The brave To-Kau-we-Chostah was a friend of the whites at the time of the Sioux outbreak in 1862, and was afterwards employed as a guide and scout in the expeditions against the hostile Sioux. He is entitled to the gratitude of the white people for his friendship to them, and is worthy of kind treatment from our citizens.
