308-13-H - Camp #3
September 8, 1942

Dear Ruth and Earl:

Started to walk out thinking that it was noon and time to eat, but much to my disgust they called me back saying that it is only 11:30! Just my luck.

The Ad. Bldg. is located almost a mile from 308, so at present, we have been issued meal tickets to eat in the personnel mess and the food is very much better, so you can see why I'm anxious to get started. The walk is very nice getting to the office, but at noon and evening, it is terrific. The truck dispatcher here is a very good friend of mine so I've been lucky enough to bum rides occasionally.

Heard from your folks last night that they received a very nice long letter written in Japanese from you, and one from Grace. Since we always report to them when we receive word from you they weren't so worried about you two, but since Grace and little Minoru left Pomona, yesterday's message was the first your folks rated. I'm very happy to hear that they arrived in Wyoming finally, but the trip must have been a hectic one. I understand that it's all prairie land in Wyoming, with a few cacti plants, lots of loose sand, and the heat is terrific. During mid-afternoon the heat hits a high peak, and then it drops to almost freezing at nights. When the Pomona people reached the Center the buildings and housing facilities were just getting started. The people get no fresh vegetables and no milk. I suppose we should consider Poston quite civilized. Already we received our first shipment of fresh vegetables from Tule Lake Center, and the milk rationing has been very good. I even find my cup filled with milk, but you know how I feel about it! Granted we aren't getting first-class food, but compared with other camps, we think it is very good here. Rumors are that at Gila, the children don't even get milk, and no privacy whatsoever. Poor George I often think of him. We received a note from him recently and he said that they were all sleeping in one large room. Before I forget, I want to write down his address: 24-9-A, Rivers P. O., Pinal County, Arizona. I don't know what happened to their fancy resort which was going to be called "Casa Grande".

Bike got a letter from the Hartford Ins. people and since they were able to get a bid on the car at last, they find that it be best to send us a check for \$515. (blue book value). We feel that under the circumstances this deal wasn't so bad as we already received \$45. for the good tires and saved on storage fee. Dad is going to reimburse Bike on the loss, but Bike thinks he's coming out ahead. Anyway we are satisfied, and the thankful part of the entire think was toru's escape -- he didn't suffer a bit.

A bunch of us went to the welcome dance for the Santa Anita people last Sunday. Our Camp #3 orchestra played at the dance and the reports are that with few more practice sessions it will be all right. Camp #1 and #2 are without dance orchestras, so we feel quite elegant. Incidentally Kelly plays his sax in the orchestra.

Last Sept. 5, the camp's official taxi rushed Sally, Kelly, and the Doc to the Hospital in Camp #1. Sally's baby has the reputation of being the first incubator baby in Poston. The baby which was a little boy weightd all of $3\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. Sally expected her baby, which was due in October, to be a bit weak because she wasn't feeling very well since her arrival at camp, but surprisingly the boy is so strong. Kelly is feeling so proud -- typical of all fathers.

Received a very nice long letter from Edith Jones. She writes so faithfully, that she embarrasses me at times, but I'm trying hard. I wrote her and asked if she would shop around for me in the Bay Region for a studio couch or divan. Our little cots are very uncomfortable, and Bike has a terrific cold. It seems that the draft from underneath is quite penetrating. I was smart and used all the left-over blankets, comforters and pads and padded my cot, after much fuss. Bike is coming along, although the Doc said to take it easy.

I forgot to mention above where I speak about the dance we took in last Sunday that George Furuta asked me for a dance. Everybody laughed because he's so-h-h-h huge and here I'm a bit small. Bike said I looked so funny, and I'm inclined to believe him.

Everybody seems to be carrying on his duties here quite well. Mrs. Minami is being cared for very well at the Base Hospital. The Rokutanis are all well. My brother George is heading the Ag. Department so he's busier than a "bee". Our camp life is getting quite interesting now -- we just opened a Radio Service Shop, our Beauty Shop and Barber Shop is now open for business. Just think we get our hair fized for 15¢. Mrs. Matsumoto has offered to fix my hair for me, but for 15¢ it hardly makes any difference.

Hope to be writing again soon. Much luck from the bunch to you two. With best regards it's --

not Montgomery there's on Sears Roebuck

size for there is no 1/2 size Price 2.29
each if you have spare time go get them
for us we can not get these things
around here. If you can not find
in Sears ~~or Montgomery~~ Store go to some

As I wrote to you Nov 19th received nice elec
stove. Today I got your letter and same time
letter from "Portland Ward Co." It seems like
St Paul Ward Co turn orders to Portland store
because closer. But I knew they haven't
got no Portland or in Seattle at all but St Paul
store does not know that. Its very much
trouble for you to buy them & send to me
but since we can not buy those things
or Rubber goods around Coast or in
here, Please buy one Porcolator and
stove ~~too~~ and mailed to us by yourself
instead of let store send to me
I have signed credit check (which you
paid at St Paul store) so you can use it
then when you buy Pat & stove, about stove
Mrs H likes mine very well & she does not
mind about price big he said all right
to buy same kind. I enclose check \$20⁰⁰
for the goods if not enough tell me
(you have paid for medicine before take that
too) and I will send you balance.

