John Dorn Farm

John Dorn came to America from Germany over 150 years ago and settled near Horicon, Wisconsin on a 40 acre farm. Berta Kopplin to whom he had been engaged in "The old Country" joined John in Horicon. Bertha worked with Mrs. Schurz in Watertown, Wisconsin in the first Kindergarten in the U.S. which was founded in 1856.

Later John and Berthan were married and they worked together to clearnthe woodland and improve the farm. When the farm was tillable they sold it and moved to Minnesota. Wanting to be near German settlers, they came to Goodhue County and stopped at the Henry Zetzmann farm in Minneola Township for a drink of water and found the Zetzmann's to be Germans. The Zetzmann's told the Dorn's there was a farm for sale and they could stay overnight. The next day John Dorn purchased 160 acres of land for \$600. The family settled on this farm in a log cabin and proceeded to cut the trees and brush and grub out the roots with horse teams and breaking plows. The wood was used to make rail fences around the entire farm. Another 160 acres was purchased later for another \$600. Later 80 acres of the land was sold to Hinrich Klug, a cousin of the Dorn. On the farm they raised horses and sold them to the army. They raised wheat and timoghy as their main crops. They saved their wheat and timothy and sold when the prices were high. Once they sold two boxcar loads of timoghy. The John Dorn children provided all the entertainment in the Minneola Township. Each one of the ten children played a different instrument. Thus the grain was stacked in the summer and threshed in the winter.

All the children of the John Dorn family attended school two and half miles away on the Herman Pirius farm. The teacher was Alex Kopplin, at that time.

WILLIAM HENNINGS

William Hennings, son of Frederick and Maria Viet Hennings of Hanover, Germany. William was born on April 15, 1845, and received his education in Germany. He came to America with his father, Frederick, after the death of his mother, Maria. William assisted his father on the home farm in Featherstone Township until 1868. William purchased 80 acres in Goodhue Township, where he was a hard working farmer. He increased his Goodhue farm to 2462 acres and in addition to this, he owned a half section in Hay Creek Township. He carried on general farming and stock raising on a large scale, having met with considerable success. He served one term as supervisor of Goodhue Township, and six years as a member of the school board. William Hennings voted independently, and belonged to the I.O.O.F. On September 17, 1871, he married Catherine Kuntel. William Hennings died on July 19, 1920, and buried in Oakwood Cemetery in Red Wing, Minnesota. Mr. and Mrs. Hennings had eight children: Mary born July 1, 1872; married Fred Meyer in 1893; eight children: Arthur, Ervin, Leonard, Harold, Merril, Cora(Anderson), Effie(Thomas, George; died April 8, 1964. Frederick born March 19, 1874; married Catherine Wohlers on December 7, 1905; three children: Alvina(Wilson), Hazel(Fredrickson), Odella, died April 22, 1954. Sophie born March 30, 1976, married Herman Meyer on May 26, 1896; six children: Lenora (Sandquist), Evelyn (Buisman), Albert, Franklin, Maynard, Lillian(Cook); died November 20, 1961. William(Bill) born August 7, 1878; married Clara Swenson on January 10, 1907; died March 22, 1960. Louise(Lucy)born January 19, 1881; married Frank Fenster on December 30, 1908; four children: Stella (Raymo), Milton, Chester, Howard; died November 25, 1959. Lena born November 25, 1883; died February 1, 1968. Charles born March 13, 1886, married Ida Peters; three children: Dorothy (Leypoldt), William(Billie), Roberta(Bobbie); died April 7, 1959. John born July 18, 1889; died 1891.

CATHERINE KUNTEL

Catherine Kuntel was born on March 22, 1849 at Fishback in Hanover, Germany. She was baptized and instructed in the Christian Faith in her homeland of Germany. Catherine was one of seven children: two sisters-Annie, Maryand four brothers- Pete, Henry- two brothers never came to America. On May 1860, Catherine came to America to Goodhue County in company with a family from Germany as a position of a nurse. Catherine was strictly a p pioneer in every sense of the word. She belonged to that school which thrived on long hours, hard work, and simple living, frugal in spending money and yet neighborly and vitally concerned in the welfare of everyone and everybody. This was the spirit of the early settlers where class and position altered and affections expressed. Catherine married William heenings on September 17, 1871 in Goodhue County. They were one of the original nineteen charter members of St. Luke's Church in Goodhue, Minnesota which was organized on February 19, 1897. She was interested in the things pertained to those same interests which had occupied her business of living, farm, home, and church-all its problems and rewards. Eight children came to bless this home of William Hennings: Mary (Meyer) Cosmos, Minn.; Frederick (Fred) resided on the home farm, Goodhue, Minn.; Sophie(Meyer), Oak Park, Minn.; William (Bill) Goodhue, Minnesota; Louise (Lucy) Fenster, Wildrose, N. Dak.; Lena resided on the home farm, who cared for her parents and mother on the home place near Goodhue, Minn.; Charles (Charley) Omaha, Nebraska; and John who died at $2\frac{1}{2}$ years of age. Catherine Hennings died early Tuesday morning on November 7, 1944 at the advanced age of 95 years, 7 months and 17 days. She died of a stroke. Besides the above mentioned children, she left 21 grandchildren, 34 great-grandchildren and a host of friends and relatives.

