This letter is a follow up of your request at the meeting of June 6, 1966 with regards to our services and charges. I believe we discussed the extent that our electrical service can be of value.

On all calls the time begins from the hour dispatched until return. Material direct from the factory or distributor is billed at 15% above our actual invoice cost. Material from our stock is billed at 15% above low book pricing.

We discussed that evening the availability of a three phase generator. We do not have a unit of our own, but Minnesota Onan, the local distributor of Onan Company, has available a 30 KW three phase four wire generator for rent at the following fee schedule: Two days - \$75.00; weekly - \$150.00; monthly - \$450.00. In an emergency we are not always sure that their rental unit will be available or at this point whether the unit is large enough to handle the load of your sites. These are some of the problems that should be checked into prior to an emergency condition presenting itself.

As I mentioned, I would personally like to familiarize myself with the job sites and their electrical systems so there is some prior knowledge as to location and probable needs.

If your office sees fit to call on Gopher Electric for this maintenance service or any other electrical needs, we will be pleased to be oriented by your Engineer or department head. If there are any further questions we may answer, please do not hesitate to call us.

that the total benefits resulting from said improvements to the assessable lots, pieces and parcels of land affected thereby and to the Village at large will be substantially in excess of the total cost of such improvements; that in order to pay the cost of constructing said improvements it is necessary to borrow the sum of \$1,065,000; that the Village has outstanding \$1,575,000 Temporary Improvement Bonds dated August 1, 1964, all of which become due and payable on August 1, 1966; that said bonds were issued for the payment of costs of making said Sanitary and Storm Sewer and Street Resurfacing Improvement, and all of the proceeds of said bonds were expended for said purpose; that no moneys remain in the fund of said improvement available for transfer to the Temporary Improvement Bond Fund for the payment of said bonds; that it is therefore necessary to issue \$1,575,000 of definitive improvement bonds for the purpose of refunding said temporary bonds; that said borrowings herein determined to be necessary can best be made by the issuance of \$2,640,000 general obligation improvement bonds of the Village in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 429, Minnesota Statutes 1961, as hereinafter provided; that said bonds should be and are hereby made payable from the Improvement Bond Redemption Fund of the Village, in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 68 of the Village, adopted on May 25, 1960, and shall be secured by all the covenants and governed by all the terms and provisions set forth in said ordinance, and that all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota to be done, to exist, to happen and to be performed preliminary to the issuance and sale of said bonds to provide moneys to pay for said improvements and to redeem said temporary bonds have been done, do exist, have happened and have been performed in due form time and manner as so required.

Interest shall be payable each January 1 and July 1, commencing on January January 1, 1967. Interest at the basic rate applicable to each bond, from date of issue to maturity, shall be represented by appropriate interest coupons appurtenant to such bond, and each and all of the bonds shall bear additional interest represented by separate coupons designated as "B" coupons, at the rate of 1.20% per annum for the limited period from October 1, 1966, to January 1, 1968. The bonds maturing in the years 1969 through 1981 shall not be subject to redemption before maturity, but those maturing in the years 1982 through 1996 shall be each subject to redemption and prepayment at the option of the Village on January 1, 1981, and any interest payment date thereafter, at a price of 101 1/2% of par and accrued interest. Not less than thirty days before the date specified for prepayment and redemption of any of said bonds, the Village Treasurer shall mail notice of the call thereof to the holder, if known, and to the bank at which principal and interest are then payable, and the Treasurer is directed to maintain a record of the names and addresses of holders of prepayable bonds for the purpose of mailing such notices so far as such information is made available to him. The principal of and interest on said bonds shall be payable at the American National Bank and Trust Company in St. Paul, Minnesota, and the Village hereby agrees to pay the reasonable and customary charges of said paying agent for the receipt and disbursement thereof.

3. The bonds shall be prepared for execution forthwith, executed and delivered to Miller and Schroeder, Inc., of Minneapolis, Minnesota as purchaser thereof, in the manner and substantially in the form set forth in said Ordinance No. 68, upon payment by the purchaser of par plus accrued interest, as provided in the contract of sale of said bonds heretofore accepted by this Council. The proceeds of issuing said bonds shall be credited by the Treasurer to the funds and in the amounts as follows:

The accrued interest to be received upon delivery of said bonds shall be credited and paid into the Improvement Bond Redemption Fund of the Village.

