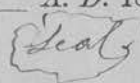

sanctioned by the people, and this mighty
swindle will be forced upon the State. The
grant from Congress ^{by the State} is amply sufficient
to build the roads, ~~and~~

I can sell you materials for roofing at a price which will make your roof cost from Four to Four and a half dollars per square when completed, my price for Cement ready for putting on is Eighteen dollars per Barrel, One Bbl will complete about 9 squares of Roof, if you desire it, I can send you the Canvas or Sheetting from here at the price it cost me, I will send the Bill of the house from which I purchase, I do this because I can send you better cloth for the purpose than you would be likely to choose, I warrant my roofing for 5 years but it will last a great deal longer. The directions for using are simple in the first ^{place}, your roofing boards must be laid evenly and smoothly, if one board is thicker than another ~~edge~~ its edge off, it is not necessary to tongue and groove nor joint the boards although it makes a more certain job. you tack your Canvas to the roof at the edges (place the tacks 2 or 3 inches apart) taking care to have it smoothly and evenly stretched

Lap your sheeting 12 or 2 inches and well stretch
it well both lengthwise and in breadth, you
will put cant stripes at your chimneys and
around the walls and nail the cloth over
the strips, you then with a white wash brush
spread a coat of cement over the cloth, leave
it for 2 or 3 days to dry, when dry enough
to walk on without sticking to your feet
you will put on another coat and sand it
in the same manner as you sow grain
smoothly and evenly, the cement absorbs a
large quantity of sand and you throw it
on as long as it will be absorbed leave to
dry as before and then put on another coat
without sand, when that is dry put on one
more coat and sand well and your roof
is completed and a good roof it is too, you do
not sand the first coat nor the third but
the second and last you must sand well
the last especially, this roofing is in a work
or two a perfectly fire proof one and a
very convenient one also, and as durable
as shingles or tin and as you see much
cheaper, please answer upon receipt of
this whether you conclude to use or not
