

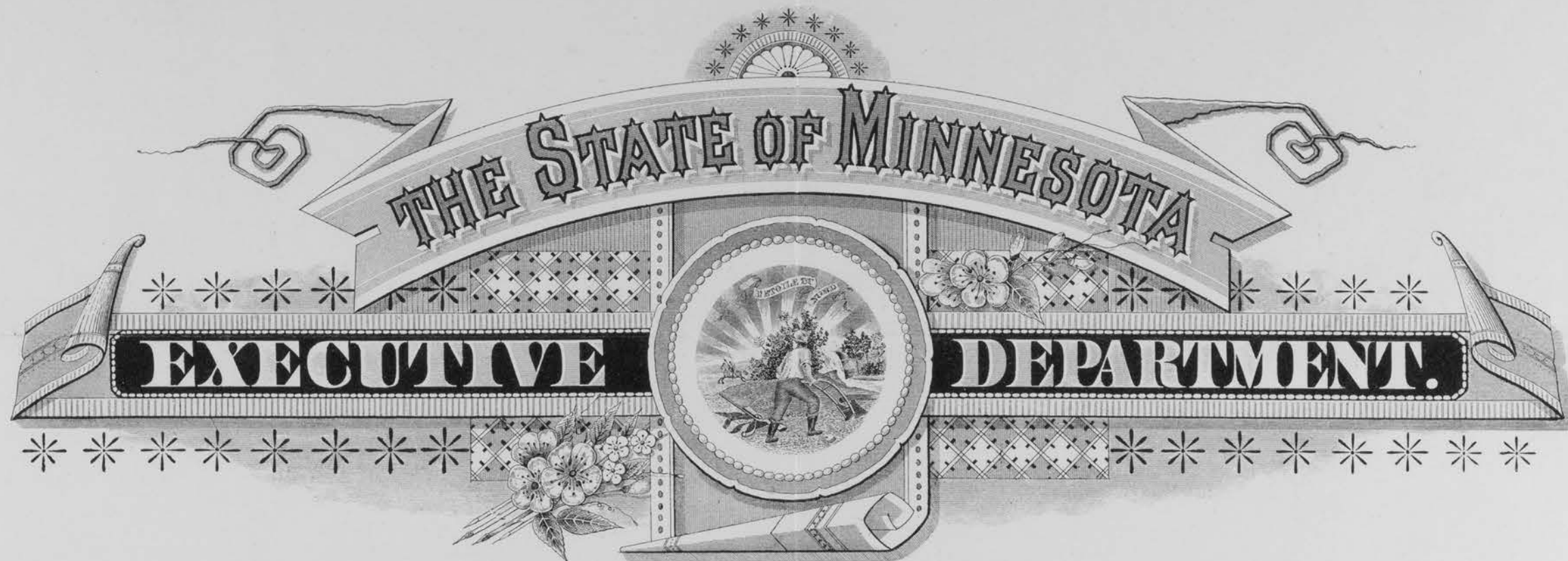


Gratia A. Countryman and Family Papers.

ADOLPH O. EBERHART, GOVERNOR OF SAID STATE:

To Gratia A. Countryman of Kennebec County Sends Greeting:
 Reposing especial trust and confidence in your prudence, integrity and ability
 I have appointed you, the said Gratia A. Countryman, Member Minnesota Public Library
 Commission, for the term ending the first Monday in January 1919.
 You are therefore by these presents, appointed and commissioned Member as aforesaid,
 To Have and to Hold The said office of Member together with all the rights, powers,
 and emoluments to the said office belonging or by law in anywise appertaining, until this commission shall be by me
 or other lawful authority superseded or annulled, or expire by force or reason of any law of this State.

 the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the Capitol in the City of St. Paul this 20th
 day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred thirteen
