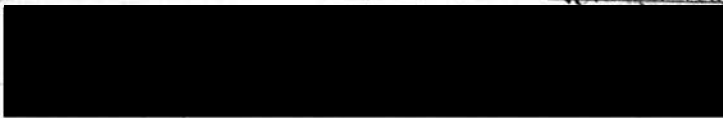

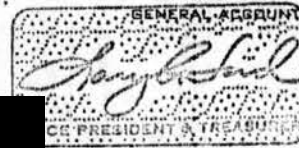

With the Fourth of July fast approaching, Emily Anne Staples, Hennepin County Bicentennial Planning Commission Chairperson, wants everyone to get into the celebration.

"The Bicentennial means grass roots people involvement," began Emily. "A community festival like the Robbinsdale Whiz Bang Days is the heart of this kind of participation. It makes people want to renew and rededicate."

Appointed chairperson in 1975, Emily Anne has been instrumental in promoting public relations and canvassing funds for the various Hennepin County Projects. A twenty-year Plymouth resident, Emily will present the official Bicentennial flag to neighboring Robbinsdale this July Fourth weekend in recognition of its new status as an American Revolution Bicentennial City.

"But it's the ^{long-range} programs that are most significant," continued Staples, DFL-endorsed Senate Candidate for District 43. She and her 15-member commission, all appointed by Hennepin County Commissioners, have spent the last four years selecting and implementing appropriate projects for Hennepin County. Most will extend far beyond the Fourth.

Indeed, on July 15, 1976, the Commission and the Hennepin County Historical Society will present the first comprehensive history ever written on Hennepin County and its 47 municipalities. Authored by G. Rolf Svendsen of South Minneapolis, the 64-page illustrated volume was funded by General Mills. It highlights both the history and natural beauty of the area.

"The Commission has ^{also} tried to include all types of recreational and artistic activities," continued Emily. Many hiking, biking, and canoeing trails have already been identified, including a "200"-mile biking route encircling the county.

Theatre, too, has been an important means of expressing the spirit of '76. The Commission is sponsoring "Theatre in a Trunk," where the talents of area high school students are used to bring history alive for Hennepin County youngsters. Co-sponsored by the Hennepin County Library System, the group has already started performing in area parks, libraries, and backyards. Similarly, the Alive and Trucking Theatre Company was commissioned to perform a festival of drama, song, and dance, creatively highlighting historical milestones in Hennepin County and Minnesota.

The contributions of Black Americans are also being recognized. A permanent exhibit has been constructed at the Afro-American Cultural Arts Center in Southdale to provide a cultural perspective of Black history. And on the Northside, the Metropolitan Cultural Arts Center is sponsoring a long-range Black music program. Workshops and learning techniques will be derived from the Black music experience to stimulate individual creativity for elementary level students and teachers.

Emily has been pleased with the reaction to these projects. "I hope some of these projects will have a lasting impact," she began. "People seem concerned about preserving the best part of our past and translating it into the future."

To date, the Commission has concentrated on projects in the Heritage phase (past) and Festival phase (present) of the Bicentennial Program. However, many conferences on Minnesota's future have been instigated, including one in New Hope in 1975. Emily hopes to see more of this.

"I am most interested in future planning. If we don't explore these possibilities, we are missing an opportunity to examine our strengths and

weaknesses and develop ~~develop~~ a comprehensive program around them.✕

"The problem is, the expense of most future-oriented projects is far out of reach," added Staples.

The Hennepin County Bicentennial Comission also serves as a resource center for all local bicentennial commissions and festivals. "The public is welcome to stop in for information and assistance," concluded Staples.

"Just come to the ground floor of the Hennepin County Government Center or call 372-1776."
