Entire day spent moving from Jamestown, N.P. to Tewahon Refuge.

Left Jamestown at 2:30 p.m., arr. Tewahon 5:00 p.m. Met refuge personnel and settled in house.

Oct 2, 1962 (12)

Met with Refuge Crew. In office briefly on 1012 and other paper work with Clerk Lee, then prepared to check + replace posting at refuge. Talked to wildlife technician from Desota Band who picked up Land leveler. Lee Schuler assisted in loading leveler.

With Refuge Mgr Mannie entire day. Discussed S+M plan, water Mgt plan, Easement areas and law enforcement. Visited Lake Else, Storm Lake and Wild Rice River Easement Area. Also Sprague Lake Area. Met Sargent Co. Sheriff, Judge and several permittees.

Answered depredation complaint at 7:30 a.m. on Percy Peterson's Ford Shots then returned to office. Accompanied by Clerk. Called H. Jensen about explosives and D. Mundingen about Struck inventory list. With J. Mannie to visit Ted Struck. In office briefly with J. Mannie then to N. of Cutler marsh to help start tractor. Lv HQ at 3:30 p.m. for Sand Lake via Courier. Picked up 2 explosives and returned to office at 5:30 p.m. Checked depredation areas and set out explosives until 6:30 p.m.
