TUESDAY, JANUARY 1, 1867.

New Year's day is this year a raw cold, unpleasant, disagreeable day. I am camped with my Co. (65th U.S.C.) in Baton Rouge, La., out in tents. Busily engaged on musterout rolls. Mr. Camp, Sutter, brought Lt. Vincent & a variety of shells from New Orleans. Visited Mrs. Hendricks & family.

WEDNESDAY 2

Cold, cloudy. Still busy on rolls. Fresh Tuesday the 8th fixed on for our muster out. Recd a letter & handkerchiefs from Miss. P. & presents. Wrote her a letter in reply.

THURSDAY 3

Cloudy. Three inches of snow fell last night the first snow here for many years. The officers of the 65th U.S.C. give a great party to night at Mr. Otter. Saw Pvt. W. Johnson in Jail.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 4, 1867.

Clear, mild & getting warm.
Finished the body of my rolls
with St. Vincent's assistance,

SATURDAY 5

Clear, warm fair day
St. Vincent and I got several
negatives taken for Photographs
at Mr. Lytles.

Got Whiskers colored & shaved.
Figured up clothing accounts of
mine & entered them on Clothing Book
and on Rolls.

SUNDAY 6

Clear, warm, beautiful day.
Still busy on M. O. Rolls.
Made out discharges for Co.
Had our last Dress Parade
and a good one too.

MONDAY, JANUARY 7, 1867.

Clear, pleasant day.
Closed up all the Company Books
and finished up the Rolls,
ruled them &c.

Printed my own discharge
also those of St. Vincent, Hutcheson
& Capt. Seaming. Called on Mrs. Kendrick.

TUESDAY 8

Clear, nice day.
Co. I, was mustered out of the service
of the U.S. by St. Meadey U.S.A. at 10 A.M.
Dined at Leonard's by invitation with
May, Frost & St. Vincent & Butler.
Paid \$17. to get W. Johnson out of City Jail
Busy packing up my effects. &c.
Rec'd a letter from Miss O' answered it.

WEDNESDAY 9

Our last day in the "old camp grounds"
Sold my lumber &c for \$8. Got 70 photographs
at Lytle's most for presentation to my Co.
Left Baton Rouge on the St. Julia at 2 P.M.
A salute was fired at our Reg. by the colors
at the Arsenal. Bought 50 oranges \$4.00.

Clear, cool. Relieved by Capt Darnell
as officer of the day. Put my 1st Serg
and a Corp^s ^{cash in hand} ~~under guard~~
in arrest for drunkenness & dis. orders.
Mrs. Kelley, Palmer & Camp go with us, and
Mrs. Hendrick & family go with us to
Memphis, their fare paid by the officers.
Got the Autographs & addresses of all
the officers of the Regt. put down in my
Scrapbook. Passed Natchez at 11 a.m.

FRIDAY 11

Weather warm and pleasant.
Lefticksburg at 4 a.m., & Mulliken's
Land at daylight. Busy writing all
forenoon. Made out my returns of ord.
& C.C. & E. Miss. Fannie H. played
to night for my especial benefit.
Had a real pleasant time.

SATURDAY 12

Quite warm. Passed Napoleon
at daylight. Tailing this forenoon
through floating ice. Spent most of
the day in the ladies Cabin. Played
a few games of Authors. Had some good
piano music, also a little dance.

SUNDAY, JANUARY 13, 1867.

Beautiful clear and mild.
Was most of the forenoon on the hurricane
deck with Mrs. H. & J.D. Arrived at
Memphis 4 P.M. where we left Mrs. H.
& family with their friends. Raised for them
by the off. \$125. Strolled through the city
with Mr. Butler & Vincent. Left at 5 P.M.

MONDAY 14

Rather chilly day. Met the
Mississippi at 9 a.m. and had to lighten
her and help her over a bar at
Plymouth Point. Detained four hours.
Relieved the guard over my 1st Serg^t.
Floating ice quite heavy.

TUESDAY 15

Cloudy and quite cold.
Arrived at Cairo at 2 P.M. and
disembarked. Have to wait for
a train until 7 P.M. when we left
on the Ill. C.R.R. on a train of 23 cars.
^{Relieved Craig & Cotton}
Weather very cold.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 16, 1867.