ON OUR FARM

GRAVESBAKKEN

(Grafbacken)

Located in the southern part of Vasa township, about two miles north of White Rock, is Gravesbakken, the cemewhite Rock, is Gravesbakken, the cemetery that was lost and found again and restored through the loving care of descendants of the hardy pioneers who sleep there. The first burial was made in 1859 and the last in 1881. So far as is known, between 70 and 80 persons were buried in the plot

were buried in the plot. In 1857 Erick Johnson, Jens Zackrison, Ole Hanson and their families had emigrated from Harjedahlen in northern

son, Ole Hanson and their families had emigrated from Harjedahlen in northern Sweden to homestead in the southern part of Vasa township. Soon more came and they named their settlement Jemtland after their old home in Sweden.

In 1859 Minnie Zackrison, daughter of Jens, passed away and was laid to rest here and soon other graves were located on the knoll. In pioneer days no burials were permitted in the church cemeteries unless those who died were members of the congregation.

The cemetery contained a single headstone, provided by the government for Halvor Ecklund, a Civil War veteran of Company B, Third Minnesota Infantry, who died January 2, 1862, while home on furlough. At the funeral, Jens Zackrison, owner of the land where the cemetery was located, announced to all present: "I now hereby donate and dedicate an acre of land or more if needed for a free public cemetery and there for a free public cemetery and there will be no charges whatsoever for grave lots." However, this was never put on record.

With the gradual settlement of the Vasa community, other cemeteries were provided and as relatives of those interred in the pioneer plot left the community, the burial ground was all but forgotten. Situated on a knoll in the center of a large grain farm, it was untouched by plow, and soon brush and



trees covered the mound and the spot became a habitat of snakes and wild animals. Just north of Gravesbakker is Rattlesnake Rock. Here early settlers claim that a small child, Magnil Zack rison, tamed and fed a six-foot rattle

snake.

In June, 1930, Ole Zackrison, ther nearly 80 years of age, came to Vass from his home in Washington to see that the cemetery was restored. Hi father Jens was one of the pioneer buried in the plot. He enlisted the ser vices of Ferdie L. Larson, Ole Haim and others to carry on the work.

The brush and trees were removed the land fenced in, and the small spe beautified. Then Ferdie Larson assume the larger task of identifying the burial.

Tannas - Relation

In the corner of Sections 20 and 21, also 28 and 29 lies a small village, that is called Jamtland, settled by three families from Jamtlands land in Sweden. By right this area should be called Harjedalen, as they were from the Hede Pastorate and church district in Tannas near the Ljusnedals area.

The three men were: Erik Jonasson, who was born in Storsjö church congregation Pastorate (Hede) 1819. Jons Zakrisson, born in Tännas 1815 Olof Hanson born in the same area.

They were related through marriage: Mrs. Jonasson and Mrs. Zakrisson were sisters and Mrs. Hanson was a cousin to them. They were from the Hede Pastorate. The two sisters' parents were Pehr Olson born 1793 and his wife Gjolin Jon's daughter born 1794 in Tannas. They came with the above relatives to America in 1857. All of these are now dead except Mrs. Jonasson (Maret) Pehrsdaughter. (1905) The families or relations are settled around here in Vasa and other places.

Among those related to these families from (Hede Pastorate) near the Funnas-dalen in Tannas congregation are Jons Manson born 1801 and his wife Britta Jons'daughter born in Langa in the same pastorate in 1804. Jons Manson died in 1879 and his wife in 1901, so she was 97 years, the oldest to die in Vasa up to that time.

This family is represented by their son Jon Manson Jr. and his children, Manson and his children, and daughters Mrs. Hagmen and Mrs. Abram Peterson and their children and grandchildren.

TOLD TO ROSA GREEN by herUNCLE C. WILLIAM JOHNSON of VASA, MINNESOTA

Quoting Uncle Willie---

My grandfather on my mother's side of the family was Erik Johanson; they came in a covered wagon from McGregor, Iowa. There were three families together, interrelated, Hansons, Zackrisons, and Johnasons. They located in the area near Vasa called Jamtland. They lived and all became rich. My Grandpa's estate when he died was worth \$7000. in the bank and he had 200 acres.

They had four daughters: Carrie, who married J.W. Peterson who was also a cousin to my father. Minnie married Stephen Hedin. Ellen my mother married John J. Johnson. Johanna married Andrew Larson and lived in Red Wing.

The Zakrisson's were the only ones who had money; they had \$4000. in gold sewed through their clothes so if some was lost all wouldn't be.

They came through Ohio; that's where they picked up the woven spread I Rosa have. Grandma told Willie many times ti took them 12 weeks in a sailing vessel to cross the Atlantic Ocean. Mother Ellen Johnson was born in Sweden May 5th, 1845and was 12 years old when they came to America. She died Nov. 21, 1886 in Vasa on the home place which Willie bought from the heirs and lived there until he died in 1941.
