Major ————— of the *second Battalion* of the *one hundred thirty sixth* Regiment of the Militia of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the *first* Brigade of the sixteenth Division composed of the Militia of the Counties of Beaver, Butler, Mercer, Crawford, Erie, Venango and Warren, To have and to hold this commission, exercising all the powers, and discharging all the duties thereto lawfully belonging and attached, for the term of four years to be computed from the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eleven, if you shall so long behave yourself well. —————

In Testimony whereof, I have set my Hand, and caused the Great Seal of the State, to be affixed to these Presents, at *Harrisburg* *12th* day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight and ~~eleven~~ *twelve*, and of the Commonwealth the thirty ~~sixth~~ *seventh*. —————
