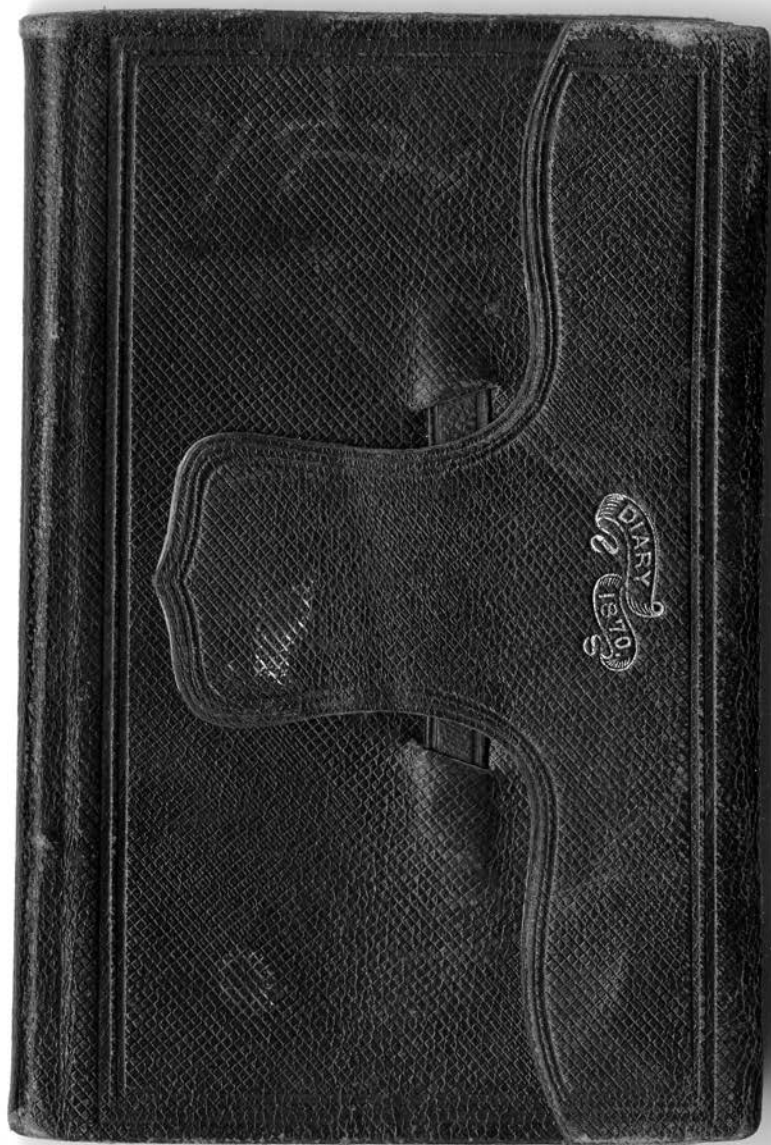

waukee at 8 P.M.

THURSDAY 10.

Arrived in Milwaukee 6 am & in
Chicago at 10.30. Cloudy dull day.
Spent the day in the city, called at
Security & Republic Ins. Co's Office.
Bought a suit of clothes \$18.
Heard John B. Gough lecture at
Farwell Hall. Sold 1500 Republic
Stock. Left for Pittsburg 9 P.M.
Milder, no snow.

after noon crossed over to
Allegheny City and rode all over
it through park &c Park about
2 miles long. Nice place. Bought a
present for Lizzie on her Birthday.

TUESDAY 15.

Clear fine day. Up early. Started for
Philadelphia at 5 A.M. Cous Wm
came with me to Altoona 117 miles
over the mountains, where we parted.
Arrived in Pa. 7 P.M. Beautiful Country
from Harrisburg. Found Cousin Lizzie
Morrow at 9 P.M. & stopped with her till
near midnight. Stopping at Bingham House

WEDNESDAY 16.

Called on British Consul to get power of
attorney authentic. Paid him \$2.50.
Rained last night. Cloudy day.
Visited most places of general interest
in the City. Independence Hall. Girard
College. Water works. Jail. Mint. Exchange
Allegheny River. Art Gallery &c &c.
Spent the evening with Cous. Lizzie
Morrow. Saw Froon from performed by
Laura Keane. Bade her farewell &
Started for New York at midnight.