- In accordance with said ordinance, it is hereby estimated that approximately \$3,000,000 principal amount of special assessments have been and will be levied on account of said Sanitary and Storm Sewer and Street Resurfacing Improvement upon properties within the area assessable for said improvement, as heretofore established by the resolutions ordering the same, and that \$2,606,772 of said amount of assessments will be available for credit to the Improvement Bond Redemption Fund after the cost of the improvement is paid in full; which assessments will be paid in 30 equal annual installments, collectible with general taxes of the Village in consecutive years commonoing in 1966 or 1967, with interest at the rate of 6% per annum. It is further estimated that approximately \$99,000 principal amount of special assessments have been or will be levied on account of the other improvements financed by the bonds herein authorized to be issued, and by said issue of bonds referred to above, dated April 1, 1965, and will be available for credit to the Improvement Bond Redemption Fund after the cost of such improvements is paid in full; which assessments will be paid in 15 equal annual installments collectible with general taxes of the Village in consecutive years commencing in 1966 or 1967, with interest at the rate of 6% per annum. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment on each property from the date of adoption thereof until December 31 of the year in which the first installment is payable, and to each subsequent installment shall be added interest for one year on the then unpaid balance of the assessment. All moneys collected therefrom shall be and are hereby appropriated to the funds of said improvements and to the Improvement Bond Redemption Fund, and shall be accounted for and expended in the manner provided in Ordinance No. 68. The full faith and credit of the Village is also pledged for the payment of said bonds and interest as provided in said ordinance.
- 5. There is hereby levied a general ad valorem tax upon all manable property in the Village for the purpose of paying principal of and interest on the bonds herein authorized, which shall be spread in the amounts and collectible in the years as follows:

Mr. McCubrey presented plans for Freeway 35-W in Mounds View.

Motion by Rustad to adopt Resolution #245 accepting plans for 35-W from existing freeway to North Corporate limits. Seconded by Malvin. 4 ayes.

Three of the six property owners benefited by storm sewer on Knollwood were present. They are not in favor of an open ditch. Would prefer conduit for a number of reasons. This is being handled by the Attorney for easements.

The Mayor announced that July 7th at 8:00 p.m. there will be a special meeting.

At 9:00 the Mayor opened the Public Hearing on Rezoning Lots 106 through 111 - Spring Lake Park Hillview Addition. The Deputy Clerk read the legal notice and attested to publishing and mailing of same. Mr. Barth explained plans for the area. A shopping center type building is planned.

Mr. Lang reported that the Planning Commission has approved the rezoning.

Mayor Rustad called for objectors:
Mr. Hillyard - Highway #10 - would like it to be residental.

Mayor Rustad called twice more for objectors. There were none.

Mr. Clarence Peterson spoke in favor of the rezoning.

The meeting was reconvened at 10:55. Mr. Fritz again raised several questions and then thanked the Council for their cooperation and consideration.

Mr. Lang read the Planning Commission Minutes for June.

Motion by Rustad to approve the subdivision for the property located at 8158 Red Oak Drive. (The S 130' of the W 112' of the E 145' of the N 405' of S 810' of the W 528' of the NE Motion Seconded by Malvin 3 ayes.

Mr. Joseph Sewick presented plot plans for 5 eight unit apartment buildings on County Road I and Jackson.

Motion by Rustad to accept plans and issue building permit as per Building Inspector's recommendation for 5 units after Mr. Siweck grants easement needed. Seconded by Malvin.

3 ayes.

Motion by Rustad to accept change order #1 for Street Improvement 1966-4 and 1966-5 for C. S. McCrossan. Seconded by Lang. 3 ayes.

The Engineer questioned the blacktopping of Woodale between Eastwood and Long Lake Road. He was directed to eliminate this section of Woodale from the Street Improvement Project.

Mr. Meyers read an agreement between the Village of Mounds View and NSSSD. Motion by Malvin to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to sign agreement. Seconded by Rustad. 3 ayes.

Motion by Rustad to adopt Resolution # 244 abating assessments. Seconded by Lang. 3 ayes.

Motion by Rustad to pay bills submitted totaling \$22,644.15. Seconded by Malvin 3 ayes.

Motion by Rustad to approve licenses submitted. Seconded by Lang. 3 ayes.

Motion by Malvin to adjourn. Seconded by Lang. 3 ayes.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