Please buy Boots ~~too~~ at St Paul and
mailed to me by yourself instead let
store send to me, I wanted Wards
catalogue very bad let them send

to me as soon as possible, also tell
them here after any thing we ordered
stuff do not turn to Portland store -
I know they are very scarce for
every thing on account of so many
Ship yard workers in vicinity things
can not filled order -

I misunderstand that all together - after I sent 1st mail Pat came & I read your letter again and Earl's too and I sent out another air mail letter that I received Pat for Mrs Hirabayashi -

It is very much trouble for you & Earl I thank both of you again.

In first letter I enclosed check of \$20^{00⁰⁰ Cover for merchandise - I do not it will be enough - in case short tell me I will send the balance -}

Same time I sent you Credit Check Montgomery Co. I do not know which Company (St Paul or Portland) to send it back so

Dearest Ruth:

Many thanks for the beautiful blue blouse you sent to me and all the food...We were so happy to receive all the nice things...it certainly is a wonderful treat when it comes all those things. We do have a canteen here, but you know limited the things are. Mother would like for you to send a couple boxes of gum (Wrigley's Spearmint and Doublemint) the next time you get a chance.

I ordered a two pieced dress of Smoke Blue from Macy's NYC and it came the other day....it's very nice...and very practical in here since I can wear it with so many things...especially with the nice blue blouse you gave me. The skirt is dirndl effect and the top is cardigan ...with grosgrain ribbon...so you can see it's very casual..you know how I go for casual clothes...and on top of that I'm sewing me about three sport type of dresses. You see I sent for my machine (the one I purchased ...the portable) and so I can attempt to do a lot of sewing from now on.

How is your cold...are you feeling better now? I can imagine how wintery it must be over there at St. Paul...from what Dad and Mother use to tell me when they were there long time ago. Please take good care of yourself 'cause I know how you overwork yourself when it comes to Holiday Season! Here at Hunt...it's been snowing every day....but when the snow begins to melt...oh boy, that's when we have to dig out our boots and galoshes and wade thru the sticky mud...and I do mean sticky gooey mud! It's a different kind of a mud than back home....like dust when it's dry so you can imagine what it's like when it's wet!

You spoke about the Girl Reserves and Mae Abe in your letter.. Mae is in Tulelake..so you could write to her at the Tulelake Relocation Center..but as far as the other girls.... Elsie Takeoka is the head of the girls around the nearby blocks and she lives in block 31..right across from us. Ise Inuzuka is the advisor for the girls..and she lives in block 32-5-B..why don't you write to her and ask her...she would be glad to give you names of the girls around that age who would correspond with them.

Thanks a lot for finding out about the Foundation Cream... Meier's sent to me Dark Rosetta Bronze which is the nearest shade..which is the one you mentioned...next time send me a jar of that if you can...I'll be glad to pay for it..anytime is alright because I'm not in a hurry for it, but when you go town buy it cause they might discontinue that shade too.

Many thanks for the nice letter you sent to me. I wrote a letter to you before about the lovely blouses you sent to me. Yes, I received both of them. The beige blouse I don't mind yet but the white one I do. It fits perfectly and just the kind I always wanted. Many thanks Ruth - I certainly appreciate your special gift.

Pretty busy - now the Christmas is almost over - Paul sent a package to me - everything from toilet articles, chocolate candies, to a cute novelty perfume bottles in a telephone form. Debby saw one like it before and everyone asks me where I got such a cute novelty. It has 2 perfume bottles - one for the mouthpiece & one for the ear phone. It is a hand type phone - (french phone) model - one bottle is for morning and the other for evening. I like it so much!

- Afternoon -

Was sorta lousy so I couldn't continue on to finish my

letter to you. I changed my job
to interviewer at the Placement
Office here. I do reception work
interview people for jobs here
at the relocation area. I find it better
than tracking, but yet I still would
prefer sewing. Here we deal
with so many kinds of people &
various jobs.

About the job through Mrs. Sickett
I am interested very much to do
sewing, but as for dress designer
(such as drawing & drafting) I cannot
do. I am only qualified as a
dramstress & I would like a
good position in that field.
How are the wages? Since living
conditions are high I would
like at least to make extra
for personal expenses & savings.
You could have Mrs. Sickett
write to our personnel director.
Are there any possibilities of
mechanic jobs available? Also,
school boy jobs. I know personally

some boys who wanted like
to continue school and work
too. Please let me know as
soon as you can.

Thanks a lot for the boots -
they fit well in fact - Nellie
& Yoshiko wanted like a pair
each, too. Could you send
me 2 more pair I size 5 -
same size as mine. I shall
send you the money in the
next letter. I don't know
how much they cost. Yoshiko
is Jwing Hong's wife. He
