

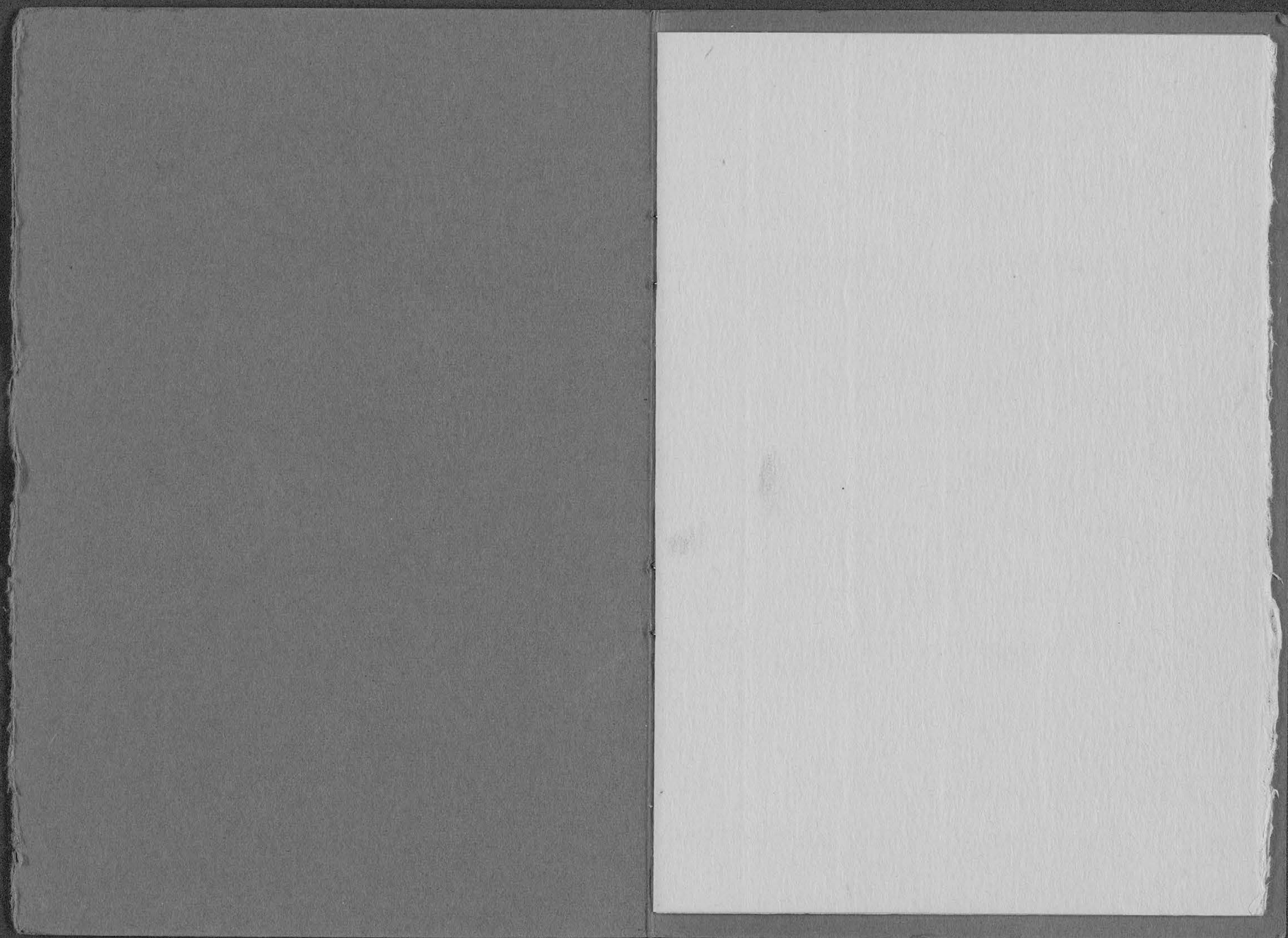

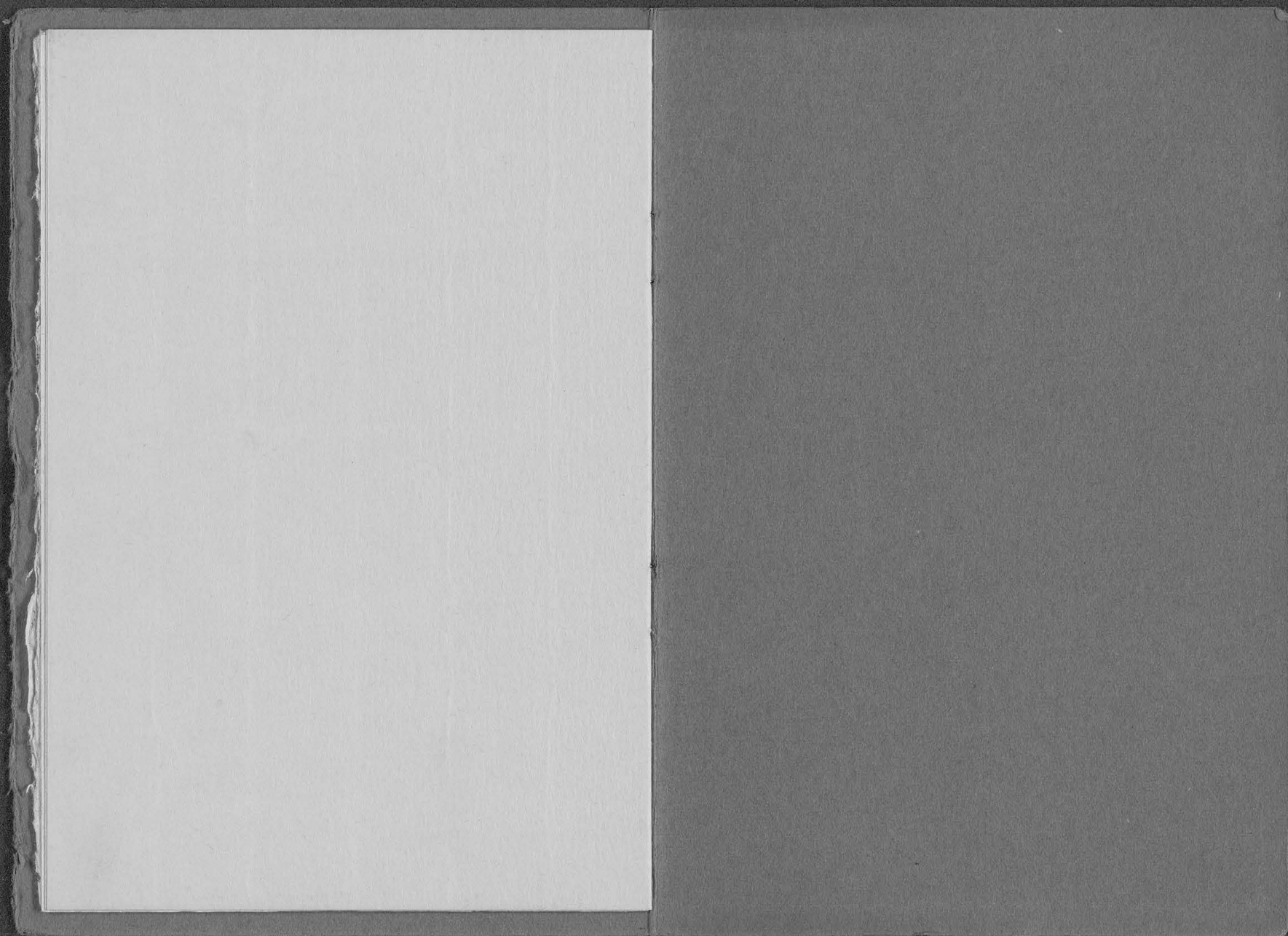

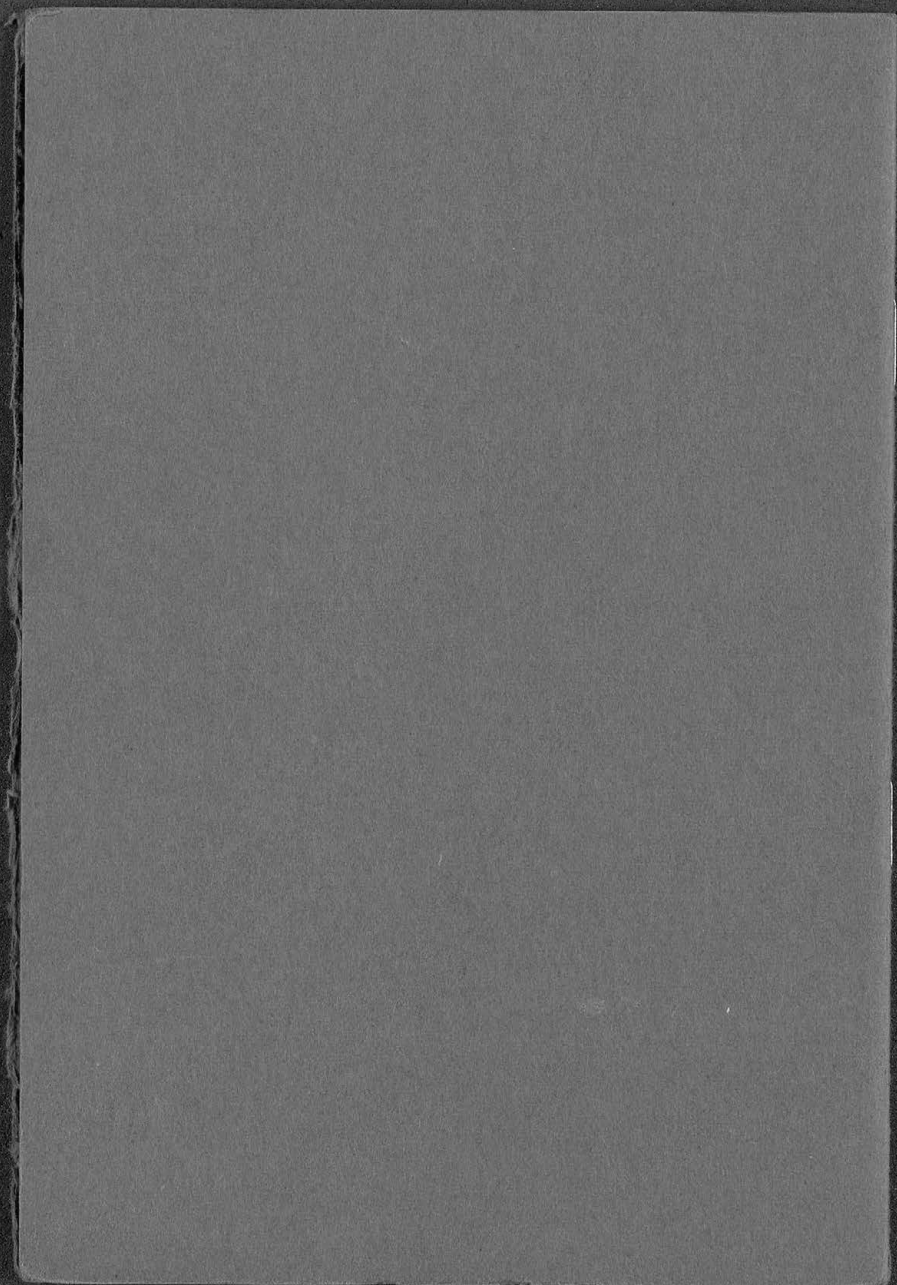

Evolution of Statesmanship

GENERAL NOTE—The plan of the series is to trace the development of the modern conception of the State, in its evolution from feudalism, through the discussion of selected statesmen and constructive critics of statecraft.
