My parents were married in 1894 May fither, Christion helow, purchased 80 acres in sung 1900 and an additional Hoacres thefore 1400 1914, and 120 ecres in 1916 making a total of 320 acres which is the tatal of the form at the promititione. My grandfither deed in 1898 and my grandmother died in 1910. my parents had 3 children: Ina, born in 1910, Helen born in 1913, and I was born in 1916, My two sisters both live on forms in the vicinity of the home my father daid in 1931 and I have been on the form ever since.
