#### THE DRAKE FARM

Lieutenant Nathaniel J. Drake (1787-1819) the son of Jeremiah Drake of English descent, servedall during the War of 1812 and was stationed at Harlem Heights, New York in 1814.

Anna Seward (1792-1891) was the great granddaughter of Obidiah Seward who em-

igrated from Wales in 1730.

Nathaniel J. Drake and Anna Seward were married in 1808

Their son, Wm. S. Drake(1813- 1901) was born in Orange County, New York.

Ensign(Second Lieutenant) William Thompson(1756-1836) was born in Orange County, New York. He served in Col. Wm. Allison's Coshen Regiment of Militia and he participated in the defense of Fort Montgomery at West Point in 1771 during the Reolutionary War.

Mitty Hudson(1765-1813) married William Thompson in 1783.

Their son, George Thompson(1784-1854) married Sarah Ann Schurman(1797-1861) in 1871. Their daughter, Emeline Schurman Thompson(1819-1907) born in OrangeCounty, New York married William S. Drake(1813-1901) in 1839.

In 1850, Wm. S. Drake, Sr. left New York state with his family; his wife, Emeline their three young daughters, Anna, Sarah and Elizabeth (a son Horace died in 1844) his mot her, Mrs. Anna Seward Drake Colter, his wife's mother, Mrs. Sarah Ann Schur eman Thompson.

They traveled on the Erie Canal t hence to Mukwonago, Wis. Here Wm. S. Drake, Sr.

was a partner with Andrew Elmore in the mercantile business.

Wm. S. Drake, Jr. was born in Mukwonago in 1854 and Elmore Drake was born here in 1857 and died in 1861. Mrs. Sarah Ann Schurman Thompson died in Mukwonago in 1860.

In 1868 the Drake family moved to Faribault County, Minn. Wm. S. Drake purchased land in Elmore Township and engaged in farming. For many years he made a specialty of raising sheep, his flock averaging no less than 500 head. The three daughters continued to live in Fa ribault County. Anna married George McArthur. Sarah married G.B. Franklin. Elizabeth married

James Snyder. Wm. S. Drake, Sr. and his wife Emeline continued to reside on the Drake farm

unt il their death.

Wm. S. Drake, Jr., born in Mukwonago, Wis. in 1854 and Nellie Buggy born in Naugat uck, Conn. in 1861 were married in Blue Earth, Mn. in 1885. They had five children: Frank Temple, George Seward, William Irving, Marian Gertrude and Anna Millicent.

Wm. S.Drake, Jr. farmed in the age of diversified farming. His stock consisted of cattle, cows, hogs and sheep. He took the cattle by train to Chicago and then sold the cattle there. Poultry included chickens, turkeys and geese.

Wm. S. Drake, Jr. served as County Commissioner in his District. He was one of the Community Directors of the Faribault County Farm Bureau Association when Franz Krause was the County Agent.

Wm. S. Drake, Jr. and his wife Nellie continued to reside on the farm until their death.

The farm has been owned and occupied by the direct descendants of Wm. S. Drake, for over 100 years. Three members of the fifth generation reside on the farm. About forty other descendants of Wm. S. Drake, Sr. live in Faribault County. Two granddaughters of Wm. S. Drake, Sr. Marian and Anna Drake are the present owners.

THE BUGGY HOMESTEAD

Dennis Buggy, one of the seven sons of Richard and Mary Butler Buggy, was born in Kilkenny County, Ireland in 1830. He came to America at an early age and settled in Naugatuck. Connecticut.

Catherine Phelan was born in Johnston, Kilkenny County, Ireland in 1828. She came to America in 1850 to join her two sisters, Bridget and Ellen Phelan. Catherine Phelan and Dennis Buggy were married in1856. Yhey continued to live in Naugatuck where the following four children were born: Richard, John, Nellie and Katie.

On September 5,1862 Dennis Buggy enrolledin the 20th.Regimentof the Connecticut Infantry Volunteers commanded by Captain Sprague and Commander Col. Rossa. He served until June 13,1865, the expiration of his term of service and also the

date of his Discharge.

Dur ing his service in the Civil War, Mrs. Buggy and her four small children came to Minnesota to visit her two sisters, Bridget Phelan Dollard and Ellen Phelan Delaney.

After his Discharge from the Volunteers Dennis Buggy joined his wife andfamily in Minnesota .He acquired a Homestead in Pilot Grove Township in FaribaultCounty According to the Abstract, the Final Receivers Receipt for \$8.00 was dated May 9 1871. On October 10,1871the U.S. conveys to Dennis Buggy 160 acres: The NW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 13 and the E  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the NE  $\frac{1}{4}$  and the NE  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SE 4 of Section 14. Later 40 more acres were added to the original 160 acres making a 200 acre farm.

Coming to a home on the prairie was a contrast to living in an eastern city; Consequently many adjustments had to be made.

The grove was planted by hand and it took many years to develop and

pr ovideshelter and shade.

The team of oxen, Buck and Bright, served t hem faithfully especially when making the long slow trip to Blue Earth-a distance of eight miles. Theor relatives the Dollard and Delaney families moved on to Pipestone County. The many friends which the Buggies made with the neighboring Scotch settlers remained loyal for several generations.

