Enclosed is the bill as desired -

I write you to explain to the Company the fact that the Deeds and Bonds cost more than ordinary ones because they are special forms, and have to be set especially for them and cannot be used for anything else. The price charged is less than the St. Peter Co paid for theirs in St. Paul. The Stock Certificate is merely nominal - I charged that because I intended to let you have them at cost on account of your services on my map. The Cleveland Co, gave me a show of stock for getting up theirs for them.

The circular is the only thing bargained for in lots. The paper as you will see cost me in

cash nearly one half of the
amount charged, so that I
think the Co must be satisfied
with them.

Please explain also that I
did not send this bill for pay-
ment, of my own accord, al-
though of course they will have
no objection to paying for work
when it is done.

I wish you to say to the Company
that I will adventure their work,
and do all in my power to as-
sist them, and take pay for
same, either in lots or stock.

them. When under the threats, I agreed
& signed the quit claim & took the money
and acknowledged the instrument in fear of
my life —

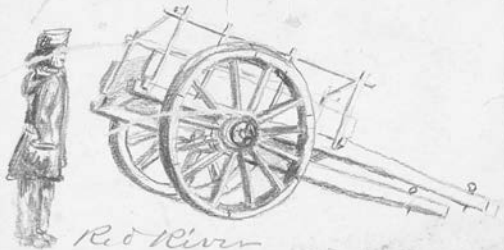