Clear and very cold,
Arrived at Sandoval Ills. at
9 A.M. and left at 11 on the Ohio
& Miss R.R. for St. Louis, where we
arrived after dark, crossing the
River the Regt. marched to music through
St. Louis, to the depot of Iron Mt. R.R.
went on that Road to Jefferson Barrack
getting into cold barracks late in the night.

THURSDAY 17

A bitter cold day to us.
Rode up to St. Louis. Had 48 ferristipes
taken. Attended to some other business
& returned at 4 P.M. to Jeff. Bk's
got up all my Co. Baggage from the depot.
On duty last time as Officer of the Day.
Had all guns not wanted by the regiment
burned in and taken to pieces.

FRIDAY 18

Clear and quite cold,
Rode up to St. Louis at 12 noon
and remained in the city all night.
Had signed and witnessed the
last pay rolls of my Co. got gold
pens fixed &c. &c. Wrote home to Miss P.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 19, 1867.

Cloudy, knowing lightly
all day. Made arrangements
for my Co. purchasing clothing.
Invoiced my remaining Ordnance
yesterday to Lt. Beuttel and received
his receipts today. Returned to Jeff.
Spoke at 4 P.M. Lt. Hutchins lost \$500.
Saw Dr. Cray & Dr. Gray, Meth. Book Co.

SUNDAY 20

Cloudy, dull day,
Considerable snow on the ground.
Remained in Barracks all day in command
of the Regt. Put a Serg't in the guard
house for disobedience of orders.
Distributed my pictures to my Co.
and talked to them. Pol. Geo. Williams
presents me with a fine painting of himself &c.

MONDAY 21

Clear but quite cold.
I remained alone with the Regt.
all day, but went up to St. Louis after
dark, and stopped at the Everett
House thence to the Varieties Theatre.
Saw "Lovely man of the Ocean".

Clear

TUESDAY, JANUARY 22, 1867.

Had negative taken again.
Returned to Barracks, where my
C was paid off, at 12 M. Went to
St Louis at 4 P.M. taking my Co.
with me to a clothing store, where
I saw them supplied with clothing
and bid them all farewell.
Went to Minstrel's Opera.

WEDNESDAY 23

Cloudy, snow melting.
Got watch, brought chain \$40.
Had my Pay accounts made out &
rec'd 4 mos & 1 day pay, &c &c, \$1082.
Paid tax of 43. Paid Dr. to one \$100.
Bought album, books, got a suit of clothes.
Left St Louis for Chicago at 4 P.M.
with a number of officers.

THURSDAY 24

A nice day, arrived at Chicago
at 5 A.M. where the officers parted.
Paid \$20. to Beck Hale for mother of Mrs.
J. Roberts. Left at 9 am. for
Cumbria Wyo. where I arrived
at 7 P.M. & found my friends well.

FRIDAY, JANUARY 25, 1867.

Cloudy. Weather changed
to be quite stormy, and
a heavy snow fell.
Remained in doors all day,
except while bringing my
trunks up from the depot.

SATURDAY 26

Cloudy and very cold.
Bought Fur cap, collar
& gloves, at Mrs Jones.
Cypriotes \$8, Collar \$8, Gloves \$12.
After two hours.
Completed and forwarded my
ordnance. Returning part of 1.25/7
also Paymaster's Receipt for money
of deceased soldiers.

SUNDAY 27

Still cold.
Attended Presbyterian Church.
Mrs. Kelley preached.
Time passes very pleasantly.

MONDAY, JANUARY 28, 1867

Weather clear but cold.
Strolled about town a little
but remained most of the
time at Mr. Purnell's.

TUESDAY 29

Clear, calm, and cold.
Rode out a few miles with
Miss Purnell and had a pleasant
time in the evening.
Received 3 large photographs
from St. Louis of myself.

WEDNESDAY 30

Cloudy, milder, a little snow.
Got my discharge & two of my large
pictures framed and presented me
to Mrs. Purnell. Packing trunks
preparatory to leaving. Entreated
to remain a few days more.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 31, 1867.

