Great Britain may be the land of strong traditions, but Dayton's via BOAC chooses to feature not the old, but "London Now."

SPECTRUM


"Spectrum" surrounds you with the sights and sounds of London, as you take an impressionistic tour of this great new city. The encircling screens are divided into three panels 18 feet high. The circle is topped by a geodesic dome. Eleven rear-screen projectors provide a multi-image view of the city on film, slides and transparencies, for an exciting explosion of color and pattern. Combined with the sights will be sounds of the London beat blended into a soundtrack creating a total experience.

KALEIDOSPHERE

Lose yourself in this infinity-sphere of British-inspir-it-into-infinity, now-you-don't experience. Here the Walls of reflections and lights create a now-you-see-it-intoinfinity, now-you-don't experience. Here the old and the new in fashion meet and the time line disappears as the lights dim and the revolving units change every 20 seconds.

KINEMA

Step into a day in the life of a Londoner when you step into space and the flashing vignettes of "Kinema." This women's fashion pavilion features twenty, 7-foot tall, stylized mannequins. These "mini-kins" were especially created for London Now. Suspended from the ceiling, the animated "mini-kins" will appear in ten different situations. The entire day of these London "dolls" will flash before you in 90 seconds!



Here your voice activates combinations of segments of a cinerama-like screen that is 18 feet high and 48 feet wide. It's an electronic taste test as six microphones pick up your voice and electronically trigger random combinations of slides of London-inspired home furnishings. Each microphone controls eight images picturing various types of British furniture, ranging from rare museum pieces to "out-of-sight" merchandise.
