I understand the ownership of a Century Farm must be established from 1876 or before. The original certificate, which I have, was given by the General Land Office & signed by U.S. Grant, Pres. of the U.S. dated Feb. 20, 1877. However, from a family history book and other information I find that Jens & Joren Blixrud came to Grant County in 1870 and staked their claim. Their cabin was built on this land in 1871. This history is interesting I believe, and my husband, Thomas Blixrud, was proud of the fact that the farm had been under the Blixrud name for over 100 years. He felt there weren't too many where the name had been carried on that long.
