forward to restructure the system on a statewide basis.

10) The Hatch administration supports continued funding.

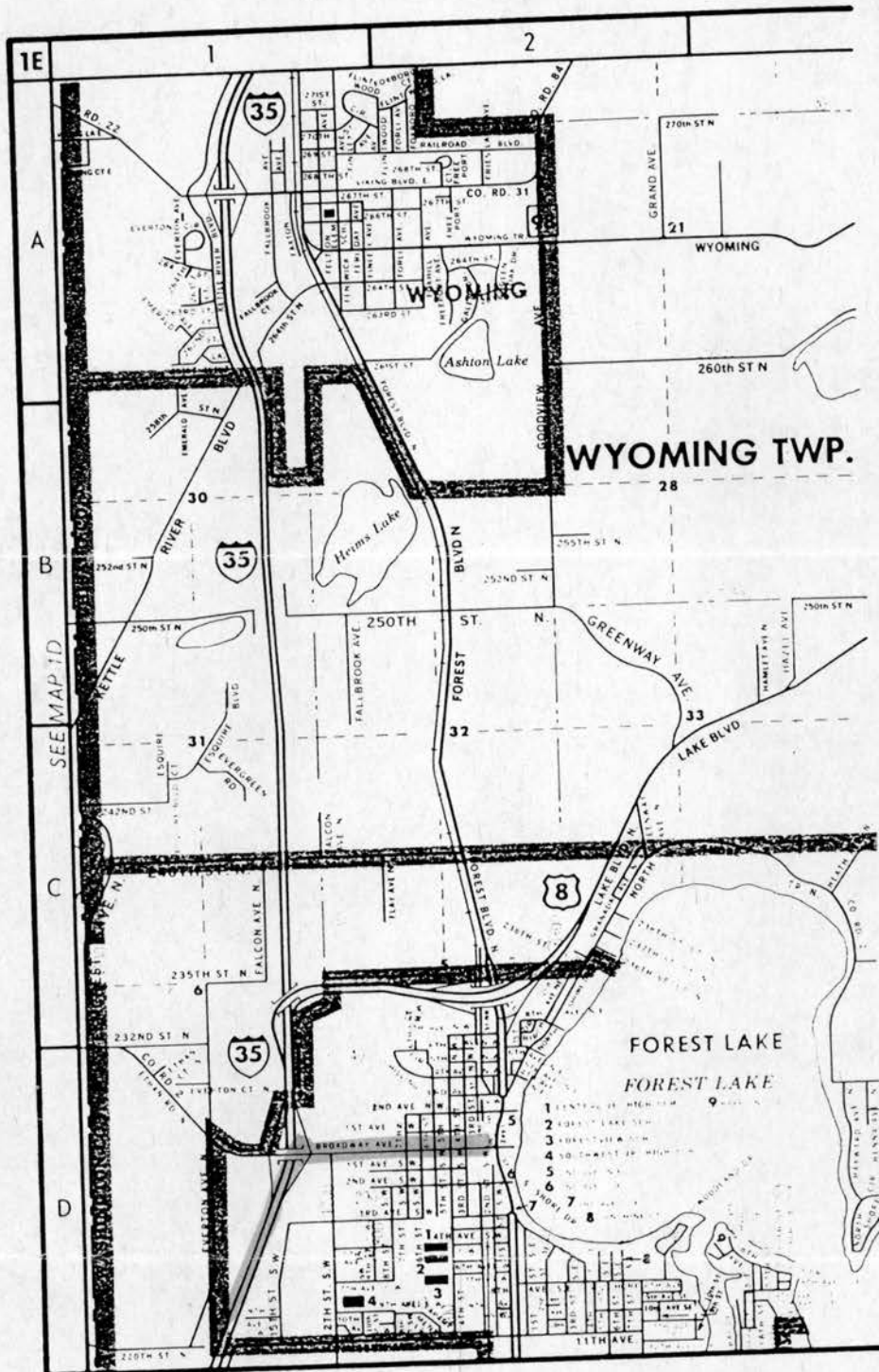


Dear John:

I CONGRATULATE RUDY PERPICH ON CELEBRATE MINNESOTA. I WON'T BE AS DAZZLING. BUT I PROMISE YOU THIS. I WILL BE AN UNFLINCHING TRUSTEE OF OUR WOODS, WATERS AND SKIES. I WILL NOT LET ANY COMPANY...I DON'T CARE HOW BIG...ABUSE THEM.