Cloudy, nice, mild day.
Sent my two chests to La Crosse
as freight. Met some Ingleside
friends and attended their
Lodge in the evening.

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 1.

Clear, delightful day.
Went in company with Mr. & Mrs.
Purnell & Sarah & Lizzie on a
Hagride to Portage City, 20 miles
visited Mr. P. Brooker, Mrs. Chancellor
&c, and returned at 7.20 P M.
I drove the team & feel tired.

SATURDAY 2

Another clear, nice day.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 3, 1867.

Clear delightful day.
Attended Presb. Church
in town in the forenoon
and after noon Mrs. Burn
sang. Church rode out
to the meeting on the Prairie
6 miles. Rev. Mr. Kelley preached.

MONDAY 4

Mild. A slight snow
is falling all day.
Preparing to leave tonight
for home.
Left at 7 P.M. having
enjoyed a delightful
week of 10 days.

TUESDAY 5

Remained in Portage City
until 3 a.m. when I left
for La Crosse where I arrived
at 10 a.m. Left by stage for
Winona arriving at 3 P.M.
attended Lodge of Masons.

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 6, 1867.

Left Winona at 8.30 a.m.
arrived at Faribault 2.30
met Mrs. Norden, Sergt. B
old Co. K, & spent a pleasant
evening with him.
Faribault is a very fine
thriving town.

THURSDAY 7

Left Faribault at 8.30 a.m.
and arrived safely in Chicago
at 4 P.M. with all my baggage.
Brothers awaited my arrival
& conveyed me home.
Found all my friends well,
& glad to see me back.

FRIDAY 8

A stormy very cold day.
Confined to house all
day fixing up my things.
In Jones' class at night.
Writing letters etc.

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 1867.

Another bitter cold day
30 below zero.

Busy arranging property
& writing letters.

Rec'd several, 2 from Washington
one from Heggenburg & Fowler,
one from Mrs. Vance by Mursey
one from Saint

SUNDAY 10

Still very cold
attended preaching & class
meeting at Cleveland with
father & Bro. J. B. Rode home
with Wm. Flowers & had
dinner at his place.
Met Robt. Rhodes & others.

MONDAY 11

in Bond.

Milder. Mother gave me \$3.50.
Busy arranging my
papers & letters at home.
Geph. Flowers visited, me
& sold me Greely's History
of the Rebellion for 10¢.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 1867.

Warm, thawing day.
Fixing scrap book, &
arranging letters.
Rode over to Cleveland
at night. Stopped at Smith
& Brackman, while Brochus
went to Spelling School.

WEDNESDAY 13

Clear, mild day.
Remained at home
during the day.
Spent the evening at
Jones. Rec'd a letter from
St. Vincent, & answered it.

THURSDAY 14

Mild.
Rode over to St. Peter, sold
Coupons to the amt of \$142.35.
Saw Capt. Carter & dined with
him. Saw Elder Kerns & lady.
Rode up to Mankato on the stage

FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 1867.

Cloudy, disagreeable day
snowed last night six inches
& sleeting today. Stayed last
night at the Clifton House.
Saw L. Smith, Mr. Coffin, Burke
Jones & other friends. Stay to night
at Jones. Paid Mr. Purnell's taxes \$15.76.

SATURDAY 16

Left Mankato at 4 a.m. on the
stage for St. Peter, a cold ride.
Spent the forenoon & dined with
Capt. Carter, got a check of \$800,
cashed by him & lent him \$750.
at 12 p.m. on security of 2 deers.
Walked into Cleveland & attended Lode
balloon passed & wilds raised.
Walked home.
Paid dues up to date \$1.55.

SUNDAY 17

no track.
Clear beautiful mild day.
Wrote two letters & mailed
them.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 1867.

Cold. Feel fatigued after
Saturday's walk and laid
down to rest.

some money.

of Cleveland & secured by mortgage on
a house & 1/2 lots in Clysium.

Still confined to bed.
Rec'd a letter from Ordo, Sept
about charges &c

Still unwell.
Rec'd a letter from Miss Burnell
first since I left.

Cashed Mrs. J. Roberts note
\$89.85. Steamer Chippewa Falls
Came up today
