Dear Sir.

I have received your Letters of the 25- 27. and 30th

ult: with copies of despatches from Nor Gallatin, and Nor Appliton; and two detten relating to the Post Office at Now york. On my passage through that City I saw yoursel Bailey, who did not indicate any intention of resigning, and I understood that he had no such intention.

Since the perusal of elv Gallatinis despatches, it appears to me to be most advisable to wait until we hear further from him, before we give him new instructions with regard to the modifications proposed by the Dritish fovernment to the Convention of 1615 upon its revewal. The discrimination between rolled and hammened worn is an object not of magnetical to Stake upon it the renewal of the whole Convention. From the upperience we have had it feems fearcely possible that any project of Settlement on the North west Coast Should within ten years receive the faretion of Congress. But is it should the stipulation that either party may with twelve months notice annul the Convention, would enable them to undertake it as freely as if we had no engagement of forlearance. I should nevertheless profes the renewal of the Convention, unaltered.
