

OF THE SAID COMMONWEALTH,

To Charles Martin of the County of Erie — Greeting:



Know, That you the said Charles Martin (being duly elected and returned) are hereby commissioned Major of the second Battalion of the one hundred & thirty sixth Regiment of the Militia of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the first Brigade of the sixteenth Division composed of the Militia of the Counties of Beaver, Butler, Mercer, Crawford, Erie, Venango and Warren, To have and to hold this commission, exercising all the powers, and discharging all the duties thereto lawfully belonging and attached, for the term of four years to be computed from the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, if you shall so long behave yourself well.

In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Less Seal of the State, to be affixed to these Presents, at Harrisburg, the <sup>12<sup>th</sup> day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and of the Commonwealth the thirty <sup>first</sup> seventh.</sup>

1st Commission issued to Armand Martin - Grandfather of  
A.R. McGill - by the Governor of Pennia Aug 3rd, 1811 as  
Captain of the 4th Company, Regiment 138, First Brigade  
of the 16th Division of Militia.

2nd Commission issued to Charles Martin Jr. brother of Armand by  
the Gov. of Pennia. Dated Aug 12<sup>th</sup> 1812, as Major of 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion of 138<sup>th</sup>  
Reg. of Militia, in First Brigade 16th Division.

Charles Martin was Great Uncle of A.R. McGill.
