There were quite a number of other things in the Garvan sale that looked very well in the catalog but upon examination there were some defects or uncertainties that led us to avoid them. Quite a number of the pieces bore recent initialings or markings that really destroyed their value, particularly as museum pieces.

It is very interesting to learn that Mrs. Ford is a descendant of the famous silversmith Brasher. Unfortunately, I have no example of his work, although I have him on my list of acquisitions should anything turn up.
