Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Village Council of the Village of Mounds View, Minnesota was held at the Red Oak School in said Village on the 23rd day of January 1961 at 8:00 p.m. with the following members present:  
and the following members absent:

Member Mel Christensen introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

#65  
A RESOLUTION MODIFYING ASSESSMENTS FOR WATER MAIN IMPROVEMENT.

WHEREAS, The Village Council has determined that certain assessments are to be modified or divided,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the following list of modifications and divisions, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby accepted and shall constitute the special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the proposed improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.

2. Such assessment shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of fifteen years, the first of the installments to be payable on or after the first Monday in January, 1961 and shall bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum from the date of the adoption of this assessment resolution. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from the date of this resolution until December 31, 1961. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the Village Treasurer, except that no interest shall be charged if the

entire assessment is paid within 30 days from the adoption of this resolution; and he may, at any time thereafter, pay to the county treasurer the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made.

4. The clerk shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of this modification and division to the county auditor to be extended on the proper tax lists of the county, and such assessments shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

The motion for the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Member Larry Malvin, and upon a vote being taken, the following members voted in favor thereof:

A RESOLUTION REASSESSING PROPERTY FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT

WHEREAS, An assessment was levied on Lot 103 Spring Lake Park Knolls Addition to the Village of Mounds View Except the East 100 feet thereof in the amount of \$556.17 on or about the 12<sup>th</sup> day of September 1960, and

WHEREAS, Said assessment was paid by the property owner, namely Emil T. Pearson by check and said assessment was removed from the assessment roll book, and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the payment of said assessment the check paying same was ordered stopped and therefore the assessment was not paid,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF MOUNDS VIEW

That the assessment on Lot 103 Spring Lake Park Knolls Addition to the Village of Mounds View Except the East 100 feet thereof in the amount of \$556.17 be reinstated on the assessment roll, and be recertified to the County Auditor's office for collection. Said assessment shall be reinstated according to the same terms and provisions of the original assessment levy.

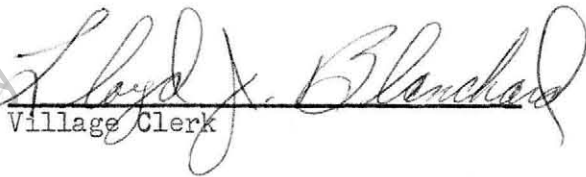

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The regular meeting of the Mounds View Village Council was called to order at 8:00 P.M., February 13th, 1961 by Mayor Allan B. Crane at the Red Oak School.

Also in attendance were the Boy Scouts from Troop #167, who served as Village Officers on Scout Civic Day, January 11, 1961. Mayor Crane asked the Clerk to explain the presence of the Boy Scouts to the people in attendance. Clerk Blanchard reported that the boys had been elected, and had served as Village officials for a day.

Trustee Christensen was than called on to explain the reasons for the proposed street plan. It was fully explained that the Planner and Engineer had worked in conjunction to set this plan up and that it was only a preliminary map. He further stated that the Council would not take action on the proposal this evening, but would hold at least one and possibly two more hearings, before adopting the plan.

Village Attorney Meyers was than asked to explain the legal aspects of the street plan.

The Mayor stated that any residents present could voice their opinions about the Proposed Street Plan.

Opinions about the Proposed Street Plans were as follows:

Mr. William A. Sutherton of 7611 Pleasant View Drive, "My home is on the proposed road".

Mr. E. Bolt, 7581 Pleasant View Drive, "My garage is on the proposed road, also there is not enough room on my lot for two homes even if the road did go through".

Mr. C. Young, 1722 County Rd. I, "The road would be 20 feet from my door and would cut up the yard too much".

Mr. R. Anderson, 1747 Bronson Dr., "Does not want the road between County Rd. I and Bronson Dr. because he has no wish to sub-divide at this time".

Mr. R. Sandeen, 1790 Woodale Drive, "Does not want the low land cut up as this is the only bird and game sanduary in the Village".

Mrs. E. Dropps owns a lot adjacent to Mr. Sandeen's and "wants to know if the Village will buy the right-of-way, and also how wide the road might be, as she plans to build this Spring".

At this point, Attorney Meyers explained again why the Village was making the proposed plan.

Mrs. L. Bonine, 8380 Spring Lk. Pk. Rd., requested that the proposed road run along the No.-So. County Line between Hwy. 10 and Co. Rd. J.