MANY MINNESOTANS TALKED TO ME ABOUT EDUCATION. THEY SAY WE DO NOT SUPPORT OUR TEACHERS...THAT OUR CLASS SIZES ARE TOO LARGE...AND THAT OUR SCHOOLS ARE FLUNKING IN MATH AND SCIENCE. I CONGRATULATE GOVERNOR PERPICH ON OPEN ENROLLMENT, THE SCHOOL OF THE ARTS, AND POST SECONDARY OPTIONS. I WON'T BE AS GOOD AT SHOW-AND-TELL. BUT I PROMISE YOU THIS. I WILL NOT DIVERT ATTENTION FROM THE FACT THAT WE OWE EVERY YOUNG MINNESOTAN A

QUALITY EDUCATION...AND THE FUNDS TO MAKE SURE THEY GET IT. OUR TEACHERS ARE PROFESSIONALS WHO DESERVE OUR RESPECT AND SUPPORT AS BUILDERS OF AMERICA'S FUTURE. NO AMOUNT OF EDUCATIONAL GIMMICKS WILL TAKE THE PLACE OF ONE DEDICATED TEACHER.

SCORES OF MINNESOTANS TOLD ME ABOUT TAXATION. THEY DON'T LIKE PROPERTY TAXES. YOU MIGHT SAY IT HURTS THEM WHERE THEY LIVE. WELL, I'M AN OLD FASHIONED, UNRECONSTRUCTED DFLer. I BELIEVE IN PROGRESSIVE TAXATION. I ALSO BELIEVE THAT IF WE LOWER INCOME TAX BRACKETS AND INCREASE SPENDING...SOME OTHER TAX WILL GO UP...PROBABLY A REGRESSIVE ONE LIKE PROPERTY TAXES. I CONGRATULATE GOVERNOR PERPICH ON THE MINNESOTA CORPORATION. I WON'T BE AS GRADIOSE. BUT I PROMISE YOU THIS. I WILL VIGOROUSLY OPPOSE ANY EFFORTS TO LAY MORE OF A TAX BURDEN ON THE BACKS OF THOSE WHO CAN LEAST AFFORD IT.

MANY MINNESOTANS TOLD ME THEY WANT OUR STATE TO REGAIN ITS STATURE AS A CHAMPION OF INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS. FOR EXAMPLE, THE FASTEST GROWING TYPE OF CRIME IN AMERICAN SOCIETY TODAY IS HATE CRIME. WELL, I PROMISE YOU THIS. I'LL DO EVERYTHING IN MY POWER AS GOVERNOR TO STOP THE HATEMONGERS...AND I'LL WORK HARD FOR OPPORTUNITY FOR PEOPLE OF COLOR AND FOR EQUAL OPPORTUNITY FOR ALL...REGARDLESS OF RACE, RELIGION, GENDER OR SEXUAL ORIENTATION.

MOST MINNESOTANS TOLD ME THEY WANT A RIGHT TO PRIVACY. WE DEMOCRATS ARE AND HAVE ALWAYS BEEN A PARTY OF DIVERSITY. I RESPECT THE BELIEFS OF THOSE OF YOU WHO DISAGREE WITH ME ON THIS

ISSUE...AND SO SHOULD WE ALL. I CERTAINLY RESPECT YOU MORE THAN POLITICIANS WHOSE POSITION TWIRLS LIKE A WEATHER VANE...WHICHEVER WAY THE WIND BLOWS. MY POSITION REMAINS THE SAME AS IT HAS BEEN THROUGHOUT MY PUBLIC CAREER. IT IS VIRTUALLY CERTAIN A BILL RESTRICTING THE PRIVACY RIGHTS OF WOMEN UNDER ROE VS. WADE WILL PASS THE LEGISLATURE. MINNESOTANS ALSO TOLD ME THEY ARE TIRED OF THE POLITICS PLAYED WITH WORKERS' COMPENSATION. ENOUGH IS ENOUGH. I PROMISE YOU I WILL WORK TO RESTORE THE RATE REGULATION THAT EXISTED IN 1982...AND NOT ONE BENEFIT WILL BE COMPROMISED UNTIL THAT IS DONE.

