Re: Application of Robert D. & LaVonne M. Dyrdahl/Kenyon, Mn. 55946

The original owner of the farm was Charles Williams, a Civil War Veteran who acquired the land thru the Military Bounty Act of 1855. He never farmed the land and in 1874, the land was purchased by a young newcomer from Norway by the name of Nils Anderson Dyrdahl.

Nils Dyrdahl married a young norwegian newcomer and they settled on the farm in 1874. They had nine sons and two daughters, and one adopted daughter. One of the older boys homesteaded in Mayville, North Dakota and two boys homesteaded near Williams, Minnesota, and one at Malta, Montana. One daughter died at about 20 years and the other daughter married and homesteaded at Williston, North Dakota. One son died in infancy and another died from the flu at Camp Grant, Illinois while in process of being released after being in France in World War I. Martin Dyrdahl remained at home and purchased the farm from his parents in 1923. The youngest son became a partner in the grocery business in Kenyon until his retirement. The adopted daughter married a mechanic/machinist. All are now deceased.

Martin Dyrdahl married Olianna Gunderson whose parents were also immigrants from Norway. They purchased the farm in 1923 and continued to live with their family of three daughters and one son until retirement. Martin passed away in 1962 and Olianna died in 1972.

Robert is married to LaVonne M. Magee. They have five sons and two daughters. Richard who just completed his second year at University of Minnesota (Morris), Steven, first year at Willmar Vo-Tech, and Scott who just completed Kenyon High School and will attend Vo-Tech at Austin. Ross and Jaye are in Kenyon junior-senior high school, Kerri a first grader at Kenyon Elementary and Heidi, who will be two years in November.

WOLF HISTORY

Paul George Wolf was born in Kitzinger, Bavaria, Germany, in 1815. He married Elizabeth Vogel of Markstaft, Bavaria, Germany. They immigrated to the United States by way of Quebec and the Great Lakes, and settled in Wheeling, Lake County, Illinois, with their three oldest children.

Eight years later, with their seven children, they joined two other families in making the trip to Minnesota. These were the Adam Knopf Sr. and the Christian Erb families. These three families ave the name of Wheeling to this township since it was still unnamed when they are ived. They brought with them seventy-five head of cattle. These were made to ford the Mississippi River while thewagens and other supplies crossed on a ferry near Winona.

They all took homesteads in Rice County. The Wolf family put up a corral in what is now the Nerstrand State Park to hold their share of the cattle. Their cabin was erected west of the Waterfall Road.

It is of interest to know that this wooded area stayed in the family until it was sold back to the Federal Government. A change was later made whereby the State took this in exchange for other wooded areas in the northern part of the state.

The next year they settled on the farm, which is still in the family and operated by Dewey Wolf, a great grandson.

Paul G. Wolf, however, did not live long at thisnew home. Like the other pioneers he also had to clear the land. In doing this, at the age of forty-one, he was fatally injured when a falling tree hit a branch that snapped back. At the time of his death, Elizabeth, the youngest child, was only two years old. Since there were no cemeteries at that time buriel was made in the grove near their home.

The task of helping care for the family fell to fifteen year old John B. It was with him and hisfamily that the mother continued to make her home until her death in 1893.

Other members of the family were Barbara (Mrs. George Knopf); Mike, who didd in the Civil War; Conrad; Sally (Mrs. John Bosshardt); Mary (Mrs. Ma tin Gagstetter); and Elizabeth (Mrs. Emil Rehnke). At the present time, a century after the arrival of the Paul Wolfs, there are thirteen surviving grandchildren of the original thirty-two. There are about seventy greatgrandchildren, over one hundred great-great-grandchildren, and about sixty great-great-great-grandchildren among the descendants.