Mrs. I. Wille, 7911 Spring Lk. Pk. Rd. stated that the proposed extension of Hillview Rd. went through or very close to her home and that there would be a fire hydrant in the center of the road. She further stated that her deed carried an easement (5 ft.) for an alleyway behind her home.

At this point Trustee Christensen requested that anyone who had a complaint or knew of another person who had a complaint on the Proposal write a letter to the Village Office, stating the complaint or objection and giving their name, address and legal description of their property.

Mr. A.K. Bassett of 5060 Long Lake Rd., "He has a lot being crossed by Proposed Road and the road would make his lot un-salable".

At this point Mayor Crane again stated that this was merely a Proposed and not a Final road plan for the Village.

Mr. Verdien, 6940 Fairchild, stated that he did not want the Proposed Road behind his house extended and would send a letter to that effect to the Village Office.

Leo Higgins, 8150 Eastwood Drive, stated "He does not want the road".

Mr. Herbst of 8180 Eastwood Drive, stated he was 100% in favor of the Proposed Road - West of Eastwood Dr.

Glen Dawson, 2201 Lambert Dr., does not want the road between Bronson and Lambert Drive.

Mr. B.C. Colby, 1740 County Rd. I, "said the easements on Co.Rd. I were not as shown on the map and that the Council and the Village Engineer were aware of this.

Mr. Kroonblawd, 2280 Hwy. 10, wants a service road in front of his place as he must drive out of his way to get onto the Highway.

Mr. Lindquist, 2521 Co. Rd. H., Does not want the Proposed Road No. of Co. Rd. H.

Mrs. Schmidt, who gave no address, stated that she had several lots in the Village, but at the present time she was only objecting to the Proposed Road, South of Co. Rd. I, running through to Sp.Lk.Pk. Rd.

It was brought out in general discussion that one Proposed Road would run through the school property at Red Oak and Sherwood.

At 9:10 P.M., it was moved by Christensen to recess the Hearing until Monday, April 24th at 8:00 P.M. Seconded by Malvin, 5 Ayes for Approval.

The Mayor introduced Dick Jones, our Legislator from this District.

Mr. Jones stated that he had talked to a member of the Metropolitan Airports Commission that day and "had told him he thought the meeting scheduled for Wednesday, February 15th at 1 P.M. was unfair to the people that were interested in attending, also that it should be changed to a Public Hearing". He was informed that the Commission was under no obligation to have any type of formal Hearing whatsoever, and that their meeting would go on as scheduled.

Mr. Jones went on to say he would attend the meeting and appear before the "Board" and request that an "Open Hearing" be held, so people interested in the Airport could attend. Also to inform them of the fact that Planes would be flying over 3 schools, which can be a dangerous circumstance, referring to what happened at Wold-Chamberlain Airport a few years ago.

Mr. Jones than turned the meeting back to Mayor Crane, and suggested he get opinions from the people present in the Audience.

After much discussion by Council members and people present the Mayor asked if those who opposed the expansion of the Anoka Airport would raise their hands. An overwhelming majority did so. The Mayor then asked for a show of hands of those in favor of the expansion, and seven persons so indicated.

It was moved by Christensen that the Council oppose the expansion of the Anoka County Airport, according to the presented plans. Seconded by Hodges. 5 Ayes for approval.

The Mayor recessed the meeting at this point so that persons present could speak freely with each other and with Rep. Jones, and could also sign petitions against the expansion of the airport.

The meeting was again called to order at 10:25 P.M.

The minutes of the January 23, 1961 were corrected as follows- Page 2, paragraph 6, line 2: at three (3) dollars per year per man.

Motion by Malvin to accept minutes as corrected. Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes for approval.

The Attorney than read his report.

He stated that the Earnest Money Contract from Mr. Foley included payment of back taxes of \$1,140.18 and he recommended that we have a new Contract drawn up deleting the delinquent tax. The Council so instructed the Attorney to draw up and present the Contract as he suggested.

He than gave the Council 3 Memorandums. # One on Insurance Coverage, Number 2 on Abatement of a Public Nuisance, Number 3- Resolution from North Suburban Sanitation Sewer Committee. Said memos. on file at the Village Office.

The Council instructed the Clerk to investigate the possibility of fire insurance on the contents of the Village Hall.

The Attorney was directed to draw up a Notice to be served on Mr. Herrmann 2439 Ridge Lane, New Brighton 12, and Perry Malvin was instructed to serve said Notice.

