One of the first settlers in Custer Township in Lyon County, was Solomon Evans, born in 1819 in Caersws County of Drefaldwyn North Wales. Along with his wife and small child came to America in 1848. They lived in Orensky, New York. In 1856 moved to O Conomowac Wisc. Traveling by oxen drawn covered wagon they moved to Blue Earth County in 1863. He came alone to Custer Township to homestead in 1868 and brought his family here to live in 1873.

Second generation, Ellsworth Evans, was 12 years old when his family moved here. He helped break the sod, using oxen for this work. He farmed the homestead and land they bought across the road in Monroe Township, built his home and lived the remainder of his life here, he died in 1954. Ez as he was called had 2 sons, Roger and Ray, being the Thirdh generation.

Ray lived on the farm in Monroe Township, after Roger returned from Military service, lived on the homestead. The tornado of i924 took all the buildings off the homestead, Roger rebuilt the place and farmed here until he retired in 1950.

The fourth generation, Roger's daughter, Dorthey Evans Pamp and her husband William moved on the homestead in 1950, live on and farm this land now, they are in the purebred Chester White Hog business.

The fifth generation being Charles C. Pamp and Douglas Evans Pamp sons of Dorthey and William. Charles farms this land and another 300 acres in Monroe Township, he has 2 sons Carl and Jason, being the sixth generation to live on this land.

When he arrived there was no railroad, no citys of Tracy, and only Jour other families in the vicinity. His first home was a sod house and the first of his nine children was born in the Rod house in 1875. It is believed that he constructed his frame house some Time between 1875 + 1880 and it is still in use as part of our He planted trees around his Jarm and some of them still mark the Jence lines of the farm.
