Related information:

David Alexander, the homesteader, was born in Roxburghshire, Scotland, June 17, 1847. At the age of 2 years, he came to Ontario, Canada, with his family, where they lived until March 1870, when they came to Redwood County, Minnesota.

David, and his father, George, homesteaded the North half of Section 12, Vesta Township. (David Alexander, the NW_{4}^{1} and his father, George Alexander, the NE_{4}^{1}). David Alexander received the patent June 1877.

The neighborhood was then a wild sweeping prairie, the only house within sight being that of Edward Payne. The original house, 16 by 20, was made of native lumber. The year after it was built it was equipped with pine sidings and shingles from the mill at Delhi.

In 1891 he purchased the $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ from his father, and moved to this homesite. He lived his retirement years in Redwood Falls.