It was moved by Christensen that the Village adopt the Resolution from the No. Sub. San. Sewer Committee. Seconded by Malvin. Mr. Christensen explained why this bill was favorable to us as a Village. Roll was called. Five ayes for approval.

A copy of aforementioned Resolution (No. Sub. San. Sew.) was given to Rep. Jones and another given to Attorney Meyers for delivery to Senator R. Martin.

Motion by Christensen, Seconded by Malvin to adopt Resolution of the Water Resources Study Committee-Sub-Committee. 5 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Hodges to adopt Ordinance # 82 an Ordinance amending Ordinance #81 prohibiting "set-ups" on Sunday. Seconded by Malvin. Crane- No. 4 Ayes for approval. (Christensen, Hodges, Malvin and Blanchard).

A proposed change to the Dog Ordinance was read, calling for a \$25.00 License fee for unspayed female dogs.

After much discussion from the floor Mayor Crane moved that the Ordinance be tabled for 6 months to see how the new set-up with the dogcatcher would work out. Motion died for lack of a second.

Trustee Christensen moved the Ordinance be adopted - motion died for lack of a second.

A Resolution calling for re-assessing of property for public improvement was read.

Motion by Blanchard for adoption. Seconded by Malvin. 5 Ayes Motion carried.

Motion by Christensen to pay presented bills (list attached). Seconded by Malvin. 5 Ayes for approval.

The Engineer reported that the Proposed Pump House would cost \$755.00, and was instructed to proceed with the letting of the contract and the construction.

The Engineer presented Estimate #3, for payment on Work completed for Sandstrom and Hafner on Water Project.

Motion by Crane to pay Sandstrom and Hafner, Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Crane to order permanent plans for building on well site. Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Blanchard to have Engineer prepare the Assessment Roll for Water Works Improve. Proj. #60-3. Seconded by Crane. 5 Ayes for approval.

Mr. Knutson reported that the water system at Northern Pole Treating Plant in the Village of Fridley was not suitable for Village use.

Motion by Blanchard that Mr. Paul Boog be hired as Administrative Deputy Clerk at a salary of \$450.00 per month with a 6 month probation period. Seconded by Crane.

After considerable discussion the roll was called. Malvin, No, Christensen, No, Hodges, Aye, Crane, Aye, Blanchard, Aye. 3 Ayes, Motion carried.

Planning Report read by Milt Stole. (Report on file at Village Office).

The Clerk was instructed to return the Planners (Howard Dahlgren) original contract Proposal for correction and ask him to re-submit it.

Motion by Crane that Mr. Keith Ewers, 2230 Co. Rd. J, be appointed Village Weed Inspector. Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Malvin to adjourn. Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 12:20 A.M.

Motion by Malvin to accept February 13th minutes as read.  
Seconded by Hodges. 4 Ayes for approval.

Recreation report was read by Hodges (copy on file). It was reported that they have a \$826.00 deficit in their budget due to the purchase of a warming house that the Recreation Committee felt should be paid for out of General Funds. Subject to be investigated and action taken later by Council.

Lakeside Park Commission report given by Malvin. A new men's softball league will be formed. A larger midget baseball league will be in operation this year with some games under lights at Lakeside Park.

Mayor Crane read the report of the Police Commission meeting of February 23rd. (Copy on file).

Motion by Blanchard to have Mounds View D-X Station service Police Cars for one year, commencing March 1, 1961 as per bid received.  
Seconded by Malvin. 4 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Crane to allow Police Commission to investigate the possibilities of using a timing device for speed control on Village Streets. Seconded by Malvin. Roll call, 3 Ayes for approval.  
Blanchard-no.

Motion by Malvin to allow Commission to do research concerning changing the Police Department from part time to full time. Seconded by Blanchard. 4 Ayes.

The Clerk was instructed to write a letter to the Anoka Bus Co. in regards to changing of routes and the speed of buses on Village Streets.

The monthly report from B & E Patrol (Village Dogcatcher) was presented. (On file in Police Office).

Public welfare report was given by Malvin.

Report on sewage overflow problem at the Harvey Hermann home on 2439 Ridge Lane was given. Several residents from the area were present and voiced their opinions and feelings on the subject.

Mayor Crane stated that perhaps the Council had been too lenient with the problem before but that it was doing everything it legally could do at the present time.