MARCH

THURSDAY 17.

1870.

bold, clear morning, St Patrick's day. Arrived in N.Y. at 6 am. Visited Lower Broadway, Battery, O. Hall Street &c. Found Cousin Thos Morrow at 10 am, at No 16, Little Jones St. Stopping with his wife & her two sisters. He took me round the City, showing me places of interest. Saw Irish Procession. Saw

FRIDAY 18.

Still cold and raw. Visited Central Park, Arsenal, Cousin Isaac Langen, Wall Street, 5th Avenue, 14th St &c. Quite tired walking. In evening went to Glass meeting. The very happiest I ever saw, at M.E. Church in Bedford St. Cous Morrow & Sister Ann with us.

SATURDAY 19.

Clear, fine day. Crossed East River at Fulton ferry to Brooklyn & saw Cous Oliver Langen. Returning called at W.B. Scott & Co. & Equitable Life Assn. Home Fire Ins Co, Meigs No 22, Cooper Institute Bible House, Harpers &c. At 4 P.M. left N.Y. for Montreal up Hudson River. Saw King's Bridge, West Point, Albany Troy &c.

MARCH

SUNDAY 20.

1870.

Left N.Y. at 7 am, and had to stay over until to-morrow. Changed cars 8 or ten times last night. Stopped at St Albans House. Went to M.E. Church in morning and to Masonic Burial in P.M. Wrote to wife. Interesting occurrences in evening.

Up early. MONDAY 21. Left St Albans at 6 am, and got to Montreal at 10 am. 70 miles. Crossed Victoria Bridge 3 miles long. Found Uncles John & James & Aunt Eliza and ten Cousins. by father's side. All very glad to see me. Stopped with Aunt Eliza Pratt's No 44, Seigneur St. Point St Charles. P.Q. Saw Prince Arthur. Went to the top of St. Patrick Cathedral.

TUESDAY 22.

Rode over the city and round the mountains with uncles. Visited the Cemetery where Grandmother is buried. Saw English Cathedral. Chapter Palace &c &c. and left for Le Centre at 2. Hired a Carter who took me to Beauharnois, 18 miles all on ice on River St Lawrence. Arriving at 5 P.M. a very dark, cold, disagreeable day.

MARCH,

WEDNESDAY 23.

1870.

Still very stormy & cold with snow from 4 to 10 ft deep. Examined title &c to Durham lots, in Seigneur's office. Paid a Carter to take me to St Martin 8 miles \$1.25. Took Stage & went to Durham 16 miles, arriving at 4 P.M. Visited our old house, & stop with Rev E. Harris.

THURSDAY 24.

Cold, stormy & snowing. Rode out with Mr. Harris to Arthur Moore's ^{4 miles} where we dined, then to Ed Sadler & Tate & back to Durham. Met several acquaintances and learned the history of many more. Committee meeting appointed for tomorrow, to see about buying house

FRIDAY 25.

Cold, but less stormy. Walked down to S. Bottlingham's where I had a good lunch & dined. Committee met at 3 P.M. to whom I concluded a sale of our house & two lots for \$425. Cash. Called on Arch McEachern, our agent and had a settlement with him. Recd \$54. nett, stop with him all night.

MARCH,

SATURDAY 26.

1870.

A fine pleasant day. Signed deeds of lots to Mr Dempsey & Messrs Moore & Tate. $4320 + 105 = 4425$. The Church receives 50 ft. S of Lot 9, House goes to Dempsey. In fair repair, very little change in Durham since we left in 1855. Tried to find Sister's grave. Went to Huntingdon, on Stage & stop with George Robson. ^{SUNDAY 27.} ~~Changed gold for greenbacks at 12 1/2 per cent.~~

Mr Robson & I walked over to his father's where we spent the day returning late. Had a good time. Met many old friends on the way. Saw Mr & Mrs R. Caroline, Maria, Emily & family &c. Engaged a passage for Chateaufort tomorrow. Stormy

Up early, ~~started~~ ^{started} for Chateaufort in blinding storm at 5 am. Roads heavy & snow deep. Arrived in time for train at 9.30. Passed through Malony, Potsdam, Watertown, Canton & Rome where we left for S. Bridge on N.Y. Central. Many trains detained by snow. Raining at Rome & all night. Got a through ticket

6 MARCH, with ^{TUESDAY 29} light rain 1870.
Arrived at Suspension Bridge
7 a.m. which I crossed, getting a
view of Niagara Falls a mile or two up
the River. Arrived in London 1 P.M.
where I remained until 6 P.M.
Saw Mr Thompson Peters & others.
Bought a silk dress pattern for
wife @ 1.87 1/2 pr 4 & suit for myself.

