ANNUAL MAYOR'S MESSAGE JANUARY 5. 1981

In this annual message I would like to focus attention on what I see as the main challenges we will face over the next two years and for years into the future. These are the push by the Metropolitan Council for higher density housing, the need to preserve as much as possible of our remaining wetlands and demands by developers for expensive services.

I believe most of us choose to live in Mounds View to avoid the urban problems— traffic, pollution, high taxes, and so on— that often seem to be associated with highly built-up, high housing density areas. Another specific cost factor to be concerned about is that today many of our utility services are at or approaching capacity, so that major new demands on those services would likely require expensive additions. Because lot sizes in Mounds View tend to be relatively large, we are vulnerable to pressure for lot splits and for multiple family housing. The consequence of what could amount to doubling of our housing is that existing services would have to be duplicated at a cost of many millions of dollars to present residents— costs that are unlikely to be fully recovered by new tax revenues. I therefore see it as being an obligation of the City Council to resist these housing pressures unless benefits to the City can be clearly shown to outweigh costs.

I have discussed before the many reasons for preserving our remaining wetlands, but I want to emphasis here the fact that they have been found to be effective in cleaning up storm water. This function will become highly important to us in the near future because the Federal Government will be requiring cities to do the cleaning job— if not by natural means then by very expensive treatment plants. An ordinance has been in preparation for some time which, if adopted by the new City Council, I am sure will go far toward meeting this second challenge.

Lastly, it has been widely accepted practice in the past to supply services to developers based on the assumption that such investment will be returned through new tax revenues. It has become clear that this can be bad business for the City. Recognizing this, we are now requiring major

developers to pay for their own storm water facilities. We now need to extend the principal that new development should pay its own way to other tility services in order to make sure that the residents are not left nolding the bill.

Much of what we do in local government involves routine or actions that may be important to individuals but which do not have city wide impact. What makes the three issues I have cited different is they could mean Ase ons. As on many thousands of dollars to each resident. Consequently, it is here that we on the new Council can make THE GROWST Contributions.

The meeting was called to order at 6:23 p.m. in the Mounds View City Hall Council Chambers.

Mayor McCarty opened the meeting by stating that the Clerk-Administrator needed direction from the new City Council prior to their work session on January 25, 1981, in order for the staff to have clear understanding of the direction the new City Council wishes to pursue. Mayor McCarty stated that he felt that whatever projects were instigated by the old City Council, such projects would have to be reaffirmed by the new City Council prior to the implementation.

Councilmember Doty stated that his major concerns for the next few years would be the level of revenues the City would be receiving and the need to keep expenditures under control. He stated that he does not want to hire any new City employees until after the January 25, 1981 work session and only when he is convinced that filling of the position is necessary for the efficient operation of the City.

Councilmember Forslund indicated that she was also concerned about the revenues and expenditures of the City and would be wanting to review all proposals budgeted or unbudgeted for purchases exceeding a specified dollar amount.

The Mounds View City Council was called to order at 7:30 P.M. on January 26, 1981, by Mayor McCarty.

Others present: City Attorney Meyers, Clerk-Administrator Pauley, and Building & Zoning Official Rose.

Mayor McCarty read a proclamation setting aside the week of February 1-8 as "Spina Bifida Week in Mounds View". The Sno-Mounties of Mounds View will be raising funds to supply braces, wheelchairs, ramps and other usable equipment to be shared in the Spina Bifida Loaner Library. They will be educating the public on this disease by distributing literature and will also conduct a Fund Drive Marathon on February 8th.

Mayor McCarty presented members of the Brownie Troop No. 1530 to the Council and the audience. He then read Resolution No. 1234 (resolution of appreciation to Mounds View Brownie Troop #1530 for participating in distributing yellow ribbons to residents of Mounds View honoring the 52 American diplomats held hostage in Iran). Mayor McCarty personally thanked each Brownie member for their individual contributions toward remembering the hostages during the Christmas Season of 1980.

<u>Doty</u>-(Item E) He noted that he hesitated authorizing a preliminary study from the city engineer without an approximate estimate of the cost that would be involved. Administrator Pauley noted that he had only asked for a rough estimate from the city engineer and that the study would involve determining what needs to be done and how much it would cost. The cost of the study would not include plans and specifications.

<u>Doty</u> (Item H) He asked for clarification of amusement devices for the license request of the Launching Pad. Administrator Pauley noted that this included both electronic and non-electronic amusement devices.

MOTION: Doty made a motion, seconded by Hodges, to approve Item H of the consent agenda (licenses for approval) and to waive the reading of the resolution.

Forslund-(Item F) She noted the phrase "manditory code compliance" had a harsh tone for a resolution approving a conditional use permit. Administrator Pauley noted that complaints regarding code compliance with this permit would be handled on an individual basis and some complaints could be handled in a simple manner.

MOTION: Forslund made a motion, seconded by Doty to approve Item F (Approval of Resolution #1230 approving the conditional use permit for used auto sales and minor auto repair at 2848 Highway 10) and to waive the reading of the resolution.

McCarty-(Item A)-He asked Administrator Pauley if Silver Lake Road had to be an MSA road if the adjoining County Road I was designated as an MSA road. Administrator Pauley stated MSA streets/roads could connect with either a county road/street or another MSA road/street.

MOTION: McCarty made a motion, seconded by Doty, to approve Item B(Approving Resolution #1232 designating County Road I from Silver Lake Road to Highway 10 as a Minnesota State Aid Street) and to waive the reading.
