Knud J. Nygaard, my father, bought 160 acres of school land from the government and 80 acres of railroad land in 1875.

Eighty acres of my present farm were homesteaded in 1868 by my maternal grandparents, Lars and Ingebor Blix. My father bought that in 1883.

The closest town in 1868 was New Ulm, which was 80 miles away. My Grandpa Blix went to market there by skies in winter and by oxen in summer.

Later the railroad came to Willmar so they had only 40 miles to go; then it came to Benson, which was only 30 miles.

The railroad came to Montevideo between 1875 and 1880; also, to a small town by the name of Myers, now called Wegdahl.

Myers was only a few miles from the homestead; therefore, marketing in every way was much more convenient.

John B. Oyen and his wife, Guru, homesteaded a major portion of the present Oyen farm in 1869. Title to the entire tract has only been in the Oyen name since 1869 with the exception of an 80 acre tract of land which was purchased from Christen and Kirstine Jensen in 1889 and title to this 80 acres has been in the Oyen name ever since that time.

One-half of the premises were deeded by the original owner, John B. Oyen, to his two sons, Ole J. Oyen and Brynjolf J. Oyen in 1919. The one-half owned by Ole J. Oyen was conveyed to Selma Oyen, the mother of John C. Oyen, the present owner and occupant, so there has been continuous ownership by John C. Oyen through his father and grandfather since 1869 as well as ownership of the fractional share through his mother, uncle and grandfather since 1869.

This information is secured from examination of the Abstracts of Title as well as from Moyer and Dale's History of Chippewa and Lac qui Parle Counties published in 1916 which states that John B. Oyen homesteaded his farm in 1869. Brynjolf J. Oyen was born on the Oyen farm on December 13, 1877 and was the fourth child to be born on the farm.

Sigvald B. Oyen, as well as the present owner of the farm, John C. Oyen, have personal knowledge that the Oyen farm has been solely owned by their father and grandfather since the time of the original homesteading in 1869, Sigvald B. Oyen having been born on the farm on February 22, 1916.