Minutes of February 27th, 1961 Council Meeting

Mr. Jesse Bennett of 2145 Belle Lane gave an informative talk on the Red Cross Bloodmobile and asked if the Village could sponsor a blood donor day. The matter was referred to the Civil Defense for study and Mr. Bennett volunteered to be Chairman of the drive to get donors.

The Engineer's report was given by Mr. Knutson. He reported on progress of structure at well site to house pump. Temporary building now completed and power to be connected on the following day.

The water lines will be flushed on Wednesday, March 1st. After flushing and testing of lines they will be chlorinated.

Mr. Skiba gave an explanation of water use deposit and the priority system in installing meters.

Specifications on blacktop of curb and boulevard at Red Oak School referred to School Board of Independent School Dist. #621.

Mr. Knutson reported that drainage problem at Red Oak and Woodcrest was not Village responsibility at this time. The Clerk was instructed to send a letter to Mrs. Marsolais, 5107 Red Oak Drive and explain that an investigation was in progress, and that she would be notified of any action contemplated by the Village.

Blueprints and specification for Edgewood Drive from Highway 10 to County Rd. I were presented.

Motion by Crane to approve plans as presented. Seconded by Blanchard. 4 Ayes for approval.

Motion by Blanchard to approve licenses presented (listed with approved bills on attached sheet). Seconded by Crane. 4 Ayes.

Motion by Malvin to issue License at no charge to Boy Scout Units #400, 167 and 409 to conduct ticket sales in the Village. Seconded by Hodges. 4 Ayes.

A letter from County Commissioners regarding Judicial Ditch #1 was read and referred to the Village Engineer for further study.

Motion by Crane to have Malvin, Hodges, Blanchard, Trustees and Clerk attend the courses at the University of Minnesota Center for Continuation Study on March 21 and March 22nd at Village expense. Seconded by Blanchard.

Motion by Crane to have Walter Skiba attend Public Works Course at University of Minnesota Center of Cont. Study at Village expense. Seconded by Malvin. 4 Ayes.

Mr. Christensen arrived at this point (9:30 P.M.). Report on Public Works given by Mr. Christensen.

Motion by Christense to have our Engineer meet with Spring Lake Park Engineer regarding a common emergency water use hookup. Seconded by Hodges. 5 Ayes.

The proposed Street Light map was shown to these present.

Motion by Crane to order street lights from Northern States Power and Ramsey County as per purchase order (copy on file). Seconded by Christensen. 5 Ayes.

Motion by Blanchard to order needed traffic signs per County Work order, from Ramsey County. Seconded by Malvin. 5 Ayes.

Meeting was recessed at 9:40 P.M.

Minutes of February 27th, 1961 Council Meeting

Meeting again called to order at 9:55 P.M.

The Attorney arrived at 9:55 P.M. and reported on the hearing held by Metropolitan Airports Commission.

He reported that the Village could use their funds to fight the proposed enlargement of the Anoka County Airport as Village property is involved.

He also reported that the M.A.C. holds absolute power on Zoning within two miles of runway which is almost all of the Village.

Two members of the North Suburban Property Owners reported on their newly founded Organization, formed to fight the Airport Expansion. Dues are \$1.00.

The Mayor is to request a report from the the Planner, Mr. Dahlgren on the Airport.

Mr. Christensen read a report from the North Suburban Sanitary Sewer Committee. This report is on file at the Village Office but the policy of the Committee report states in part, as follows:

1. We, as a Committee, are solely interested in the passage of our bill as is written, for immediate and economical relief of our common problem.

2. The Committee believes the way to expediate the passage of our bill is on the basis of need, health, timing and freedom of choice and that the factors of industrial development in our area, or the idea of getting passage of the bill for bargaining power in the future with some agency, should be suppressed.

3. The plan that we feel is best for this area, and the metropolitan area as a whole, is a regional treatment plant in the northwest area, which is similar to plan B-1 of the various solutions presented in the Metropolitan Sanitary District report, Volume 3.

4. The Committee feels that the control of the river should be placed wholly in the hands of a state agency.

5. With regard to the question of support of the Metropolitan Sanitary District expansion, the Committee will consider the subject when the expansion bill is available for study.

Motion by Hodges to pay bills presented. Seconded by Malvin.  
5 Ayes for approval.

Motion to adjourn until 7:00 P.M., Monday March 6th by Malvin.  
Seconded by Blanchard. 5 Ayes. Adjourned at 10:40 P.M.