Besides the "Hard Times" of the year 1875, the invasion of the grasshoppers was a calamity. Beginning in 1873and continuing for four years caused crop damage. By the Proclamation of the Governor, April 26,1877 was designated as a day of fast ing and prayer to Almighty God to relieve the people of 1 this scourge. On the morning of July 20,1877a dense mass of grasshoppers rose and began flying away and disappeared.

Grandmother Buggy often told usof seeing the locusts leavingand people respond-

ing with prayers of thanksgiving.

Regarding the four children who came from Connecticut-Richard married Rose Doyle and they had six children; John married Mary Howley and they had five chikdren. Nellie married Wm. S. Drake, Jr. and they had five children, Katie married John Murphy and they had five children. All families lived in Faribault County for many years, Over 300 descendants of Dennis and Catherine Buggy live in various stat es including thirty in Alaska. About 23 live in Faribault County.

The Buggy Homestead has been in possession of the family members for over 100 years. A granddaughter of Dennis Buggy-Marian Drake is the present owner.

The fait h and perseverance of our pioneer ancest ors has been a source of inspiration to many people.

The ordinal 80 acres of this farm was homesteaded October 10, 1870. The homestead papers were signed by President U.S. Grant to Holvor Hansen.

On May 18, 1887 a deed of support from Holvor Hansen and Julia Hansen, his wife, was given to Henry H. Hansen. The second party agrees to furnish first partiess certain specific articles and maintain and support first parties so long as they or either of them shall live. Some of the specific articles are as follows:

The second party agrees to keep 2 cows and 2 sheep for the sole use and benefit of the parties of the first part so long as either shall live. Parties of the second shall produce 2 hundred pounds of good merchantable pork each year the remainder of the natural lives of each or either of the first parties, also parties of the first part to receive 20 bu. clean merchantable wheat, 10 bu. oats, 10 bu. corn, 8 bu. potatoes each year, also \$ 25.00 in money per year and the use of one acre of land plowed and fitted for garden.

Parties of the first part to have 2 rooms, one bedroom and one sitting room in the house on said premises so long as they either shall live and all necessary and suitabe fuel forccooking and heating.

The consideration was \$ 1.00 and the support of the second party as stated in support deed.

Henry H. Hansen along with farming this land was civil engineer and surveyor for Faribault County

Clarence J. Hansen operated this farm from 1919 until his retirement 1962 with renting and partnership lease of livestock to Jerome C. Hansen from 1956 to 1967. In June of 1967 Clarence J. Hansen passed away and Jerome C. Hansen purchased this farm from the estate.

Jerome C. Hansen and his wife Helen presently live on this acreage and they have 2 daughters, Anne Elizabeth who is 20 years old and a student at Gustavus Adolphus College at St. Peter, Mn. and Karen Wheresa who is 15 years old and will be in 10th grade at the Delavan School in Delavan, Mn. this is the 5th generation of Hansen decendants to live on this farm.

WHEREAS: There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Winnebago (ity, whereby it appears that pursuant of the Act of (ongress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto the claim of Ole Iverson, has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South half of the South West quarter and the North West quarter of the South West quarter of Section nine, in township one hundred and two, of Range twenty six in the district of lands, subject to sale at Winnebago (ity, Minnesota, containing one hundred and twenty acres.

NOW KNOW YE: That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Ole Iverson, the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Ole Iverson and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Signed by the President. Ulysses 5. Grant.

Ole Iverson was the father of Mrs. Martha (Ole) Johnson, who was the mother of Joseph M. Johnson.

Joseph M. Johnson was born and lived on the East portion of the tract described and transferred by reason of the Homestead Act on May 20th, 1862 to Ole Iverson. Joseph M. Johnson still owns portions of the land described in this Homestead Certificate No. 378.

Victor J. Johnson, son of Joseph M. Johnson owns the West portion of the Land described in this Homestead Certificate No. 378.

Thus Joseph M. Johnson and Victor J. Johnson who are descendents of Ole Iverson, own land that has been in the family since May 20, 1862, which is over 100 years.

ST.PAUL -- The 1976 Minnesota State Fair will honor the owners and operators of farms that have been in continuous family ownership since 1876 as part of this year's Bicentennial "fair of a lifetime."

Qualifications for the recognition are: 1) farm must be at least 100 years old according to the abstract of title, land patent, original deed, county land records, court file in registration proceedings, or other authentic land records. 2) continuous family residence on the farm is not required but ownership of the farm must be continuous. 3) "family" is defined to include the following: father, mother, uncle, aunt, brother, sister, son, daughter, first cousin, and direct-in-laws (father, mother, sister, daughter or son-in-law). 4) farm must consist of 50 or more acres.

Deadline for application is June 30 and recognition events will be held Saturday, Sept. 4, Thomas Jefferson and Rural Minnesota Day at the Fair.

Application blanks will be supplied to all County Agricultural Extension Service and Register of Deeds Offices. Application may also be made at the Minnesota State Fair, St.Paul 55108, phone (612) 645-2781.

A similar program was conducted during the 1958 Minnesota State Fair and Statehood Centennial Exhibition. To the list of pioneer families compiled at that time will now be added families whose ancestors settled Minnesota land at the beginning of America's second century. Farmers who were on the 1958 list of century farm families need not reapply but are encouraged to provide information for updating of the list.