Cloudy, wet, ^{WEDNESDAY 30.}
Crossed cars over Detroit River on
Ferry Boat, last night. Baggage
searched by Custom House Officers.
Arrived in Chicago 9 A.M. & Milwaukee
2 P.M. Left for Cambria 2:40, arriving
at 8:30, finding Father in lands for
all well, ^{except Mrs B.} and glad to meet.

Cloudy, wet, ^{THURSDAY 31.}
Spent the whole day at Mr.
Purnell's. A large funeral
of Mr. Owens. Went down
to Stone. Left Cambria
for home 8:30 P.M.
Changed cars at Portage City
leaving there 12, on accom^{modation}
train for La Crosse,

APRIL, FRIDAY 1. 1870.
Clear fine day, warm. Snow
all gone. Arrived at La Crosse
at 10 a.m. Paid for Livery to over-
take stage going to Winona & 6.00
overtook it 14 mls out. Going awful
bad, only went a few miles further.
Crossed Black River & stop all night
at Halfway House. 30 to 40 stop there,

Another ^{SATURDAY 2} beautiful warm day.
The most eventful night in all my
travels. Dancing nearly all night.
A rough crowd. Left on stage at
8 a.m. for Winona 16 mls. Very slow
traveling, after crossing Trampelaw
River had to walk 5 miles & carry my
valise, very oppressing. Arriving at the
Miss River found could not cross, but at
3 P.M. the ice gave way, and we cross
ed on ferry boat at 5 P.M. ^{SUNDAY 3} & put up
at the Huff House. Mr Lamberton
gave me a pass to Janesville
on W & S. P. R.R. Saw W. C. Brown

- 3 -
Beautiful, bright warm day.
Attended Quarterly meeting
at Mr E Church with W & S. P. R.R.
also Sunday School in afternoon
very interesting. Dr Phillips preached.

APRIL,

MONDAY 4.

1870.

Fine clear day.
Left Winona at 9 am. arriving
at Janesville 6 P.M.
Took stage for Mankato 18
miles arriving at 2 a.m.
Elder Cobb rode with me from
Rochester to Owatonna.

Beautiful TUESDAY 5. day.
Took cars at 6 am. for St. Peter.
Track washing out just a few
rods south of Depot on account
of the river being so very high.
Crossed on skiffs quite dangerous.
Found Sarah & Eddie in blast of
health. all glad to meet. (mercer)
To God be all the praise for journeying
attended Lodge a short time.

WEDNESDAY 6.

Clear warm and dry.
In office most all day.
Got by laws from Mr. Moore
200 Copies \$27.⁰⁰ very nice.
Brother James Charles came
over yesterday to see me & returned
today. Sent a dress to Mother \$5.60.
Wrote to Mrs. Burnell, Aunt Eliza
Cous. Morrow, Mrs. M., Cous. Henry, Mr. & Mrs.

APRIL,

THURSDAY 7.

1870.

Clear warm and dry.
Capt. Carter suffering from
boil on his face.
River still rising, and
within 2 inches of highest
water mark. Plains detained
Track washed away south of
Depot. dangerous crossing.

FRIDAY 8.

Beautiful weather.
River at a stand. Track being
laid around bluff. Officers of the
Winona & St. Peter R.R. are here
with families &c. ready to commence
business on that road at this point.
Great bridge built and cars running
here by Sept 1. Uncovering shrubs

SATURDAY 9.

Another beautiful day.
Mr. Snyder paid me \$15. on Rent.
Wrote to S. P. Lerryle & sent off several
papers to friends. Alone in office
Entire proceeds in Greenbark's from Burkhar
\$560. Total expenses of trip including
