The Twin City Book Club held its first meeting of the 1959-60 season on the above date at the home of Annette Calloway with Barbara Cyrus as co-hostess. Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Her review proved to be most interesting, beginning with a analytical review of a book published by Paegeant Press, written by James Lee--"The Victims" is a story concerning a young couple in their early 30's and what heppens in their life after his wife, Diane, has been raped. The story, we are told, is written from the majority point of view. It is an attempt to give approval of life in Washington, D. C. that created the kind of boys who would do this kind of thing. Along with the review of this timely book, Thelma brought out the underlying idea being emphasized currently by a number of authors, "the age-old problem of what is the place of sex in life" -- and the meaning of life is a part of the symbology authors concern themselves with. The old but newly popular novel Lady Chatterley's Lovers was taken as a case in point. The thing that impressed our guest, she says was the discussion of symbolism running through many of the contemporary novels. It is, she said, a symbolism called the "outsider"-- the individual in search of something and the aim of novelists to present characters that succeed in finding the unknown. A lively discussion followed the review after which the hostesses served refreshments.

Laura Oliver announced the Waltz Cocktail Party sponsored by the St. Monica's Guild of the Episcopal Church to be held Sunday, November 1 at Holiday Lodge in St. Louis Park.

A good painting, he pointed out, is an idealism. Many questions were asked of Mr. Bradley, and the interchange and discussion of the evening added up to a delightful and informative session for everyone. 