THROUGHOUT THE STATE, MINNESOTANS TOLD ME THEY WANT US TO KEEP FAITH WITH OUR FAMILY FARMERS. THE PRESSURES THEY FACE...IN TERMS OF THEIR FARMS, HOSPITALS, CLINICS, SCHOOLS, HIGHWAYS AND BRIDGES CAN NO LONGER BE IGNORED. I PROMISE THEY WON'T.

AND COUNTLESS NUMBERS OF YOU HAVE TOLD ME THE DFL NEEDS A NEW GOVERNOR AS ITS TITULAR LEADER. TO RESTORE THIS PARTY AND HELP IT GROW. TO FUND OUR CANDIDATES AND BE A BRIDGE BETWEEN ELECTED OFFICIALS AND THE PARTY.

Horse units will need to load and unload in the Mill Creek Park. Please keep the horses off the softball fields.

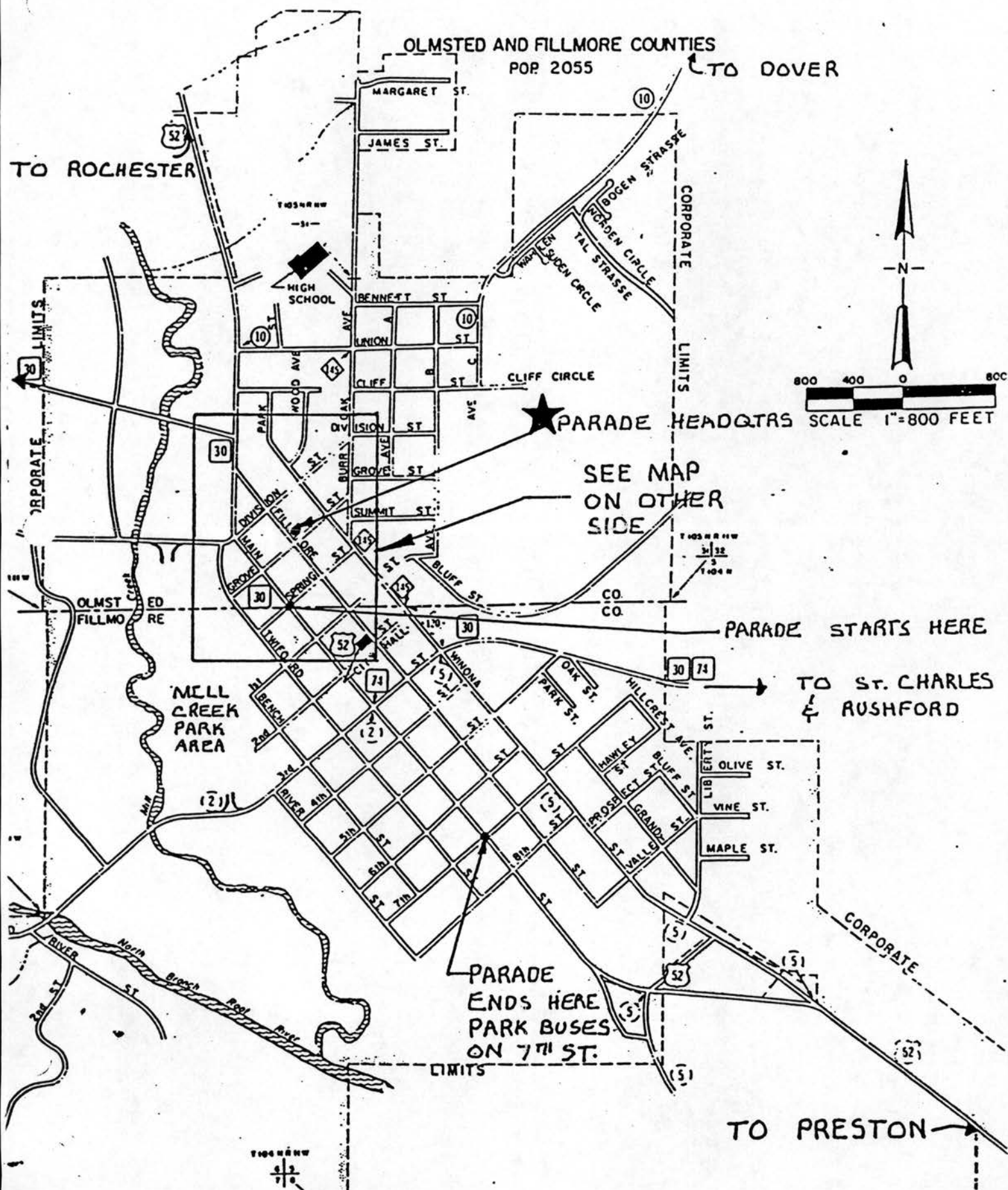

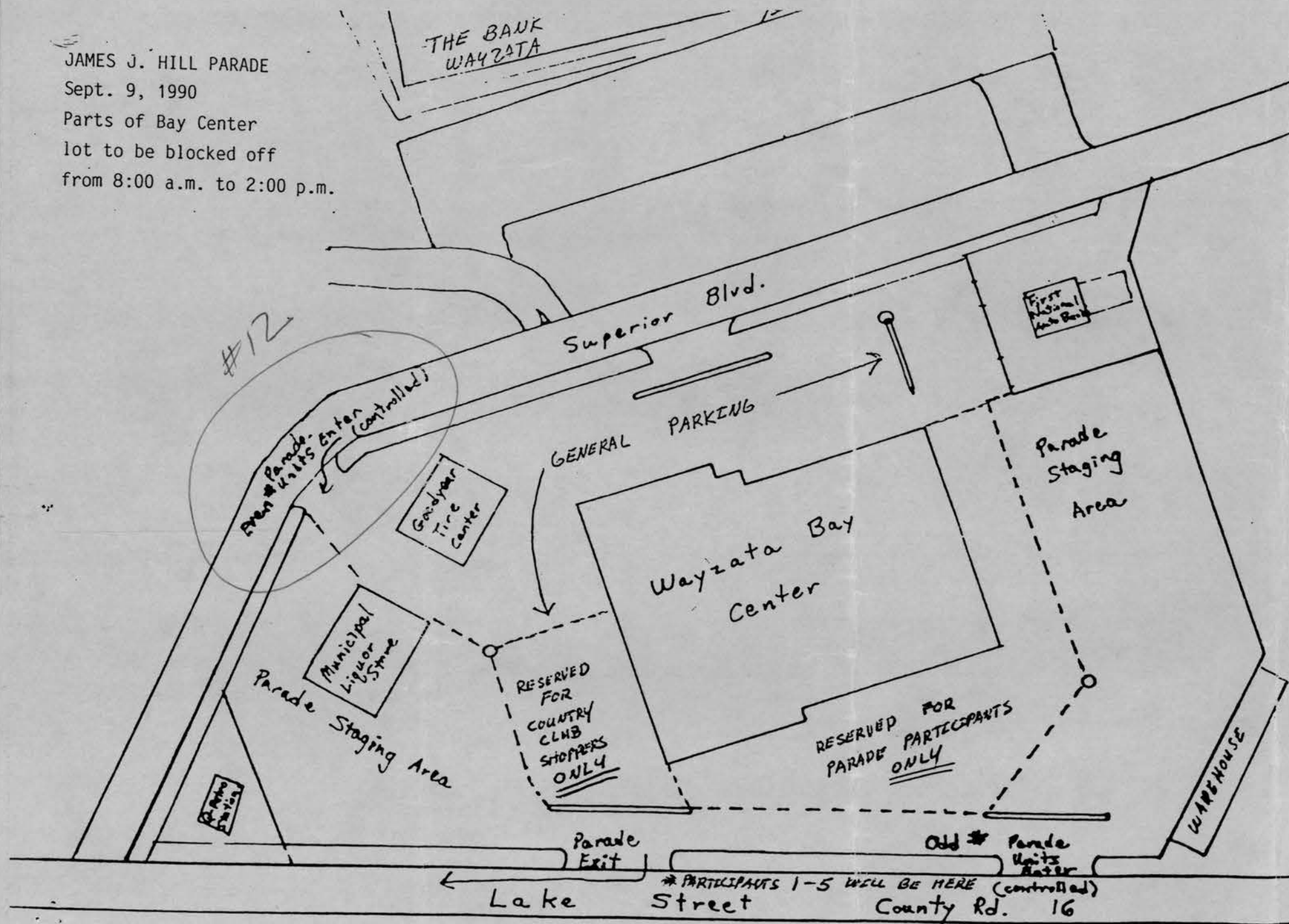

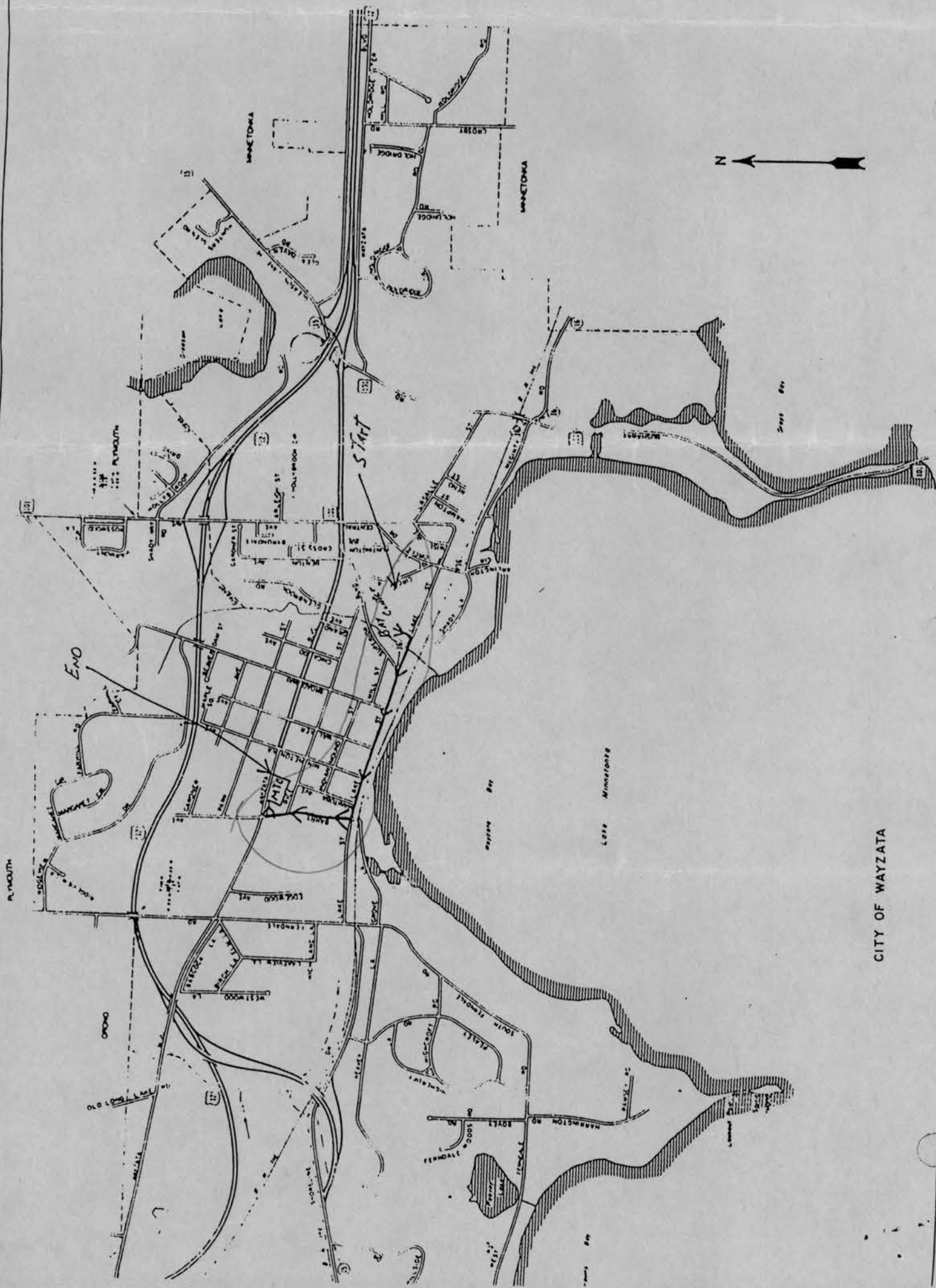
